A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH SCHOOLKIT LLC IN CONNECTION WITH A LITERACY IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT GRANT FOR KINGSFORT CITY SCHOOLS FOR YEAR TWO AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY AND PROPER TO EFFECTUATE THE PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Kingsport City Schools has received a grant from the State of Tennessee to be utilized in acquiring services to help identify areas of need and to provide training and support in implementing effective literacy instruction; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee Central Procurement Office has a contract with SchoolKit for such services; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated section 12-3-1201, the city is authorized to purchase goods and services pursuant to the same terms secured by the State of Tennessee Central Procurement Office through its procurement process; and

WHEREAS, this project will be funded by the Comprehensive Literacy State Development (CLSD) grant in the amount of \$80,000.00.

Now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. That an agreement with SchoolKit for Literacy Implementation Support in the amount of \$80,000.00 is approved.

SECTION II. That the mayor, or in his absence, incapacity, or failure to act, the vice mayor, is authorized and directed to execute, in a form approved by the city attorney and subject to the requirements of Article X, Section 10 of the Charter of the City of Kingsport, the SchoolKit agreement for Literacy Implementation Support, in the amount of \$80,000.00, to deliver the agreement and take any and all action as may be required on the part of the city to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the transactions contemplated by the agreement and this resolution.

SECTION III. That the mayor is further authorized to make such changes approved by the mayor and the city attorney to the agreement that do not substantially alter the material provisions of the agreement, and the execution thereof by the mayor and the city attorney is conclusive evidence of the approval of such changes.

SECTION IV. That the board finds that the actions authorized by this resolution are for a public purpose and will promote the health, comfort and prosperity of the citizens of the city.

SECTION V. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.
