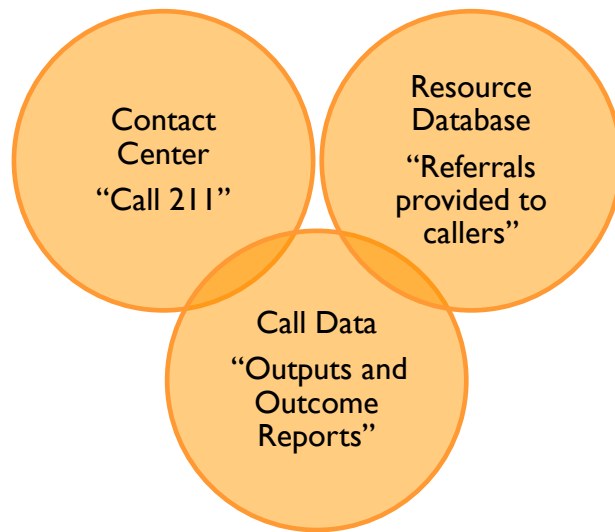

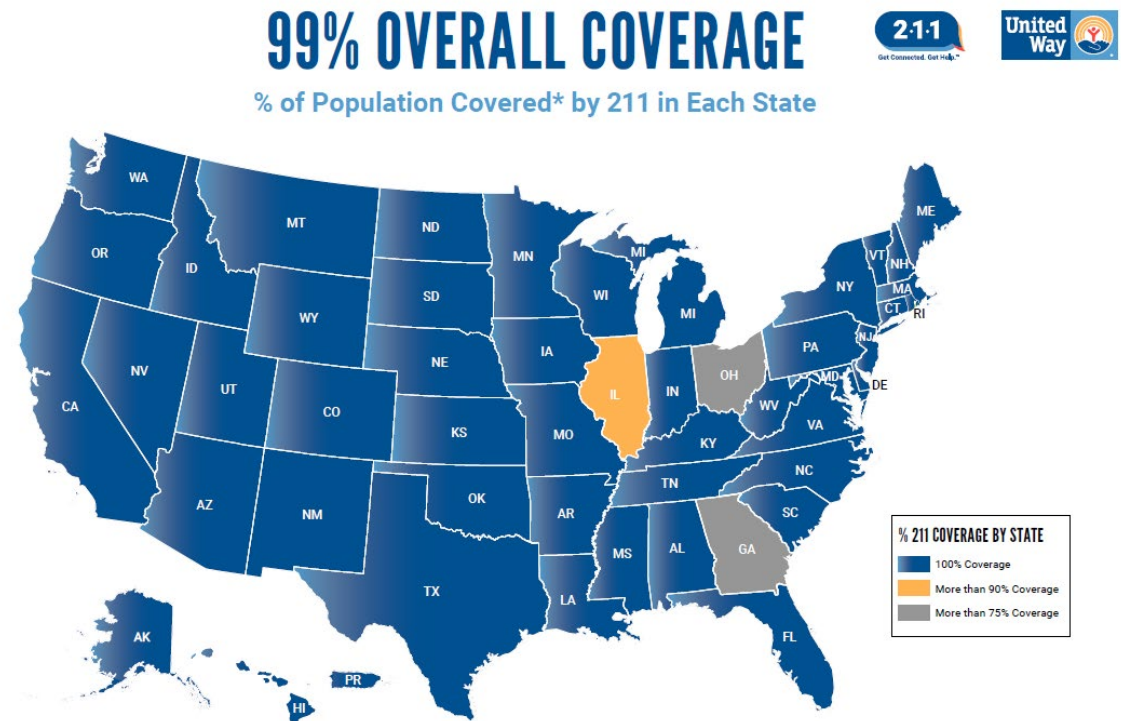
Disaster Recovery



- ✓ Wyoming 211 opened its doors in 2011 and started operating in seven Wyoming counties. It quickly expanded to 12 counties in 2012 and now serves all 23 Wyoming counties.
- ✓ Wyoming 211 is a comprehensive, statewide provider of information and referral for Wyomingites.
- ✓ Wyoming 211 is a centralized access point to community information and referral services to provide individuals with information they need to access health and human services.
- ✓ 211 is an easy to remember, free helpline for people looking for community services and resources, especially for those who need essential services, such as food, shelter, counseling, health insurance, employment assistance, and more.
- ✓ Resource Database – Nearly 3,000 resources statewide
- ✓ Wyoming 211 also provides information to communities to help them assess needs and gaps in services.
- ✓ Wyoming 211 is a partner in disaster recovery for information dissemination.

