1. Economic Development Update on Downtown Initiatives

Economic Development Director John Rose gave a presentation highlighting current projects, including Pappy's, Kingsport Grocery, Citizen Supply and the Dobyns-Taylor Warehouse. The city manager noted this last project has resulted after a lot of work with the family but is a great opportunity. He also provided details on redevelopment in downtown which would require the city to surplus a parking lot on New Street. He pointed out the location supports existing and future projects as well. Discussion followed.

**Zoning** (AF-50-2023) Planning Manager Ken Weems presented this item pointing the development itself had already been approved by the planning commission and the only item for consideration for the board was to annex. There was considerable discussion.

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VIII.2 Public Hearing and Consideration of an Ordinance to Amend Zoning of Tax Map 46O, Group D, Parcels 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 25.05, and 26 Along Oak Street, E Center Street, and Myrtle Street from the R-2, Two Family Residential; B-3, Highway Oriented Business; and R-1B, Residential Districts to the R-4, Medium Density Apartment District (AF-51-2023). Planning Manager Weems provided details on this item, noting the concerns about the view of Bays Mountain. Some discussion followed.
