The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Mayor Sartor.

- Pastor Jared Newlove of Antioch Baptist Church (Jonesboro Business) – Congratulatory remarks were extended to the newly elected City Councilmembers. He also addressed agenda item J., Blaze Leadership Proposal. He offered to provide his services at no cost to help the City save money should the City decide not to use Blaze Leadership.

- E. Council to discuss FY26 Proposed Budget and an ordinance regarding the adoption and approval of the FY26 Budget.

Mayor Sartor stated that Council could agree to accept the FY26 Proposed Budget or have a Special Called Meeting / Budget Retreat to go over each item, line by line, in order to get the budget adjusted for Mayor to present.

Karen Slaton-Dixon spoke regarding the FY26 Proposed Budget.

- FY23 Audit is pretty much done. The Finance Department would need to take the numbers provided by the auditors and put them into a MDNA (Management and Decision Analysis Report) and send it back to the auditors for further processing.
- FY24 through FY25 has not been audited.
- December 30, 2025 - The City has a draft of FY23 financials from the auditors.
- \$900,000.00 went back into the General Fund Balance which means the City brought in more revenue than expenditures.
- FY24 and FY25 may be similar to FY23 wherein there is more revenue than expenditures but waiting for the audit to determine if this will be factual.
- All departments underspent with the exception of one department.
- FY25 has \$2 million dollars more in revenue came in than expenditures gone out. The books will stay open for 60 days. Therefore, the City will still receive invoices in January and February of 2026 that are from 2025. The City would pay out of FY25 Budget. The same process applies to revenues as well. Therefore, the numbers could change.
- Approvals and Payroll – Dates that fell within FY25.
- FY26 Proposed Budget and Debt Service currently coming out of SPLOST since SPLOST is trending so high.
- The City had several Budget Meetings. At one of the Budget Meetings there was about \$600,000.00 in General Fund Budget for Debt Service. The City will put this in SPLOST because this is where the payments would be coming from. This would leave \$520,715.00 in Contingency for FY26. Mayor Sartor would like to put some of it in Georgia Fund 1 (Reserve) in order to gain the most interest.
- What a 2% vs 4% employee raise would look like if considered and based on contingency.
- Money rolls over into the fund balance if the City does not use all of the revenue.
- Explained what prior year means – When cities use money that was left over in the prior year to do any specific projects that may be needed for the City.
- Group Insurance for Mayor and Council is included in FY26 Budget.
- Will begin doing Financial Reports starting February 2026. However, a report can't be done if there is no budget. Currently operating under an old budget. FY26 Proposed Budget pending approval. Once FY26 Budget is approved, then the Financial Report can be done.
