TOPIC Adoption of Village of Lake Orion 2026-29 Pavement Asset Management Plan

BACKGROUND BRIEF:

Council is scheduled to adopt the Village of Lake Orion's 2026-2029 Pavement Asset Management Plan (PAMP) for submission to the Michigan Department of Transportation.

Public Act 51 of 1951 created the Michigan Transportation Fund to distribute transportation taxes to local agencies for use in maintaining their public road networks, and also specifies how that funding is apportioned between Major and Local road networks. In order to free the Village of Lake Orion to apply Act 51 funding as it best suits the community, the State requires submittal of a Pavement Asset Management Plan (PAMP). The State of Michigan formed the Michigan Transportation Asset Management Council (TAMC) to assist local agencies in the use of asset management principles. This PAMP, as adopted by the Village of Lake Orion following principles outlined by TAMC, is intended to provide a plan to ensure public funds are used as effectively as possible, improve and maintain the condition of the Village roads, and meet the expectations of the users of the road network.

If adopted, the proposed improvements contained in the plan will be added to the Village's six-year capital improvement plan.

Engineer Spence will be in attendance at Monday's meeting to answer any questions on the proposed plan.

SUMMARY OF PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION:

07/13/2026 – Council received the proposed PAMP and scheduled the plan for consideration for adoption at its July 27, 2026, meeting.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Adoption of the PAMP will permit the Village to utilize up to 100% of its Act 51 Major Street funds for local streets maintenance and improvement, providing the greatest flexibility in use of road funding. This flexibility will assist the Village in meeting its obligations for contributions to street improvements under the Village's current road special assessment policy.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

To adopt the Village of Lake Orion 2026-2029 Pavement Asset Management Plan (PAMP) as presented and authorize its submission to the Michigan Department of Transportation.
