#### Policy Analysis and Background (non-consent items only):

City of Ketchum staff have proposed artwork and historical installations as part of the Main Street reconstruction project in 2024. Liaisons from the Ketchum Arts Commission and Historic Preservation Commission met with the Main Street project management team in January to help formulate a plan for these installations. Plans were presented to the public and City Council in January and February. A contractor for the Main Street project will be selected in late March and the project scope will receive final approval. The discussion for today's Arts Commission meeting will cover:

- a review of the proposed artwork/installation plan for Main Street;
- an update of the items supported by the public and City Council; and
- Arts Commission plans to help complete the art/historical installations should they be approved as part of the Main Street Project scope.





Simulation of new traffic flow and pedestrian crossing during peak traffic










- Shortening crossing distance to 10 ft






Complete rebuild of the roadway that accounts for current and future


• Sidewalk and streetscape improvements where possible

- 5<sup>th</sup> Street sidewalk infill and bulbouts








 Multi-use pathway from 6<sup>th</sup> street to the cemetery

## ITEMS THAT ARE **NOT** INCLUDED

- 5th Street alleyway and drainage improvements
- Multiuse pathway from the Cemetery to Saddle Rd (deferred for 2027 ITD roadway rebuild)





#### **BUSINESS INPUT AND CONCERNS**

- **During construction:** customer, employee, ADA, and delivery access
- **After construction:** private property improvements maintenance, repairs, and snow/trash removal
- City provided services for Main Street businesses during construction
  - Pedestrian access
  - Delivery access via alleyways
  - Publicity regarding business access
  - Ensuring construction only takes place on scheduled dates/times






#### **PROJECT DURATION**

 April through the end of October 2024 The community supports the completion of the project as quickly as possible, even if construction takes place at night.








### PHASE 1: APRIL

#### Waterline (4 weeks):

all lanes from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup>, one block at a time, with intersection interruptions at 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and Sun Valley Rd.

#### **Electrical (2 weeks):**

southbound lanes closed with interruptions at 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> St.





### PHASE 2: MAY AND JUNE

Road/sidewalk work (6 weeks): one lane each side to full closure, 2<sup>nd</sup> to

4<sup>th</sup> St.

Sidewalk construction example

#### **Bulbouts (2 weeks):**

one lane closed around each bulbout at 5<sup>th</sup> St.


**Drainage (2 weeks):** one lane closed on 5<sup>th</sup> St.

Road work (2 weeks): partial to full closure at Sun Valley Rd.



### PHASE 3: JULY AND AUGUST

Bulbouts and bike/pedestrian improvements: one lane closed around each bulbout








PHASE 4:
SEPTEMBER
AND
OCTOBER

Road base and paving (3-4 weeks): lane reductions to full closure
