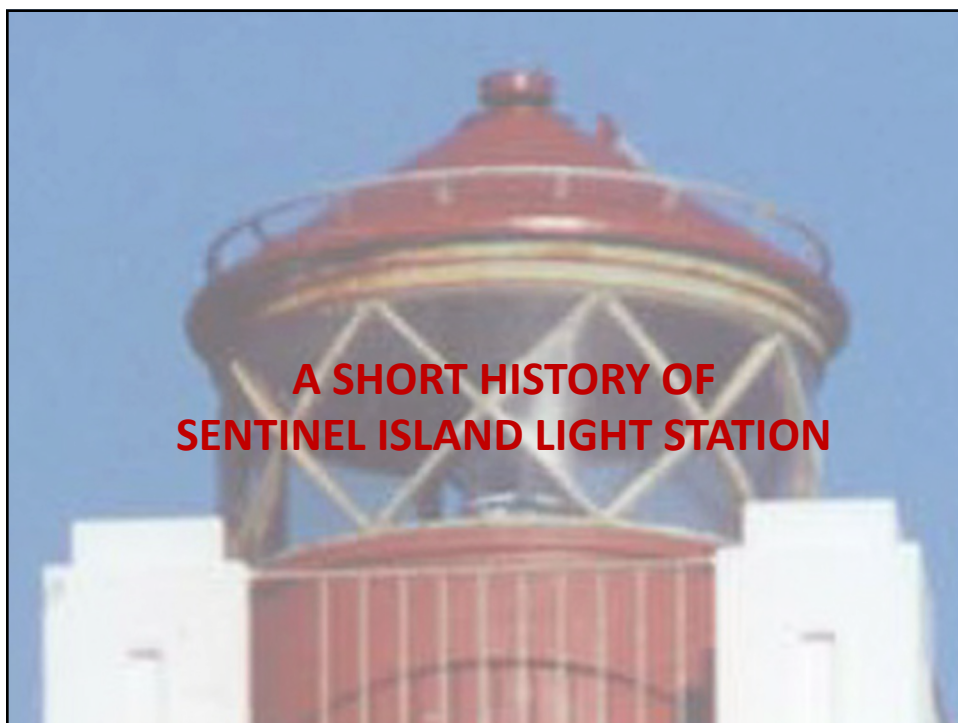

- 1996 - USCG offers lighthouses to non-profits
- 1997 - GCHS selected to receive 30-year lease
- 2000 - National Historic Lighthouse Preservation Act
- 2002 – Sentinel Island Light Station listed on National Register
- 2004 - GCHS selected to obtain deed to Sentinel Island Light Station
- 2006 - Quit Claim deed transferred to GCHS

Project: Rehabilitation of Support Buildings at Sentinel Island Light Station

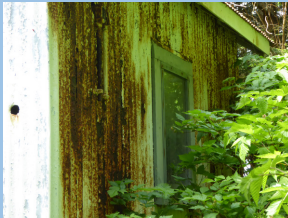
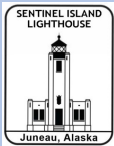
Grant Two

Both grants are administered through the Alaska Office of History and Archaeology

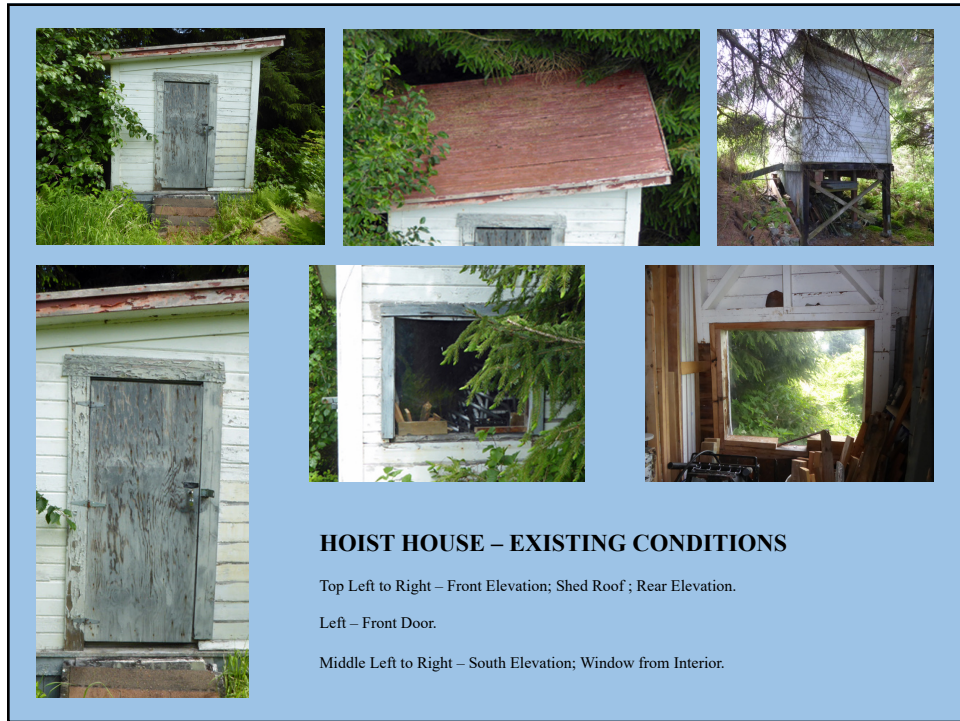


BLACKSMITH SHOP – EXISTING CONDITIONS

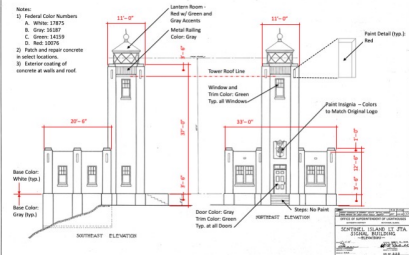

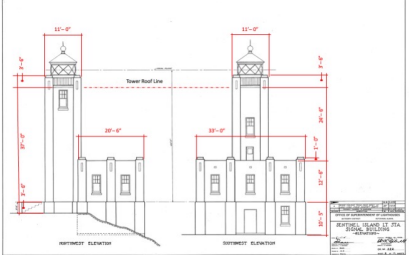

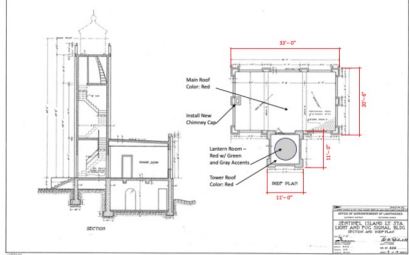
