FLORIDA, ACKNOWLEDGING CITY COMMISSION'S CONTINUED COMMITMENT TO ENFORCEMENT OF LAWS TO PROTECT PUBLIC SAFETY WHILE RESPECTING FIRST AMENDMENT RIGHTS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS, SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

RESOLUTION NO. 88-2022 OF THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH BEACH.

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission is committed to its responsibility to its residents and visitors to ensure public safety within the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission is also committed to upholding its residents and visitors' First Amendment rights to free speech and complying with the caselaw governing these rights; and

 **WHEREAS**, the current state of the law in Florida prohibits local governments from prohibiting the exercise of First Amendment rights that are associated with panhandling; however, law enforcement may continue to enforce laws that address threats to public safety; and

**WHEREAS**, there are several state statutes that protect residents and visitors and these statutes have been and will continue to be enforced; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 784.011, Florida Statutes, prohibits the offense of an assault which is "an intentional, unlawful threat by word or act to do violence to the person of another, coupled with an apparent ability to do so, and doing some act which creates a well-founded fear in such other person that such violence is imminent"; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 784.03, Florida Statutes, prohibits the offense of a battery which "occurs when a person actually and intentionally touches or strikes another person against the will of the other; or intentionally causes bodily harm to another person"; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 316.2045, Florida Statutes, prohibits a person, in certain instances, from willfully "obstruct[ing] the free, convenient, and normal use of a public street, highway, or road..."; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 856.021, Florida Statutes, provides that it is "unlawful for any person to loiter or prowl in a place, at a time or in a manner not usual for law-abiding individuals, under circumstances that warrant a justifiable and reasonable alarm or immediate concern for the safety of person or property in the vicinity"; and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office remains steadfast in its continued enforcement of the laws highlighted above and other applicable laws to ensure
