



AMF is a key stakeholder in the Arctic Urban and Regional Cooperation (AURC). AMF members make up the majority of the 15 member cohort. The program was launched in January 2024 and has ongoing activities through 2026.

Arctic Urban and Regional Cooperation


As the Arctic becomes more present in the global conversation, AMF seeks to ensure that local concerns are part of the narrative presented to global partners.


