Authorization to seek bids for Project 12-22 Grignon Park Stream Restoration and Utility Relay

Background

The Engineering Department is seeking authorization to seek bids for the Grignon Park Stream Bank Restoration project and replacement of the sanitary sewer main in the same corridor. The City has applied for, and received, a DNR grant not to exceed \$135,000 for the stream restoration work. A map of the area is attached.

The un-named tributary to the Fox River running through Grignon Park has significant stream bank erosion, contributing to habitat loss and increased sediment and phosphorus loads being washed downstream to the Fox River. The erosion is also causing damage to the trail and disc golf course, and contributing to loss of trees through the corridor. In addition, the sanitary sewer main located along this corridor is clay pipe in need of rehabilitation. The primary purpose of the project is to reduce urban non-point source pollution prior to discharge into the Fox River by stopping the significant stream bank erosion occurring, but it will also improve many aspects of the park and City utilities.

Recommended Action

Motion to authorize the Engineering Department to seek bids for Project 12-22 Grignon Park Stream Restoration and Utility Relay.