211 Nationwide Impact

- July 2000 FCC established 211 for the public to access community information
- 211 is available in all 52 states, as well as Canada and Puerto Rico.
- 211 reaches 99% of the US population.
- In the State of Wyoming, 100% of Wyoming residents have access to 211.

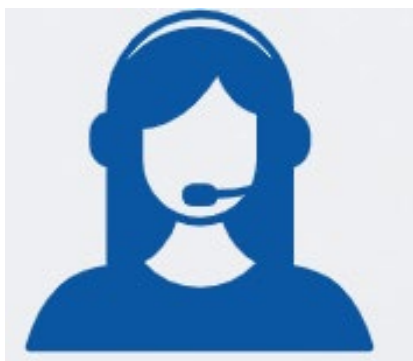


CARBON COUNTY WIC OFFICES - SARATOGA

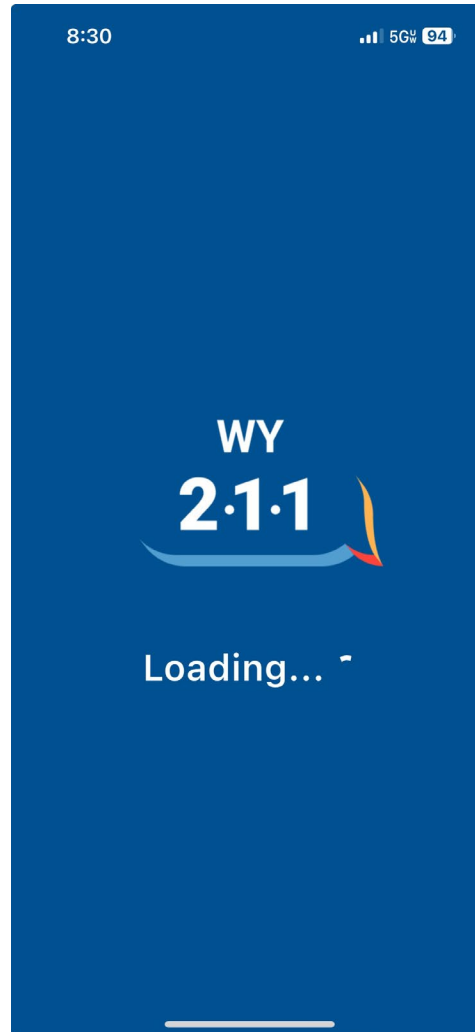

211 Call Data CAN BE USED TO ASSESS NEEDS AND FIND SOLUTIONS in communities.



211 tracks caller demographics, presenting needs, unmet needs and referrals made.

Data gathered provides information about gaps in services and duplication of services which is beneficial for health care leaders and community planners.

211 staff conduct follow-up surveys with interested callers to assess the caller's use and satisfaction of the referral agency along with the caller's satisfaction of 211 services.

