1 2 ORDINANCE 2023-05 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKE 3 ADOPTING WORTH BEACH. FLORIDA. Α SINGLE-MEMBER 4 ELECTION REDISTRICTING MAP; REPEALING ARTICLE 5 Ш **"TERRITORIAL BOUNDARIES: ELECTION PRECINCTS," SECTION 2** 6 7 "ELECTION DISTRICTS" OF THE CHARTER AND ADOPTING A NEW **ARTICLE II "TERRITORIAL BOUNDARIES; ELECTION PRECINCTS,"** 8 SECTION 2 "SINGLE-MEMBER ELECTION DISTRICTS" TO REFLECT 9 THE REDISTRICTING MAP AND ITS BOUNDARIES AND FOR OTHER 10 PURPOSES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, 11 **CODIFICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE** 12 13 WHEREAS, the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida (the "City"), is a duly constituted 14 15 municipality having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes; and 16 17 **WHEREAS**, on March 8, 2022, the qualified voters of the City approved, by 18 referendum, an amendment to the City's Charter changing the at-large voting system to 19 a single-member district voting system (Ordinance No. 2021-22); and 20 21 **WHEREAS**, to implement the single-member districts and to comply with the 22 Voting Rights Act of 1965 and the Equal Protection Clause of the United States 23 Constitution (14<sup>th</sup> Amendment), the City Commission began the process of evaluating the 24 City's four (4) at-large election districts based on apportionment data from the US Census 25 Bureau: and 26 27 WHEREAS, the City contracted with Florida Atlantic University (FAU) to conduct 28 an analysis of the current at-large election districts to determine if the City needed to 29 amend the district boundaries due to changes in population; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the Equal Protection Clause requires "an honest and good faith effort 32 to construct districts...as nearly of equal population as is practicable" See Reynolds v. 33 Sims, 377 U.S. 533 (1964); and 34 35 WHEREAS, based on data from the 2020 US Census, FAU conducted a 36 37 population analysis and presented a total of five (5) map alternatives for the purposes of redistricting to the City Commission; and 38 39 WHEREAS, according to FAU's "Final Consultant Report: Redistricting 40 Alternatives for the City of Lake Worth Beach" dated December 19, 2022 ("Final 41 Consultant Report"), "Based on 2020 data, the election districts have a total deviation of 42 133.31% and a spread between the largest and smallest districts of 72.10%. Based on 43 44 the 2020 Census Block data, the current districts are well above the 10% deviation (spread) threshold used to evaluate election districts for population equity"; and 45 46 WHEREAS, the City Commission considered and discussed FAU's initial "District 47 48 Analysis" that was presented at the September 12, 2022, work session; and 49

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50 WHEREAS, alternative maps were considered by the City Commission at the City 51 Commission meetings on October 6, 2022, November 1, 2022, January 3, 2023, and 52 February 7, 2023; and the maps were also presented at separate public meetings held 53 on October 13, 2022, October 15, 2022, and February 4, 2023; and

55 **WHEREAS**, to increase public access to the redistricting process, the City also 56 created a webpage to disseminate the redistricting map alternatives, reports, and public 57 comments; and

59 **WHEREAS**, the City Commission voted to adopt "City of Lake Worth Beach 60 Alternative Districts: Option 5" at its February 7, 2023, meeting; and

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**WHEREAS,** the City Commission finds and declares that the adoption of this 62 ordinance is appropriate; the establishment of single-member districts is made necessary 63 based upon (1) the City's electors' approval of single-member district voting in Ordinance 64 No. 2021-22 (referendum) and (2) FAU's findings that the current at-large election districts 65 are well above the 10% deviation allowed under the Voting Rights Act (and the Equal 66 Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution); the 67 adoption serves a public purpose and is in the best interest of the health, safety and 68 69 welfare of the City, its residents and visitors.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH BEACH, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1: The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as
being true and correct and are made a specific part of this ordinance as if set forth herein.

The City Commission hereby adopts the findings, conclusions, and 77 Section 2: recommendations prepared by FAU in its Final Consultant Report, and the same is 78 incorporated herein by this reference and made a part hereof. The City Commission 79 hereby adopts FAU's "City of Lake Worth Beach Alternative Districts: Option 5" ("Map 5"), 80 as recommended, for the establishment of its single-member election districts. Map 5 is 81 attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and is incorporated herein, and such map is hereby 82 established as the current single-member election district boundaries within the limits of 83 the City and shall continue until redistricting occurs. All candidates for the March 2024 84 municipal election are hereby required to comply with Map 5's single-member districts. 85

