

Survey Overview & Methods


What is a Community Health Assessment (CHA)?



- Provides foundation to improve the health of a population
- Tells the community story
- Identifies health disparities among different subpopulations and the factors that contribute to them
- Supports the community's efforts to achieve health equity
- Data obtained from a **variety of sources** using various data collection methods




Since 2007, about 15,000 residents have participated in our triennial surveys




One adult (age 18+) per household

No incentives used




Up to 5 contacts by mail




Health Status and Conditions

Chronic Conditions & Self-Rated Health



The prevalence of many chronic conditions have increased



- Asthma
- Diabetes
- High Blood Pressure
- High Cholesterol


Johnstown/Milliken

23% high blood pressure
24% high cholesterol
13% asthma
4% diabetes

Not significantly different from other regions



Self-rated health has worsened, the gap among Hispanic/Latino/a residents has widened






Health Insurance and Use

Health Insurance & Delayed Care



Countywide, 7.9% of adult residents said they did not have health insurance of any kind





Nearly 1 in 3 residents said that they delayed or went without needed health care in the past year


Top reasons for delaying care:

- Cost (49.5%)
- Appointment availability (36.6%)
- Time off work (23.4%)

Johnstown/Milliken

28% delayed or went without needed medical care

Not significantly different from other regions







Healthy Lifestyle Behaviors


Fruit/Vegetable Intake, Perception of Walkability



More than 80% of adult residents reported they did NOT eat the recommended number of fruit/vegetable servings per day







Johnstown/Milliken*

87% did NOT meet the 5(+) servings for f/v per day

This was significantly **worse** than northern region (70%), Carbon Valley region (74%) and Windsor/Severance (75%)



Over 1 in 3 residents reported they were concerned that there aren't enough sidewalks or trails to walk or bike in their comunity (34%)



Johnstown/Milliken*

40% were concerned that there aren't enough sidewalks or trails to walk or bike in their community

> This was significantly **worse** than northern region (29%) and Windsor/Severance (23%)








Social-Emotional Wellbeing

Mental Health Treatment, Frequent Mental Health Distress & Resiliency




More residents who reported they needed behavioral health care actually sought treatment





Over 1 in 7 residents (15.2%) reported they had frequent mental health distress

If a resident reported they had 14 or more bad mental health days in the last 30 days \rightarrow frequent mental health distress





Generally, adult residents in Weld County reported they had fair to good levels of resiliency

Stress Resistance



Bounce Back



Johnstown/Milliken

3.9 / 10 for stress resistance score

Not significantly different from other regions

Johnstown/Milliken

2.3 / 5 for bounce back score

Not significantly different from other regions






Risky Lifestyle Behaviors

Alcohol & Tobacco Use



Nearly 1 in 4 adults report binge-drinking in the past 30 days, higher than the statewide rate



Adults Reporting Binge-Drinking


Colorado (2021)

About 14% of adults use some form of tobacco and 8% reported cigarette use

While overall tobacco use has decreased, vaping (ecigarette) use has increased

Trends in Tobacco Product Use








Health and Housing

Housing Instability, Housing Cost Burden





One-third of residents say they spend more than 30% of their income on mortgage or rent and utility payments



Johnstown/Milliken

35% reported housing cost burden

Not significantly different from other regions



I-25 Corridor

38% reported being worried or stressed about paying for housing at least rarely

Not significantly different from other regions



Over 2 in 5 residents were worried about paying rent or mortgage (44.3%) at least rarely





Health, Community, and the Environment

Environmental Health Concerns and Air Quality



Residents' leading environmental concern is outdoor air quality

62.2% of Weld County adults are moderately or very concerned

Johnstown/Milliken*

59% reported being worried about the level of outdoor air quality

*Significantly **higher** than northern region of the count (51%) but lower than Carbon Valley (67%)



All Environmental Health Concerns Covered in 2022 Survey

Environmental Health-Related Concern	Percent Moderately or Very Concerned
Level of outdoor air quality	62.2%
Pollution from oil and gas operations	51.8%
Disposal of household hazardous waste in landfills	50.7%
Pollution from vehicles	49.0%
Pollution from agricultural operations	40.4%
Exposure to radon in your home	30.9%
Potential rabies exposure for you, your family, pets, or livestock	25.2%






Emergency Preparedness

Need Help in Emergency





Needing help in an emergency was higher in rural and **Greeley/Evans** regions of the county; lower in Johnstown/Milliken

Needing help in an emergency included residents who reported they would need help or assistance with evacuation transportation, medical assistance to maintain their health, and/or have medical equipment dependent on electricity
