1	Prior to 3rd hole shortening, I received an average of 5 GOLF BALLS PER DAY, with extensive damage to vehicles and home, etc. I have almost been hit dozens of times. My neighbors have similar experience that makes our homes unsafe and greatly diminishing property usage and values. Citizens in the public thoroughfare (N Lakeside) were also at great risk, without any awareness of it. Since moving the tee, my immediate neighbors and I are receiving NO balls. Due to the layout of the hole and the poor caliber of some players, reverting to the original tee, even with any possible modifications, will again put residents and the general public at considerable risk, and will inevitably result in injury or even death, and negligence lawsuits against The City of LWB.
