


Various units within PBSO came together for the Christmas parade, proudly representing our agency while spreading holiday cheer throughout the community.




The PBSO PAL Back-to-School Bash created a fun and welcoming space where students received backpacks, supplies, and support to start the school year with confidence.

Homeless Intervention Team (HIT)



District 14 currently has one full-time deputy assigned to the Homeless Intervention Team (HIT).

In November 2025, we added a second HIT Deputy on a month-to-month basis to address issues in the evenings.

Additionally, on each of our four Road Patrol shifts, we have a designated deputy trained in Homeless Interventions who serve as liaisons.
