Key Accomplishments and Project Updates

- Alaska Housing Finance RFP is out!
- The State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation notified that the City of Kotzebue is eligible for \$1,000,000.00 for Vortac Lake Dam Project.
- Congrats to Parks and Rec on the awesome 4th of July festival!
- Landfill Clean Up Day happened on July 26!

Report Narrative

As of July 2024, we have nearly all Capital Project Priorities funded from 2024 with the City of Kotzebue being eligible for State Revolving Fund for Vortac Lake Dam. This is completely reimbursable, and we recommend moving forward with this project. The only project that does not have allocated funding is the Multipurpose Emergency Shelter and Command Center. This project has not been allocated any funding; however, it was placed on Representative Peltola's FY 2025 Appropriation list. We will see if this gets funded after a budget is passed through congress.

Another large success was that our administration got together for a full day retreat to work through our goals for the next year. We do this every year to team build and ensure that our team is able to move through challenging times together. We defined goals, values and planned on our check in for this in October to ensure we also align it with the end of year budget retreat.

This passed month was very busy in all departments. The finance department worked diligently on the audit during the month of July 2024. BDO came to Kotzebue to help prep for

this and I am very happy with how our team moved through a stressful time. In addition, we did open the leave buy out program for eligible employees for August 1-15, 2024. Employees are eligible if they have taken leave and have over 80 hours of leave after the request.

We are preparing for another landfill inspection scheduled for mid-August. This time around we are more prepared for the landfill inspection than previously. We do acknowledge that we are short staffed just like any other organization throughout the state. This has been challenging for our team as we work through inspections and keeping up with services.

- Alaska Housing Finance Corporation Grant, **\$5,000,000.00**.
 - Grant agreement and notice of opportunity is out for interested parties until August 31, 2024.
- Healthy and Equitable Communities- State of Alaska Department of Health and Division of Public Health, **\$94,471.00**.
 - Quote selected and purchase moving forward. They were scheduled to come up and replace part of the phone system, however, I directed ACS to please get all systems at play before coming to Kotzebue to ensure we do not make this more than one trip due to budget reasons. Schedule is unknown right now until we have a better idea of the point-to-point system.

Hello, all,

I am sure you have already gotten this information from Tessa and Saima, but I want the whole Council to know that the House Appropriations Committee published its earmark (Congressional Directed Spending) list just after the 4th.

Rep Peltola received 5 projects in the Agriculture Rural Community Development Grant Program. One is for \$1 million for the City of Kotzebue's Multipurpose Emergency Shelter Building and Command Center! While not a huge amount, it gets us started on the road to a new multipurpose building.

In addition, the NWAB School District received \$1 million for HVAC Controls Replacement. I have not checked all the other accounts yet for additional projects they may have funded for her, but I am amazed, honestly, that two of her five are in the NANA region.

I have attached the table for the Department of Agriculture; your project is on page 22. I have also attached a document that shows all her earmarks from all the accounts. There is no reason to think that the projects won't make it into the final budget because I'm sure Senator Murkowski with her seat on Senate Appropriations will protect these projects.

Also attached are the Senate lists of CDS grants that have been published to date. Senator Murkowski's are on the first page of each.

Remember that this money will not be available until a FY25 budget is passed and signed into law. I predict a CR on October 1 and it is anyone's guess at this point whether they will pass a budget after the election and before this Congress adjourns. But we can begin talking to the Ag folks in Alaska about the process they will follow in early September. Meanwhile, you need to decide how you would like to spend the money. Will you want to demolish the old, condemned building?

That would certainly be the most appropriate use of the money and will situate you well for a phase II request and grant for FY26.

Meanwhile, you can imagine the state of DC – with both the Congress and Federal Agencies reeling from the events of the last two weeks. An assignation attempt on a Former President and the murder of an innocent bystander along with severe wounds to two others, shock at the abject failure of the Secret Service and the FBI to protect the victims, the decision by the President to not run for re-election, incursions by coordinated Chinese and Russian military air force assets, and expanded warfare in the Middle East along with growing and ever more violent demonstrations by protestors backing Hamas in the US have resulted in a nearly immobilized government. On top of that, everyone I know in D.C. knows someone who has contracted Covid-19 recently or is actively sick now.

The August recess typically does not start until August. But, with a week or so left in July, the House has decided to take off through Labor Day after one more vote today on a messaging resolution against the now-presumptive Democratic presidential nominee, Kamala Harris.

House GOP leaders have given up on passing any more fiscal 2025 appropriations bills before the annual month-long break. They passed their Interior-Environment funding bill late last night, but chances of passage weren't a guarantee, with conservatives considering rejecting the legislation as their amendments continued to fail. Five of them ultimately did, with one Democrat defecting to vote in favor, in a 210-205 vote.

