Executive Summary:

If approved, the utilities will <u>receive a \$250,000 Lead Service Line Inventory Grant</u> from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) <u>to help comply with EPA lead and copper regulations</u>.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recently revised the "Lead and Copper Regulations" that guide the operations of drinking water utilities. <u>The updated regulations require utilities to develop and maintain an inventory of service line materials within the utility's system, including the piping on the customer's side of the meter.</u> To date, approximately <u>30% of the 38,000 service lines have been completed.</u>

The next step in the process involves reviewing record drawings and developing a statistical analysis based on site visits, customer interviews, and physical inspection. To support this initiative, the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) has made available a <u>State Water Infrastructure Grant (SWIG)</u> of \$250,000, requiring a 15% local match of \$37,500. This grant will aid the city's effort to develop a lead service line inventory necessary to meet the EPA's lead and copper regulations.
