I was asked to research other cities. Below are some examples taken from other city charters.

- No member of the council or the mayor, who has been elected to four consecutive full terms in a place, shall be eligible to file for election for that same place without first having been off the council for at least one annual election cycle.
- The Mayor and Councilmembers may be elected to an unlimited number of terms, but to no more than four (4) consecutive terms, in the same office.
- No Councilmember elected at the May 2022 city officer election or thereafter shall serve for more than three (3) consecutive terms as a Councilmember until at least two years has elapsed from the expiration of their last term of office as a Councilmember. No Mayor elected at the May 2022 city officer election or thereafter shall serve for more than three (3) consecutive terms as Mayor until at least two years has elapsed from the expiration of their last term of office as the Mayor."
- A person who has served two consecutive full terms as Mayor may not again hold the same office or be eligible to be elected to the office of City Council member until at least one year out of office has passed.
- Council members and the mayor shall be limited to three consecutive full terms in office. A person who has served three consecutive full terms as a council member or mayor may not again hold the same office until at least one term out of office has passed.
