Subject: Potable water supplied to Port LaBelle august 11th-12th 2024

As you are aware, the Port LaBelle water plant had a malfunction this past weekend(Saturday night/Sunday morning) the 11th, at 0050hrs Sunday morning I received a text from Jimmy Orlinski inquiring about opening the interconnect as there water plant was down and they were trying to repair it. They ended up taking water until Monday afternoon or evening after getting there plant working.

Our Potable flows produced by the LaBelle water plant are below.

Saturday 10th August (no flow to Port LaBelle, normal city flows) 727443 thousand gallons.

Sunday 11th August (flow started to Port LaBelle at 0050hrs.)

908865 thousand gallons.

Monday 12 August (flow continuing to Port LaBelle until Monday evening) 913758 thousand gallons.

Tuesday 13th August (no flow to Port LaBelle, normal city flows) 795514 thousand gallons.

I have added the day prior to the interconnect being open and the day after it was shut together and divided by 2 to get an average that is then subtracted from the flows on the 11th and 12th to get the volume of water we have to track for loss and billing purposes.

727443 +795514 = 1522957 /

2=761479 thousand gallon avg

gallons used by Port LaBelle

Flow on the 11th (Sunday) 908865-761479 = 147386 thousand

Flow on the 12th(Monday) 913758-761479= 152279 thousand

gallons used by Port LaBelle

The total Billable gallons taken by Port LaBelle gallons.

299665 thousand

Our daily allowed CUP set by SFWMD is - 919233thousand gallons per day. We exceeded this number on the 11th,12th and 13th.

If the new billing rates are not set yet I would at use the old agreement terms for billing.

Apologies for the long typed out explanation, but the attached pictures are of the interconnect meter one from Sept 7, 2021 and the other is from August 12th 2024 ,pretty self-explanatory, The flow meter hasn't been changed and does not function, I could not get usage numbers for billing or reports to the state.
