FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 5 2 "ADMINISTRATION," ADDING A NEW ARTICLE 16III "BUSINESS 6 7 ADVISORY BOARD," PROVIDING FOR A NEW BUSINESS ADVISORY BOARD, TERMS, COMPOSITION AND DUTIES; AND PROVIDING FOR 8 9 SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE 10 11 WHEREAS, as provided in Section 2(b), Article VIII of the Constitution of the State 12 of Florida, and Section 166.021(1), Florida Statutes, the City of Lake Worth Beach (the 13 "City"), enjoys all governmental, corporate, and proprietary powers necessary to conduct 14 15 municipal government, perform municipal functions, and render municipal services, and may exercise any power for municipal purposes, except as expressly prohibited by law; 16 17 and 18 WHEREAS, as provided in Section 166.021(3), Florida Statutes, the governing 19 body of each municipality in the state has the power to enact legislation concerning any 20 subject matter upon which the state legislature may act, except when expressly prohibited 21 22 by law; and 23 WHEREAS, the City wishes to amend Chapter 2 "Administration," adding thereto 24 a new Article 16III "Business Advisory Board," to create a new Business Advisory Board 25 including the terms, composition and duties; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the City of Lake Worth Beach, Florida (the "City"), is a duly constituted 28 municipality having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution 29 and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the City Commission finds and declares that the adoption of this 32 ordinance is appropriate, and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the 33 City, its residents and visitors. 34 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE 36 **CITY OF LAKE WORTH BEACH, FLORIDA, that:** 37 38 The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as 39 Section 1: being true and correct and are made a specific part of this ordinance as if set forth herein. 40 41 Chapter 2 "Administration," is hereby amended by adding thereto a 42 Section 2: new Article 16III "Business Advisory Board," to read as follows: 43 44 **ARTICLE 16III. – BUSINESS ADVISORY BOARD** 45 46 47 Sec. 2-271. – Creation of business advisory board and purpose. 48 There is hereby created a business advisory board. The business advisory board shall 49 act in an advisory capacity to the city manager and city commission. The business 50 advisory board shall be advisory in nature only. The business advisory board shall 51

52	promote business development and support and sustain existing businesses within the
53	city by identifying business opportunities and acting as a liaison between the owners of
54	businesses within the city and the city commission.

56	<u>Sec. 2-272. – Composition; appointment of members.</u>
57	
58	(a) The board shall be appointed by the city commission and shall consist of five (5)
59	members and two (2) alternate members. The board members need not be
60	residents of the city, but shall be owners or operators of businesses within the city.
61	The board members shall be comprised of representatives from the following
62	categories: retail business, professional services business, personal services
63	business, commercial realtor or business broker, certified property manager,
64	community bank representative, and commercial property owner.
65	
66	(b) Appointments shall be made consistent with Section 2-9.
67	
68	(c) Alternate members shall be appointed as first alternate and second alternate, and
69	shall serve on the board in that order in the event a regular member is absent.
70	
71	(d) If any member of the board shall fail to be present at three (3) consecutive regularly
72	scheduled meetings or at twenty (20) percent of the regularly scheduled meetings
73	of the board held within any twelve-month period, the city clerk shall declare the
74	member's office vacant, and the city commission shall promptly fill such vacancy.
75	
76	(e) If the position of a member becomes vacant for any reason, the city commission
77	shall appoint another person to serve the unexpired term of the vacated position.
78	
79	(f) The city commission may remove any member of the board for misconduct or
80	neglect of duty.

82	<u>Sec. 2-273. – Officers; meetings.</u>
83	
84	(a) Officers. The board shall elect its officers for a term of one (1) calendar year,
85	not to exceed the member's appointed term.
86	
87	1. Chairperson. Presides at meetings of the board and makes
88	presentations, written and oral, on behalf of the board to the city
89	commission and the city manager.
90	
91	2. <u>Vice-chairperson. Performs the duties of the chairperson in his/her</u>
92	absence.
93	
94	Secretary. Records the minutes and attendance at each meeting.
95	
96	(b) <u>Meetings.</u>
97	
98	1. <u>The board shall meet bimonthly, or more regularly as necessary to address</u>
99	matters as requested by the commission.

100 101	 Three (3) members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the performance of the duties of the board at any time.
101	performance of the duies of the board at any time.
102	3. Meetings of the board shall be open to the public, and minutes shall be kept.
103	A public record of the board's minutes and resolutions shall be maintained
105	and made available for inspection by the public.

107	Sec. 2-274. – Duties.
108	
109	The board's duties shall consist of the following:
110	<u></u>
111	(a) Advise the city commission as to recommended improvements to, and the
112	establishment of, city policies and procedures impacting the business community;
113	
114	(b) Review and recommend appropriate communication strategies to disseminate city
115	information to the business community;
116	
117	(c) Solicit and facilitate business input in matters of significance in the city;
118	(1) - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 -
119	(d) Endeavor to build an expanding community of support through education of its
120	members, prospective members, community groups and government officials;
121	
122	(e) Advise the city commission and city administration on business development
123	opportunities within the city;
124	
125	(f) Identify, analyze and address legislative issues that may impact the business
126	community; and
127	
128	(g) Any additional duties as may be assigned by the city commission.
129	
130	<u>Sec. 2-275. – Staff liaison.</u>
131	
132	The city manager, or his or her appointed designee, is staff liaison to the board
133	and attends board meetings. The city manager or appointed designee shall serve only in
134	an advisory capacity. The city manager or appointed designee shall have a continuing
135	responsibility to explain the organization, responsibilities and objectives to the board. The
136	city manager or appointed designee shall work closely with the board in matters of interest
137	to the operation of efficient programs and inform the board concerning the interests,
138	needs, objectives, progress, plans, and other factors of importance. The city manager or
139	appointed designee shall be the official medium of communication between the city
140	commission and the board.
141	
142	Section 3: <u>Severability</u> . If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or
143	portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of
144	competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and
145	independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining
110

148 **Section 4:** Repeal of Laws in Conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in 149 conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

151 <u>Section 5:</u> <u>Codification</u>. The sections of the ordinance may be made a part of 152 the City Code of Laws and ordinances and may be re-numbered or re-lettered to 153 accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "division", or 154 any other appropriate word.

156 <u>Section 6:</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall become effective 10 days after 157 passage.