Of the dozen annual funding measures that make up the federal government's appropriations process, the lower chamber has only passed five in total. Along with the Interior Department and EPA funding bill, the House has approved its Military Construction-VA, Defense, Homeland Security and State-Foreign Operations measures, and while the House brought its Legislative Branch appropriations bill to the floor earlier this month, it failed in a surprise outcome for what is typically among the least controversial of the 12 legislative components.

House Republicans faced similar struggles last summer, with fiscal 2024 funding bills dividing the party over proposed funding cuts and controversial policy provisions. GOP leadership may resume its annual funding frenzy after the recess, but either way, Congress will be all but certain to need to pass a continuing resolution in September, or else face a government shutdown October 1. With

October also scheduled as a campaigning break for lawmakers through the November 5 elections, Congress may not end up dealing with its bicameral government funding obligations until the lame-duck period after Election Day.

By the time of your meeting, I am hoping things have calmed a bit in DC. While we all lament how "slow" government moves, it is obvious this week that things can happen quickly. I apologize if this is "old news"!

If you see any of the Delegation or their staff during the August recess, be sure to thank them for the attention they pay to Kotzebue and the Northwest Arctic Region. All three are your champions!

I had planned to be at the August 9 Cape Blossom meetings but now will see you in September!

City Attorney's Report for August 1, 2024 RCCM

<u>Lawsuits</u> <u>Against the</u> City and KPD

There is one active lawsuit pending against the City of Kotzebue at this time - (1) Luke Outwater vs. City of Kotzebue et al. There is currently pending a Petition for Review before the Alaska Supreme Court regarding the trial court's handling of the qualified immunity issue. That Supreme Court case is listed as "Ripe for Decision" as of July 25, 2024. The trial of this civil case has been postponed until after the completion of a separate criminal case against Luke Outwater. (The AMLJIA is providing defense and indemnity for the City in this civil matter.) Mr. Outwater has also been criminally charged with a violation AS11.41.220(a)(1)(A): Assault 3 - Cause Fear of Injury with Weapon (Class C Felony) for his conduct on September 8, 2022. This separate criminal case is set to go to trial in Kotzebue the week of August 12, 2024. Finally, Former KPD Sgt. David Cox has been assigned separate counsel by the AMLJIA in the civil lawsuit.

On Tuesday, June 18, 2024, the City was served with a Summons and Complaint in a case by Clement Barr Richards, Jr., captioned Clement Barr Richards, Jr. v. Maniilaq Association, Teck, and Kotzebue Police Department, 2KB-24-00006Cl. I have filed an ARCP 12(b)(6) Motion to Dismiss the Kotzebue Police Department for lack of jural authority. That issue has been fully briefed and we are waiting for a decision by the Superior Court. The AMLJIA is providing defense and indemnity. (Note: this case was filed in Superior Court on January 18, 2024, but the Summons and Complaint were only given to the City on June 18, 2024.)



Public Works Department Report June/July 2024 Russell Ferguson/Lorraine Hunnicutt

Water Treatment Plant – the new water treatment – line maintenance laborers are removing the brush on the Vortac Dam as required by ADEC. Water plant is now short two operators.

Building Maintenance: Ryan Ahmaogak rescinded his resignation. Gilbert Karmun resigned due to low pay and wanted to move back to his hometown. For a complete record of the work orders they can be found on the Public Works Assistant Directors computer. There were twenty-two (22) work orders generated between June 1, 2024 and July 25, 2024. Six (6) were for the police department with one at the KPD and the rest were at the jail. Six (6) work orders for City Hall, two (2) for public works, three (3) for the water plant with one at Devil's Lake; and the rest were various.

Streets Department: Installed the docks, grading roads, patching asphalt and watering the roads. There were eight work orders for the Streets Department.

Shop Department: There were twenty-seven (27) work orders for the Shop Department. Seven (7) were for heavy equipment. Five (5) were for equipment; seven (7) were for light vehicles; seven (7) were for the police vehicles; and one (1) for the fire department.

Since the Kotzebue Police Department's last activity report, the police department has responded to 648 calls for service (June 2024), a 28% increase from the month of May. Calls of note for the month of June were 10 Domestic Violence Reports, 29 Intoxicated Person Reports, 2 Sex Offenses other than Sexual Assault, 2 Sexual Assaults (Adult). For a complete list of calls for service see the attached report. Calls for service occurred most frequently in June on Thursdays between the hours of 03:00 am to 04:00 am.

The Kotzebue Regional Jail processed 45 prisoners during the month of June, a 22% decrease from May.

