XII. OLD BUSINESS

A. Council to discuss appointments to the Downtown Development Authority.

A motion was made for Council to accept the appointments of Richara Warren, Scott Miller, and Yolande Turner as new Board Members for the Downtown Development Authority.

RESULT: Approved (Vote was unanimous)

B. Council to discuss FY26 Proposed Budget.

Mayor Sartor advised everyone that adjustments were made to the proposed budget.

\$100,000.00 was added to the line-item of Professional Services for Public Works in order to cover street sweeping services.

The contingency fund is currently at \$435,000.00 and Mayor Sartor explained why it was higher for FY26.

Councilmember A. Dixon recommended a total budget of \$15,000.00 for JYCG. Councilmember Fox supported the recommendation and would be willing to give some of her initiative funds to reach the \$15,000.00. Councilmember Messick supported the recommendation along with fundraising.

Mayor Sartor believes JYCG can raise additional funds. She stated, for the record, there are other areas and line items that she would like to have funded before she would fund them at \$15,000.00. Councilmember Curney said it is not fair to raise the funds for JYCG when there are other areas that need additional funds. Also, she spoke about the 9-millage rate. Mayor Pro-Tem Miller said there are creative ways to assist JYCG without making other departments or citizens feel some type of way.

City Attorney Nix-Wiley arrived at the meeting at 6:15 p.m.

Councilmember A. Dixon said he appreciated the open-mindedness and the creativity. "However, we are preparing our future leaders and feel that it can be accomplished."

XIII. NEW BUSINESS

A. Council to consider matching \$2,500.00 for grant funds provided from FY26 Vibrant Communities Grant and to temporarily fund the complete \$5,000.00 of the grant (from a city account) until reimbursement paperwork is submitted. Deadline is June 1, 2026.

Executive Assistant, Taylor Johnson led the discussion.

The City of Jonesboro was approved for the FY26 Vibrant Communities Grant in October 2025. The grant will fund the painting of four (4) doors on the public restrooms at Lee Street Park. The project carries a total budget of \$5,000.00 and is structured as a reimbursement match grant. As such, the City would initially fund the \$5,000.00 and would be reimbursed for half of the amount totaling \$2,500.00.

B. Council to consider a contract for additional renovations at 173 Cloud Street.

Mayor Sartor led the discussion. The contractors, through Lowe's, made a recommendation to remove and replace the cabinets. The house has new floors and new countertops. The City received a quote for an estimated \$9,000.00 and asked that the money be pulled from FY25 Budget to complete this project. The goal is to have it completed by the end of the month.

A motion was made to approve the contract and not to exceed \$9,500.00 for final kitchen repairs.

C. Discussion regarding City Manager Position.

Councilmember Fox asked for clarity as it related to the City Manager's Position. She wanted to know if the City was going to continue with the search for a City Manager. Mayor Sartor said the position is still open. Mayor Pro-Tem Miller stated, "once we ensure that all staff have equitable pay then we would explore adding money to the salary of the City Manager's position." "Once the budget is done again and we see how much contingency we can work with, we can talk about increasing the salary of the City Manager."

D. Council to discuss street sweeping services regarding Public Works Department.

Mayor Sartor led the discussion regarding a proposal to purchase a Street Sweeper. A contract was received from Elgan Pelican Street Sweeper in the amount of \$296,700.00. She further mentioned that Public Works Director Heard looked at a plan through the State bidding agency where the City could get the street sweeping services for nine (9) months out of the year. The streets of all 60 curved miles would be cleaned once per month, and during the heavy leaf season, it would be cleaned twice per month for six (6) months at \$76,050.00. This would help prevent rainwater/sewage drain clogage. Mayor Sartor said Director Heard believes this would be the best option for the City.

Mayor Sartor asked for an increase to the Professional Services line item in the amount of \$100,000.00. She spoke regarding Sweeping Corp. of American and Tree Cutting.

Councilmember Messick asked if Mayor Sartor had more than one estimate for Professional Services to handle this matter. Mayor Sartor said Director Heard would get some other estimates.

At this time, a conversation took place about the condition and sale of the City's current street sweeper. Councilmember Curney said this would be an excellent opportunity for residents who definitely want their streets cleaned. This would alleviate staff from doing it manually.

Mayor Pro-Tem Miller stated, "I do think we have a very large contingency fund and with the same passion, we want to allocate the additional funds to Jonesboro City Government and to our departments that had things cut." However, when it is time to revisit the millage rate, then we can talk about purchasing the \$256,000.00 equipment and utilize what was sold (old sweeper, if anybody wants it) and reallocate those funds.

Mayor Sartor reminded everyone that the budget would be balanced, which means the revenues equal the expenditure. She noted we don't meet again until February. "Therefore, we would use 40 hours of manpower to begin. However, Director Heard is anxious to get started with an approval and not exceed \$80,000.00 for the street sweeping services once the budget is approved." If so, they would not have to wait until February 2026 to get approval for this contract.

Council to consider approval of a street sweeping service not to exceed \$80,000.00.
