Summary Explanation/Background: The municipalities and counties that provide information on Civility and Decorum Ordinances are available for Commission review. As you can see from the attachments, each city or town approaches this topic using different language nuances and formats, such as ordinances or Resolutions to address disruptions in public meetings. Some have adopted ordinances, and others have adopted resolutions. The intent and purpose of this Ordinance on the second reading are to determine if changes are necessary to our discussions on the first reading.

Furthermore, the attached information also includes information from the 2023 Florida Statutes (286.0114, ACLU, Florida Statutes Chapter 286 Public Business and Miscellaneous Provisions, Palm Beach School District, Riviera Beach Agenda statement,

Resolution village of Royal Palm Beach, Town of Landana Resolution 04-2022, Rules of Procedure Palm Beach County, Resolution of the City of Orlando, and Pinellas County Commission Public Participation and Decorum Rules.

Council and Commission Meetings at the local level are considered "limited public forums, meaning the body can enact viewpoint-neutral restrictions to speech (namely place, time, and manner) if there is a compelling government interest. Speaker opinions and viewpoints under the First Amendment are protected. The efficient, orderly conduct of public business is a compelling government interest. What is not allowed is the manner of conduct exhibited by the general public, personal attacks, inability to obey the presiding officer's directions, and speaking when not recognized. These are some of the examples that, at the discretion of the presiding officer, can be curtailed. As you read through the various ordinances and resolutions along with the 2023 Florida Statute, local legislative bodies can enact viewpoint-neutral restrictions. Viewpoints remain protected.

The Ordinance on Second Reading changed to reflect changes discussed at a previous Commission meeting.
