15 16	SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, REPEAL OF ALL CONFLICTING LAWS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE
17 18	WHEREAS, a Charter for the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida (the "City") was
19 20	created and adopted pursuant to the Constitution and applicable laws of the State of Florida; and
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, pursuant to section 166.021, Florida Statutes, the City has the governmental, corporate and proprietary powers to enable it to conduct municipal government; and
25 26 27 28 29 20	WHEREAS, pursuant to section 166.021(4), Florida Statutes, the City Charter may be amended through the City's exercise of its authority, including the amendment of those portions of its Charter which require a referendum, provided that a majority of the electors in a referendum affirmatively vote to amend the Charter; and
 30 31 32 33 34 	WHEREAS, section 166.031, Florida Statutes, authorizes the governing body of a municipality to submit proposed amendments to the Charter of the municipality in the form of an ordinance to the electors of the municipality; and
34 35 36 37	WHEREAS, on March 8, 2022, the qualified voters of the City approved by referendum an amendment to the City's Charter changing the at-large voting system to a single-member district voting system (Ordinance No. 2021-22); and
38 39 40	WHEREAS, to implement the single-member districts and to comply with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and the Equal Protection Clause of the United States
41 42 43	Constitution (14 th Amendment), the City Commission contracted with Florida Atlantic University to evaluate the City's four (4) at-large election districts based on apportionment data from the US Census Bureau to present redistricting map alternatives; and
44 45 46	WHEREAS, after multiple public meetings and City Commission meetings, the Commission adopted one of the FAU redistricting maps in Ordinance No. 05-2023; and

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WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it to be in the best interests of the City and serving a valid public purpose to conduct a referendum (the "Referendum") on the question of whether Section 2 of Article II of the Charter of the City of Lake Worth Beach be amended to confirm the current single-member election district boundaries adopted in Ordinance No. 05-2023 and to provide for the routine review and analysis of the geographical boundaries of the single-member election districts after each decennial census and to amend said districts, by ordinance, to comply with applicable law.

- 56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF LAKE 57 WORTH BEACH, FLORIDA:
- 59 <u>Section 1</u>. <u>Findings adopted</u>. The findings of the Commission set forth in the foregoing 60 recitals are hereby adopted as true and correct statements and specifically made a part 61 of this ordinance.
- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>Referendum declared</u>. A referendum is hereby called for and shall be held
 in the City on the 19th day of March, 2024, to determine whether or not a majority of the
 electors voting in the Referendum support the proposed amendment to the City Charter,
 as shown in Sections 6 and 7 of this ordinance.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Ballot title</u>. The ballot title which is the subject of this Referendum, and by
 which the proposed Charter Amendment is to be commonly referred to or spoken of, shall
 be captioned as "**Redistricting of Single-Member Election Districts to Comply with** Applicable Law."
- 72 Conduct of Referendum. The City shall determine the polling locations or 73 Section 4. places in coordination with the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections, and all 74 gualified electors of the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida who vote in the Referendum 75 shall vote at those designated polling places. The polls shall be opened on the date of 76 the Referendum on the proposed City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida, Charter Amendment 77 from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. on the same day. Only the duly qualified electors of the 78 City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida shall be permitted to vote on this Referendum question. 79 80
- Notice and advertising of the Referendum. The City Clerk shall prepare and 81 Section 5. give notice of the proposed Charter Amendment by causing appropriate notice to be 82 published in accordance with the provisions of Section 100.342, Florida Statutes, which 83 provides for at least one publication each week during the third and fifth weeks preceding 84 the week in which the Referendum to consider the proposed Charter Amendment is to be 85 held. The publications shall be placed in a newspaper of general circulation in the City. 86 The City Clerk shall secure from the publisher of the newspaper, an appropriate affidavit 87 of proof that the statutorily required Referendum notices have been duly published, as 88 herein set forth and these two affidavits shall be part of the record of the City Commission. 89 90
- <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Ballot summary</u>. The ballot summary of the proposed Charter amendment

- (3) District No. 3. BEGINNING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth Road 155 and North A Street; thence run northerly along the centerline of North A Street 156 to the centerline intersection of 10th Avenue North; thence run easterly along 157 the centerline of 10th Avenue North to the centerline intersection of Dixie 158 Highway; thence run northerly along the centerline of Dixie Highway to the 159 city's northern corporate limits; thence run easterly and southerly along the 160 city's northern and eastern corporate limits to the centerline intersection of the 161 city's eastern corporate limits and the easterly extension of 7th Avenue North; 162 thence run westerly along the centerline of 7th Avenue North to the centerline 163 intersection of North Federal Highway; thence run southerly along the 164 centerline of North Federal Highway to the centerline intersection of Lucerne 165 Avenue; thence run westerly along the centerline of Lucerne Avenue to the 166 POINT OF BEGINNING. 167
- (4) District No. 4. BEGINNING at the centerline intersection of Lake Worth Road 168 and South A Street; thence run southerly along the centerline of South A 169 Street to the centerline intersection of 4th Avenue South; thence run easterly 170 along the centerline of said 4th Avenue South to centerline intersection of the 171 FEC Railway; thence run southerly and easterly along the centerline of said 172 FEC Railway to the city's southern corporate limits; thence run easterly and 173 northerly along the city's southern and eastern corporate limits to the 174 centerline intersection of the city's eastern corporate limits and the easterly 175 extension of 7th Avenue North; thence run westerly along the centerline of 7th 176 Avenue North to the centerline intersection of North Federal Highway; thence 177 run southerly along the centerline of North Federal Highway to the centerline 178 179 intersection of Lucerne Avenue; thence run westerly along the centerline of Lucerne Avenue to the POINT OF BEGINNING. 180
- 181 The City of Lake Worth Beach's single-member election districts, as described 182 above, are depicted in Alternative Districts Option 5 map adopted in Ordinance No. 05-

2023. Said ordinance shall remain on file in the Office of the City Clerk and shall be 183 available for inspection by the public upon request. 184 185 Section 8. Canvassing. The election returns of the Referendum shall be canvassed in 186 the manner provided by law, and the returns shall be certified to the City Commission, 187 which shall declare the result thereof. Upon canvassing the returns of the Referendum, 188 the result of the Referendum shall be recorded in the minutes of the City Commission in 189 the manner prescribed by law. 190 191 Section 9. Severability. If any section or portion of this ordinance, or the application 192 193 thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the ordinance which can be 194 given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of 195 this ordinance are declared severable. 196 197 Section 10. Codification. The provision of this ordinance, as set out in Section 7 of this 198 199 ordinance, shall become and be made part of the Charter of the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida. 200 201 Section 11. Repeal of laws in conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances and 202 resolutions or parts of resolutions of the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida, that are in 203 conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such 204 conflict. 205

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 207 <u>Section 12</u>. <u>Effective date</u>. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after
 208 passage.
