# GREEN SECURES GUN FOR OLUSTEE PARK AT LEGION REQUEST

## Congressman Green Honors Request Of Columbia County Post for War Memorial

Congressman R. A. Green of the Second Florida District, who has recently returned to Washington from Florida, has had a very active and busy week in matters pertaining to the interest of Florida.

On Monday, September 15, Judge Green held a conference with General Wood and General Hines, urging that Florida be included in the restricted area soon to be decided upon by the Board, and in which the branch of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, as provided in the Fletcher-Green bill, will be located. On Thursday, September 18, he also conferred with President Hoover, urging him to intercede in Florida's behalf, and after the conference he stated that he was very much pleased over the keen interest manifested by the President.

Judge Green, on September 16, secured the approval of the Post Office Department for an extension of Rural Route No. 2, and Rural Route No. 3, from Gainesville, Florida. These two extensions will serve a number of persons who are not now receiving adequate service, and will go into effect November 1, 1930.

September 17, he also obtained from the War Department one six inch trench mortar and twelve six inch spherical shells for placing in DeSoto Park at Lake City. Judge Green took this up with the department at the request of The Columbia County Post No. 57, The American Legion, Lake City. The Post will erect the trench mortar and have an appropriate ceremony in their Armistice celebration, November 11, at which time Judge Green has accepted an invitation to deliver the principal address.

He has also accepted an invitation to address the Florida Division of the International Typographical Union in Gainesville, Florida, at their luncheon on October 19. The invitation was extended by Hon. Elmer W. McCreary and others.

Another invitation recently received by Judge Green is that to attend the Armistice Day celebration at Marianna. At that place there will be a joint meeting of the World War veterans, Spanish-American War veterans and Confederate veterans.
