| Definition | Under general supervision, performs a variety of semi-skilled and skilled work in the maintenance of parks, buildings, and facilities; operates a variety of hand tools and equipment; performs related work as required. | |
| Distinguishing Characteristics | Maintenance Worker II is the advanced working-level class in the Maintenance Worker series. Performs a variety of semi-skilled and skilled duties in the maintenance and repair of parks and related facilities and equipment. Work is usually closely supervised and fits a pattern, which has been established and explained before work is started. Must demonstrate commitment, dependability and respect for other employees with regular attendance, punctuality and adherence to agreed-upon schedule of availability. | |
| Examples of Duties | Maintain playground equipment and structures in parks. Clean and restock restrooms in City parks and facilities. Pick up rubbish and paper and perform general grounds cleaning at the parks. Operate janitorial equipment. Set up tables, chairs, and required equipment at City facilities. Drive vehicles as required to transport materials, tools, and equipment. Work alone or as a member of a crew. Perform general park maintenance. Clean and maintain City buildings and facilities. Assists in moving and installing park and recreation facilities. Assists in constructing, maintaining, and repairing park equipment and facilities. Cleaning and maintaining essential tools used on the job. Performs other related duties as required. | |

| Knowledge Of | Use and purposes of tools, materials, and equipment used in maintenance work. Occupational hazards and standard safety precautions in the performance of work. Basic repair and service methods of said equipment. | |
| Ability To | Communicate both verbally and in writing. Understand and carry out verbal and written instructions. Perform semi-skilled and skilled park maintenance work. Work independently in the absence of supervision and take initiative in daily work activities. Operate a variety of mechanical equipment. Perform manual labor. Maintain effective relationships with the public, coworkers and supervisors. | |

| Experience | Three years of full-time experience performing maintenance in parks, buildings, or related fields. | |

| Physical Demands | Working conditions in outside areas are subject to variations in temperature, and may include wind, rain and other elements. Manual dexterity sufficient to grasp, hold object/tools with full range of motion in wrists and arms. Hearing sufficient to understand conversations, both in person and on the telephone.
