Mayor Walker concluded public comments and indicated the Police Chief would address several issues raised. Clarification was provided that the transfer of Lakeshore Hospital was handled by the Lakeshore Hospital Authority, not the City. He reported the City maintains a contract with the Humane Society, with further details forthcoming. Concerns about park conditions were acknowledged, with initial repairs completed and a broader overhaul underway to improve safety and cleanliness for children. Mayor Walker also noted attending a well-attended Easter egg hunt at Annie Mattox Park, including a return visit to address a park-related issue.

Lake City Police Chief Butler reported that enhanced security planning for the Easter event was implemented in coordination with the Annie Mattox Board and law enforcement that resulted in a safe and orderly gathering at the park with no major incidents. However, after the park closed, a large and growing crowd on Marion Street became unmanageable, blocking traffic and restricting emergency access, prompting complaints from residents. The situation was declared an unlawful assembly after individuals refused to disperse despite warnings, leading officers to deploy pepper balls (no tear gas was used) to clear the area. The crowd dispersed into smaller groups, and later that evening, one individual was reported being shot and sought medical treatment, while another individual was arrested for brandishing a firearm, though authorities do not believe it was connected to the reported shooting. Chief Butler reported he would be conducting an exit meeting to review ways to improve the operational plan for next year.

At 7:12 PM Mayor Walker removed Michael Warren from the meeting due to breaking the rules of decorum.

At 7:13 PM Mayor Walker had Erica Mayo removed from the meeting.

Vice Mayor Young suggested council consideration of an organized event to allow the business owners that lost funds at the Easter event to recover lost revenue.

Mayor Walker suggested a council workshop to review the performance of the contract for the Lake City Humane Society at a future date, members concurred.

Chief Butler reported approximately two months ago, City Manager Rosenthal designated him as the point of contact for animal control services. Following a review of the current ordinance and agreement, Chief Butler identified multiple issues, including repeated non-compliance, delayed or absent responses to calls, and numerous citizen complaints regarding lack of service. He recommended several contract modifications, including reducing Priority 1 response times from one hour to 30 minutes, expanding standard service hours to 8:00 AM–5:00 PM, requiring a one-hour after-hours response for urgent incidents, and eliminating the

current Priority 3 category due to its lack of defined response expectations. Additional recommendations include requiring a minimum of two licensed Animal Control Officers, implementing Level 2 background checks through the Police Department, and issuing official identification cards to improve accountability and coordination. He reported the Humane Society agreed to provide detailed monthly reports on call activity and response times, which would be incorporated into reports to the City Manager and Council. Chief Butler also noted that required annual financial reports have not been submitted in the past but are currently being prepared for review by City leadership. With the contract set to expire on September 30, the Chief advised revising the agreement to ensure improved responsiveness and accountability from any future service provider.

Council Member Carter concurred with having a workshop as soon as possible to discuss the changes suggested by Chief Butler and to help determine if the City would renew its contract with the Humane Society or go out for a Request for Proposal for these services.

The consensus was for City Clerk Sikes and City Manager Rosenthal to schedule a workshop within the next month.

At this time, members took a short recess from 7:43 PM until 7:54 PM.