Community Policing:

- KPD officers had 55 public relations, safety, and assistance contacts with the citizens and business owners of Kotzebue.
- KPD officers conducted 103 security checks of businesses, or other locations within the city.
- Chief Rouse participated in the Molly of Denali parade.
- Chief Rouse sat as a commissioner on the LEPC and NWAB PSC in June.
- Chief Rouse attended the First Responders Prayer Call for Alaska put on by the Gideons.

Staff Development and Training:

- New 911-Dispatcher Shawata Blackman has begun training and is doing very well.
- New Police Officer Recruit Kevin Jones is set to begin the Police Academy in Sitka on July 20th.
- All staff and officers are still conducting refresher social media training due to the incident with our former Sergeant who resigned.
- MCO Chappell, Sgt Meier, PO Buege, and CSO Nelson attended a Field Training Officer Course.

Community Service Officers:

- The Community Service Officers responded to 40 calls for service regarding animal complaints, a 11% increase from May.
- The CSOs impounded 4 dogs.
- 3 animals were adopted or rescued. (9 since beginning of the year)
- 2 animals were euthanized in May. (11 since the beginning of the year)

1. STAFF: Parks and Recreation consists of a Director, Assistant Director, Program Coordinator, and an attendant. The director is currently on vacation by August 8th.

2. FACILITIES:

- a. Youth Center Boiler Room Repair: Due to moisture issues brought on by temperature changes, the boilers are sinking into the boiler room floor. Boilers will need to be removed and the floor repaired this summer. Parks and Recreation Department and Public Works Department are collaborating on a plan to hire a contractor to conduct these repairs.
- b. Replacement Swings: We are ordering new swing saddles, toddler seats, and chains for the playgrounds.
- c. Harbor/Dock Upgrades/Repairs: Docks are currently being installed. **Boat rentals have started**. Parks and Recreation is currently coordinating harbor improvements. **The city has already received supplies for the ramp modifications and is in the process of being installed**. The shipping bill is quite high. We have spent the grant covering the cost of the materials (excluding shipping). Parks and Rec is preparing the final report and invoices for the state.
- d. Cain building design discussions are ongoing with Dowell Engineering.

3. PROGRAMS:

- a. Armory: The Armory gym program continues operations.
- b. Toddler Time: Toddler Time continues Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00-11:30 AM. Since schools are on summer break, participants comprise parents/toddlers. 5-8 children are participating at a given time.

- c. Open Gym (School): **Open Gym is currently closed.**
- d. Softball: New equipment, including new bases, has arrived. The field behind the Youth Center is currently operating (used by the youth softball league). We are responsible for grading the adult field.
- e. Half-Marathon: Parks and Rec, in partnership with Maniilaq, organizing a half-marathon on August 24th.
- f. Basketball Skills Camp: Parks and Rec is in the process of implementing a Basketball Skills Camp aimed at developing the basketball skills of youth in our community.
- e. Resilient Alaska Youth (RAY) AmeriCorps program: **An application for the Resilient Alaska Youth** (RAY) AmeriCorps program has been submitted. Parks & Rec can potentially expand their capacity to host regular activities targeted at youth ages 10-18 years old.
- f. Veteran's Park: Parks and Rec is currently coordinating strategies for implementation of the Kotzebue Veteran's Park. We need initial funding for this effort. We have researched some funding avenues for the effort.
 - 1. Alaskan Office of Veteran's Affairs. We have the grant application form and will submit it next week. We can expect up to \$10,000.
 - 2. Local Requests for Donations: Based on previous donation profiles, I would expect between \$5,000 \$10,000 in donations from area businesses and organizations.
 - 3. Rasmuson Foundation. Grants are available up to @25,000.

The following is a calendar recap for June 2023 as compared to June 2024.

Total revenue collected in June of 2023 was \$293,628.34 compared to \$285,930.34 in June of 2024. This is a decrease of \$7,698.00 or almost 3% less revenue than this time last year. There were 26 sales days in June of 2023 and 25 sales days in June of 2024.

In June of 2023 we had 5,787 customers compared to 5,494 in June of 2024. This is a decrease of 293 customers. The average sale in June of 2023 was \$50.74 compared to \$52.04 in June of 2024 or an average of \$1.30 more spent per customer this year compared to last year.

Cigarette sales in June of 2023 were \$6,056.98 as compared to \$5952.32 in June of 2024. This is a decrease of \$104.66 in tobacco sales compared to this time LY.

The Delivery Site 2 logged transactions.

The number of 10-day permits issued was 154.

The number of 30-day permits issued was 10.

The number of 90-day permits issued was 6.

The number of 180-day permits issued was 10.

The number of one-year permits issued was 65.

At least 5 permits were newly suspended or revoked due to background checks, public intoxication reports, and COR/judgement paperwork sent from the jail. We received about 23 COR/judgements to update in our system.

Inventory for June 2024 has been completed and filed.
