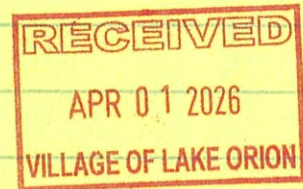

Hello,

I came in earlier this week inquiring about the street improvement program and a very nice gentlemen took time to explain. Unfortunately, after I left and after reading the Lake Orion Review, I have more questions. We will be at U of M Monday and unlikely that we will be back in time for the meeting so I was hoping to get a few questions answered.

1. I understand that the portion an affected resident would pay is based on their lot size. Do I have that correct? YOU ARE CORRECT. ANY STREET SPECIAL ASSESSMENT AGAINST A BENEFITTING ABUTTING PROPERTY WILL BE BASED ON THE LINEAL FRONT FOOTAGE OF A PROPERTY ALONG THE STREET EXCEPT IN UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCES. IF AN UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCE EXISTS, WE WILL EXPLAIN TO THE PROPERTY OWNER HOW WE CALCULATED THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT AS PART OF THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE THAT IS MAILED TO THE PROPERTY OWNER.
2. I live on West Church St. where there are only 4 houses and the cemetery. Should those 4 houses feel repair or replacement is not needed how is it decided? THE VILLAGE COUNCIL, AFTER HEARING PUBLIC COMMENT, WILL DECIDE WHETHER YOUR STREET WILL BE IMPROVED. PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT THE VILLAGE WILL COVER THE CEMETERY'S SHARE OF THE COST FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS IN THE SAME MANNER AND METHOD AS IS CALCULATED FOR THE OTHER PROPERTY OWNERS.
3. Why is West Church St. not part of the transportation economic development fund grant program? The only way to get to another street is through Church St. or Flint St. (even if a short distance). THE ORIGINAL STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT WAS A MUCH SMALLER PROJECT THAT INCLUDED THE "TREATMENT 'A' DESIGNATED STREETS IN OUR PAVEMENT ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN (THE STREETS IN THAT AREA THAT WERE DETERMINED TO BE IN THE WORST CONDITION BY OUR ENGINEERS). WE APPLIED FOR GRANT FUNDING FOR THAT ORIGINAL PROJECT. IT WAS ONLY AFTER WE RECEIVED GRANT FUNDING FOR THOSE PARTICULAR STREETS THAT COUNCIL DECIDED TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF THE PROJECT TO INCLUDE THE ENTIRE NEIGHBORHOOD. SINCE THE ADDITIONAL STREETS WERE NOT INCLUDED IN THE GRANT APPLICATION, THE GRANT FUNDING CANNOT BE USED FOR THOSE STREET IMPROVEMENTS. ALSO, THE GRANT FUNDING IS CAPPED AT \$250,000, SO THE VILLAGE WOULD NOT HAVE RECEIVED ANY ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE ADDITIONAL STREETS.

It seems that a street that takes the brunt of the traffic would qualify especially with heavy trucks coming and going during the summer for tear down/rebuilding on other streets. WE AGREE WHOLEHEARTEDLY. FOR THAT REASON, OUR SPECIAL ASSESSMENT POLICY IS SET UP TO PROVIDE A LARGER CONTRIBUTION FROM THE VILLAGE GENERALLY FOR STREETS THAT HAVE HIGHER LEVELS OF TRAFFIC. THAT IS WHY THE VILLAGE'S POLICY CALLS FOR THE VILLAGE TO CONTRIBUTE 10% TOWARD THE COST OF DEAD-END STREETS, 25% FOR LOCAL PASS-THROUGH STREETS, AND 50% FOR MAJOR STREETS.

I would really like to know more and would appreciate your reply.

For me though, for Monday's meeting, at this time I do not feel Church St. should be repaired or replaced.

My preferences regarding the South Andrews street road is that

1. The street be properly repaired to fix whatever is causing the middle of the street to crack and fall down ^{in the center} from the edges. I have one caveat to said preference and that is if the repair costs are ~~are~~ within 50% of the cost of a complete replacement, then I'd select #2.

2. Replace the road if the cost (including all necessary work be done to ensure that water & sewer lines are intact and useable) is equal to or less than twice the cost of repair work in option #1.

Option #3. If the road ~~can~~ (including repairing the cracking down the center) can be ^{repaired} ~~done~~ for significantly less than my #1 choice then I'd select to leave it out of the road repair improvement project. Because this section of the road is a dead end servicing only 16 homes.

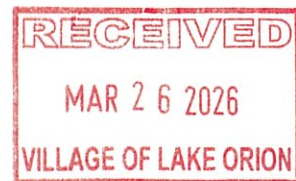

I am writing this note to communicate my strong opposition to any road repairs on North Shore Dr that would result in an assessment. The road on North Shore, specifically as it relates to the area in front of my house at 95 North Shore, does not need repairs. Replacement of this road section would be a waste of money and village resources.

If the village does make the incorrect decision to repair this road or any part of North Shore please provide information as to how the crowning of the road can be corrected. When the road was last "fixed" the grade of the road was changed resulting in water flowing into my neighbor's yard. Ms. Cura:

Thank you for contacting us with your important questions and concerns regarding the 2026 Street Improvement Program. Please know that the Village is currently seeking comment from property owners as to whether they believe their streets need repairs or replacement. We have not yet completed design plans or prepared detailed cost estimates or proposed special assessments. The costs estimates and proposed special assessments is a separate process with a separate hearing that will be held at a later date after notice to property owners.

What I can share with you at this time is that the intention of the Village is that only that portion of North Shore Drive that lies north of Hill Street would be deemed to be a dead-end street that would qualify for the lower 10% funding level from the Village. We intend to treat the remaining portions of North Shore as a through-street that qualifies for the 25% funding level by the Village. If that premise should change for any reason, we will explain our rationale during the special assessment public hearing process.

Thank you again for contacting us, and we look forward to receiving your comments as to whether you believe your street is in need of improvement.

Request for Clarification – North Shore Drive Pavement Assessment

I am writing as a resident of North Shore Drive regarding the proposed 2026 Pavement Improvement Project and the potential inclusion of additional streets.

After reviewing the information provided, I have some concerns and would appreciate clarification on several important points before any decisions are finalized.

Given that North Shore Drive includes a dead-end segment, it appears residents on our street may be responsible for a significantly higher portion of the cost, while the additional streets are not covered by the TEDF grant. Based on the estimates provided, this could result in a substantial financial burden to homeowners.

To better understand the impact, could you please provide the following:

- The estimated cost per household for North Shore Drive
- The total number of properties included in the Special Assessment District
- How costs will be calculated (frontage, street classification, etc.)
- The proposed payment terms, including timeline and any interest rates
- Whether residents have any opportunity to opt out of the additional street inclusion
- Clarification on what factors could cause the current estimates to increase

While we understand and appreciate the importance of maintaining and improving our roads, it is equally important that residents have full transparency and a clear understanding of the financial impact, especially when the majority of the cost is being assessed to homeowners.

I respectfully ask that detailed information be shared with affected residents prior to moving forward, and that careful consideration be given to the financial impact on those living on streets like North Shore Drive.

At this time without more information I am definitely not in favor of this.

WE ARE CURRENTLY PLANNING OUT IMPROVEMENTS**

ON THE EAST SIDE. HOWEVER, ONCE WE HAVE COMPLETED OUR UPDATED PAVEMENT ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN (PAMP) WITH NEW STREET CONDITION RATINGS IN THE NEXT FEW MONTHS, THE SCHEDULE MAY CHANGE. PLEASE FEEL FREE TO CONTACT ME PERIODICALLY FOR UPDATES.
