Congressman Green, who was so instrumental in securing the memorial gun, has been invited to be present at the dedication service on November 11, and make an address befitting the occasion. Those acquainted with the Congressman's ability at speech-making will be present to hear one of his brilliant and inspiring addresses.

At the meeting Monday night the Legion also discussed plans for representatives to attend the mid-summer conference of Legion Posts to be held at Melbourne on August 25. At which time local legionnaires will put forth every effort to secure endorsement of Florida department for location of the Soldiers Home in this city.

Sites for a Legion home in Lake City were discussed at this meeting. After a general discussion it was clearly evident that the majority of those present favored a location for the proposed Legion home which will front a lake front. Several sites have been proposed but none has been accepted thus far.

The placing of the large trench mortar in Lake City will be an inspiring memorial to those boys who "went over there." Not only will this be true but after next Armistice Day this city will be the location of memorials to soldiers who participated in two wars, one national and the other international. The sites of the two memorials will be scarcely the distance of one block apart.

If the Soldiers' Home is brought to this city, and the proposed Legion Home is also placed here, Lake City will have the largest collection of soldiers' homes and memorials to soldiers of any city of its size in the state or nation.

Dr Bates stated that the local Legion Post is at present making every effort toward securing the Soldiers Home for Florida. Like Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce Karstedt, Dr. Bates asks for united effort for a state location first, and then concerted action for Lake City.
