IV. PUBLIC HEARING - NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

Mayor Sartor informed the audience that the sole focus of the meeting would be on issues related to the millage rate/property tax increase.

Public Hearing Opened

 Michael Wood (Jonesboro Resident) – Mr. Wood asked Mayor Sartor to explain why the millage rate was advertised at 15 mills. At this time, Mayor Sartor provided an overview of the millage rate and outlined her reasoning behind recommending a millage rate of 15 mills. She presented a few slides from the FY 26 Budget Presentation to support her explanation. Addressing Mr. Wood, she stated that based on the approved millage rate, she would update the proposed FY 26 Budget.

- Shellian Hollwell (Jonesboro Resident) Spoke regarding the proposed millage rate of 11 mills vs. 12.5 mills.
- Lance Van Dyke (Jonesboro Business Owner) Spoke regarding tax revenue, projected income (new developments), and projected increases in services.
- Russell Smith (Jonesboro Resident) Spoke regarding Charter Sec. 2.27 (5) Powers and Duties of the Mayor, Charter Sec. 6.23 - The Operation of Budgets and Charter Sec. 6.28 -Annual Independent Audit.
- Michelle Hix (Jonesboro Resident) Spoke regarding the proposed millage rate increase and residents that are on a fixed budget.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Council to consider approval and adoption of the Millage Rate for FY 2026.

A motion was made to approve and adopt the millage rate at 9 mills for FY 26.

Mayor Sartor explained that having a millage rate of 9 mills, the City would face significant budget reductions.
