FOURTH AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (Planning, Zoning and Historic Preservation Professional Services)

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT to the Professional Services Agreement for Planning, Zoning and Historic Preservation Professional Services ("Amendment") is made as of by and between the City of Lake Worth Beach, a Florida municipal corporation ("City") and CHEN MOORE AND ASSOCIATES, INC, a Florida Corporation located at 500 Australian Ave South, Suite 850, West Palm Beach, Fl, 33401 ("Consultant").

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2021, based on the Request for Proposals RFP No. 21-207 for Planning, Zoning and Historic Preservation Professional Services the City entered into a Professional Services Agreement with NZ Consultants, Inc. to complement the Planning & Preservation Division staff of the City's Department of Community Sustainability ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the term of the Agreement was for three (3) years with two (2) additional one (1) year; and

WHEREAS, on February 13, 2023, the City entered into a Novation Agreement with NZ Consultants, Inc. to transfer all of its rights, titles and interests in Contracts to the Consultant in order to continue the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2024 the City and the Consultant amended the agreement to extend the terms of the Agreement for an additional one (1) year to September 27, 2025.

WHEREAS, the CITY and the Consultant is in need of additional services under the same terms and conditions as the Agreement to prepare the Carbon Neutral Element for the Comprehensive Plan under the same terms and conditions as the Agreement due to the staffing shortages in the Community Sustainability Department; and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT submitted a proposal for the pricing to be provided under this Amendment, which proposal is attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has reviewed the CONSULTANT's proposed price and determined that the price is fair and reasonable; and

WHEREAS, the City finds amending the Agreement as set forth herein is in the best interest of the City and serves a valid public purpose.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by each party hereto, the parties agree as follows:

1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are fully incorporated herein by reference.

- 2. Scope of Services. The parties agree that the scope of services is amended to include the additional services described in Exhibit "A".
- 3. Compensation to Consultant. The compensation to be paid by the CITY to the CONSULTANT for the additional services described in Exhibit "A" shall not exceed Eighty-Five Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$85,870).
- 4. Entire Agreement. The parties agree that the Agreement (as previously amended) the Novation Agreement and this amendment set forth the entire agreement between the parties, and that there are no promises or understandings other than those stated herein. None of the provisions, terms and conditions contained in this amendment may be added to, modified, superseded or otherwise altered, except by written instrument executed by the parties hereto.
- 5. Counterparts. This Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and will become effective and binding upon the parties as of the effective date at such time as all the signatories hereto have signed a counterpart of this Amendment. The parties may sign this Amendment electronically and such electronic signature will be treated as an original signature of the signing party.
- 6. Amendment. Except for the provisions of the Agreement previously amended and specifically amended by this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The scope of services our firm shall provide under this agreement as per our recent discussions and correspondence is as follows:

Part of creating a Carbon Neutral element includes researching a methodology for measuring and monitoring carbon emissions in the City. The intent of the new element is to support energy, development, infrastructure, conservation, and other climate-friendly policies. Among several opportunities for promoting carbon neutrality, the city should initiate a marketing initiative to provide information that helps residents and businesses to reduce carbon emissions and be more energy efficient.

As part of becoming a Carbon Neutral, the City should focus on using renewable energy sources for all City-owned properties. Also, transportation policies should strengthen existing infrastructure for bicyclists and pedestrians and encourage multi modal forms of transportation (Palm Tran, Tri-Rail, etc.). The proposed final document will be comprehensive and include policies supporting carbon offsets initiatives such as urban forestry policies and others.

Task 1: Coordination with City Staff

Task 2: Review Existing Documentation and Demographics

- Consultant will conduct meetings with pertaining City's departments including Community Sustainability, Electric Utility and a Water/Sewer Utility Departments

Task 3: Research, Methodology and Monitoring

- Consultant will provide definitions, identifies federal and local initiatives, world organizations, and private companies which currently support Carbon Neutral strategies and policies.
- Consultant along with City Staff will establish a methodology and related assumptions to support a Carbon Neutral city, and establish carbon footprint offsetting policies.
- Consultant will establish an accepted method for measuring and monitoring carbon emissions in the city.

Task 4: Draft Carbon Neutral Element

- Consultant will prepare a Draft Carbon Neutral element that will be submitted to City Staff for review and comments including proposed Policies (Goals, Objectives and Policies), and Data & Analysis to support policies.
- Consultant will prepare a power point to present at workshops.
- Consultant will attend three (3) workshops to present Draft Carbon Neutral Element to answer questions and gather input prior to preparing final document. one (1) with the City Commission; one (1) with the Planning and Zoning Board (P&Z); and one (1) with the Historic Resources Preservation Board (HRP).

- Consultant will prepare transmittal adoption letter to the State, upload adopted document to State website
 and email it to all pertaining agencies according to Florida Statutes.

ASSUMPTIONS

This scope of service assumes the following:

- The City will provide consultant with all pertinent documents required to complete the project including existing projects, programs, reports, budgets.
- This initiative will include the Community Sustainability, Electric Utility and a Water/Sewer Utility Departments

DELIVERABLE AND TIMELINE

Consultant will provide the Client with Final Carbon Neutral element within **eight months** of receiving the P.O. from the City. Processing and adoption might take **additional four months** depending on city's boards, commission schedules, and the State review issuing the ORC report.