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87 Section 3: Article II "Territorial Boundaries; Election Precincts," Section 2
88 "Election districts" of the City of Lake Worth Beach Charter is hereby repealed in full.
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Section 4: Article II "Territorial Boundaries; Election Precincts," Section 2
"Single-member election districts" of the City of Lake Worth Beach Charter is hereby
adopted to read as follows:

- 94 <u>Sec. 2. Single-member election districts.</u>
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To implement single-member district voting set forth in Article III, Section 1 of the
Charter, the boundaries for each of the four (4) single-member election districts of
the City of Lake Worth Beach are hereby established as follows:

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- (1) District No. 1. COMMENCING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth 100 101 Road and the centerline of I-95; thence run westerly along the centerline of Lake Worth Road to the city's western corporate limits and the POINT OF 102 BEGINNING: thence run easterly along the centerline of Lake Worth Road to 103 the centerline intersection of South A Street; thence run southerly along the 104 centerline of South A Street to the centerline intersection of 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue South; 105 thence run easterly along the centerline of said 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue South to centerline 106 intersection of the FEC Railway; thence run southerly and easterly along the 107 centerline of said FEC Railway to the city's southern corporate limits; thence 108 run westerly and northerly along the city's southern and western corporate 109 limits to the POINT OF BEGINNING. 110
- (2) District No. 2. COMMENCING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth 111 Road and the centerline of I-95; thence run westerly along the centerline of 112 Lake Worth Road to the city's western corporate limits and the POINT OF 113 BEGINNING; thence run easterly along the centerline of Lake Worth Road to 114 the centerline intersection of North A Street; thence run northerly along the 115 centerline of North A Street to the centerline intersection of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue North; 116 thence run easterly along the centerline of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue North to the centerline 117 intersection of Dixie Highway; thence run northerly along the centerline of 118 119 Dixie Highway to the city's northern corporate limits; thence run westerly, southerly and easterly along the city's northern and western corporate limits 120 to the POINT OF BEGINNING. 121
- 122 (3) District No. 3. BEGINNING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth Road and North A Street; thence run northerly along the centerline of North A Street 123 to the centerline intersection of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue North; thence run easterly along 124 the centerline of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue North to the centerline intersection of Dixie 125 126 Highway; thence run northerly along the centerline of Dixie Highway to the 127 city's northern corporate limits; thence run easterly and southerly along the city's northern and eastern corporate limits to the centerline intersection of the 128 city's eastern corporate limits and the easterly extension of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue North; 129 130 thence run westerly along the centerline of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue North to the centerline intersection of North Federal Highway; thence run southerly along the 131 centerline of North Federal Highway to the centerline intersection of Lucerne 132 Avenue; thence run westerly along the centerline of Lucerne Avenue to the 133 POINT OF BEGINNING. 134
- 135(4) District No. 4. BEGINNING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth Road136and South A Street; thence run southerly along the centerline of South A137Street to the centerline intersection of 4th Avenue South; thence run easterly138along the centerline of said 4th Avenue South to centerline intersection of the139FEC Railway; thence run southerly and easterly along the centerline of said140FEC Railway to the city's southern corporate limits; thence run easterly and141northerly along the city's southern and eastern corporate limits to the

centerline intersection of the city's eastern corporate limits and the easterly 142 extension of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue North; thence run westerly along the centerline of 7<sup>th</sup> 143 Avenue North to the centerline intersection of North Federal Highway; thence 144 145 run southerly along the centerline of North Federal Highway to the centerline intersection of Lucerne Avenue: thence run westerly along the centerline of 146 Lucerne Avenue to the POINT OF BEGINNING. 147 The City of Lake Worth Beach's single-member election districts, as described above, are 148 depicted in the Alternative Districts Option 5 map adopted in Ordinance No. 2023-05. 149 150 Said ordinance shall remain on file in the Office of the City Clerk and shall be available for inspection by the public upon request. 151 152 The City Manager or designee, with the assistance of the City Clerk. 153 Section 5: is hereby authorized and directed to transmit the following to the Palm Beach County 154 Supervisor of Elections (the "Supervisor") upon adoption: (1) a certified copy of this 155 Ordinance along with **Exhibit A**; (2) a paper copy and shapefile of the redistricting map; 156 and (3) and any other document required by the Supervisor. 157 158 159 Section 6: Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of 160 competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and 161 independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining 162 163 portions thereof. 164 165 Section 7: Repeal of Laws in Conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict. 166 167 Section 8: Codification. The sections of the ordinance may be made a part of 168 169 the City Code of Laws and ordinances and may be re-numbered or re-lettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "division", or 170 any other appropriate word. 171 172 173 Section 9: Effective Date.
