IV. INTRODUCTION OF THE MAYOR

Zahion Mikel (JYCG Mayor) introduced the City of Jonesboro's Mayor, Dr. Donya L. Sartor

III. MAYOR'S PRESENTATION

- Mayor Sartor welcomed residents, attendees, board members, elected officials, staff, and introduced City Manager, Blue Cole. She thanked Sky, the event coordinator for a job well done.

At this time, City Manager Cole shared his vision for improving city services, supporting residents, businesses, and youth, and strengthening the city's team.

- City updates presented by Mayor Sartor

- ❖ A video was shared regarding “Small City Doing Big Things.” Mayor Sartor spoke about the City of Jonesboro being a well-respected City located in the heart of Atlanta.
- ❖ Overview of city growth, demographics, housing, transportation, and economic development initiatives.
- ❖ Emphasis on diversified housing options, infrastructure improvements, and regional partnerships.
- ❖ Update on fiber-optic expansion project throughout the city.
- ❖ Highlighted increases in employee wages and continued efforts toward a living wage.
- ❖ Discussed plans for recycling services, sanitation improvements, and park enhancements.
- ❖ Grants and Funding Updates: The City secured approximately \$3.1 million for public safety improvements, inclusive playgrounds (CDBG Funding – Battleground & Massengale Parks). Over \$1 million for pedestrian improvements. \$124,000.00 Nutrition Access, Affordability, and Education Grant Program supporting food access initiatives (via AAMA and American Beverage partnership). Additional funding opportunities for police vehicles (\$240K), park improvements (\$450K), and housing development projects (\$2.7 million – Habitat for Humanity Housing Development projects).
- Discussed Community Improvement Plan
 - ❖ Updates provided on the proposed Main Street Village mixed-use housing project.
 - ❖ Discussion of downtown infrastructure improvements needed to support future business development.
 - ❖ Continued focus on attracting investment while preserving Jonesboro's character and sustainability.

IV. COUNCIL PANEL

Mayor Sartor introduced Mayor Pro-Tem and each Councilmember. They were given two (2) minutes to share their priorities which included:

- Youth development and educational opportunities.
- Family-friendly amenities and parks.
- Economic growth and local job creation.
- Technology modernization and improved city services.
- Veterans memorial project and public safety enhancements.

V. 2026 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE DISCUSSION

City Manager Cole introduced Emily Corrillio of Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC).

- ARC Representatives Emily Corrillio presented the City's Comprehensive Plan process. She spoke about the planning process (past and future) and how it looks at everything (Housing, Development, Land Use, etc.)
- Residents were encouraged to participate in a survey and future public engagement activities to help shape Jonesboro's next five-year plan.

VI. COMMUNITY Q & A

Topics raised by residents included:

- Domestic Violence Awareness Month event proposal ("From Pain to Power Gala").
- Employment and opportunity concerning young adults.
- Fatherhood advocacy initiatives.
- Family wellness and relationship education programs.
- Resources for homelessness, mental health, and community assistance services

Mayor Sartor encouraged continued community engagement and emphasized that Jonesboro is growing strategically while maintaining its strengths.
