After consultation with the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development, JSD has removed their request for funding of summer school in 2023; which has been determined to be an instructional cost that must be paid for inside the educational funding cap.

This request does not correct the School District's operating fund deficit of \$620,400 at June 30, 2022, as CBJ already contributes the maximum local contribution inside the cap. Due to the increase in the value of real property in Juneau, funding JSD instruction "to the cap" in FY24 will