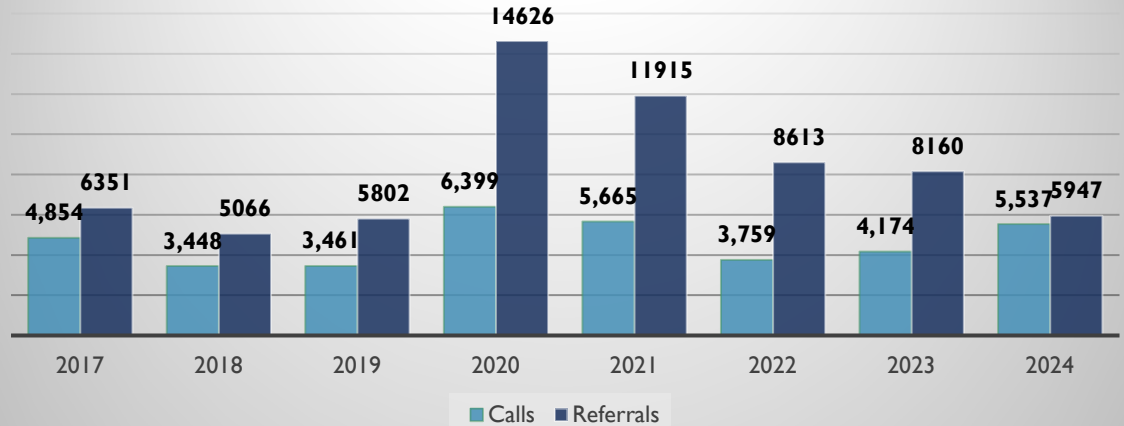

WYOMING 211 2022 STATEWIDE DATE

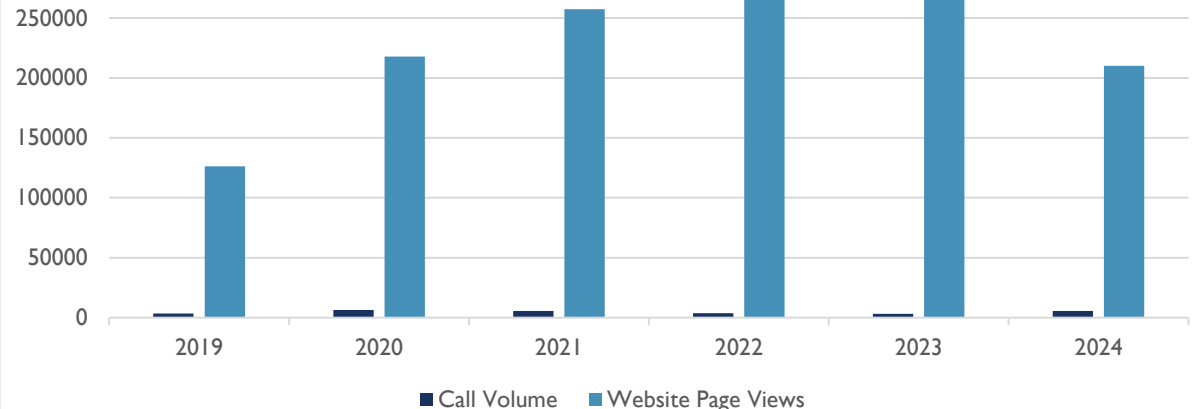
From January 2017 through December 2024, Wyoming 211 handled over 37,000 calls and provided nearly 66,000 referrals statewide.

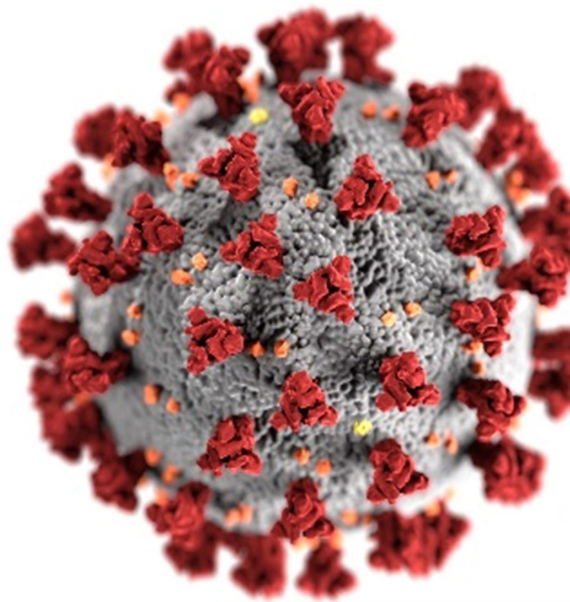

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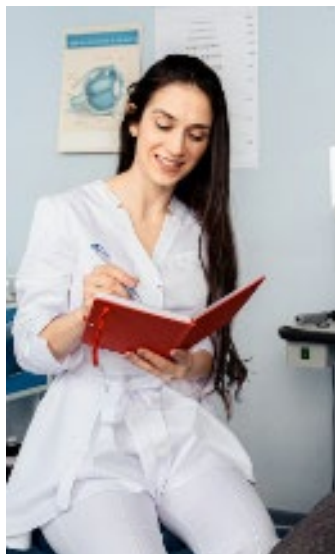

Transportation Access

What is Ride United?

Wyoming 211 has partnered with United Way Worldwide and Lyft to address pressing transportation needs to help people access services for specific and needed situations, such as essential medical services, complete education programs, get to job interviews, and more.

Ride United provides up to ten (10) free or discounted round trip rides per month via Lyft for eligible individuals who have transportation challenges.

Eligibility Requirements

Open to all residents age 18 years and older who are in need of transportation for one of the listed purposes where Lyft ride service is available.

Rides Can be Scheduled for:

- **Medical**
- **Employment**
- **Food**
- **Education**
- **Legal**
- **Housing**
- **Financial Services**

Limited rides may be available to assist clients in getting connected to needed services and should not be used for long distance and/or on- going transportation needs. The 211 Specialist will explore long- term transportation options for future needs, if needed.



Kinship Connections of Wyoming



Kinship Connections of Wyoming is free program is designed to help link grandparents, relatives, and other caregivers to a broad range of services and supports to help them meet the needs of the children in their care.

- Program has been in existence since November 2019 - Piloted program in Laramie and Natrona Counties, but accepted kinship families outside of those areas if they contacted us
- In 2021, Joined a cross-site collaboration partnering with Casey Family Program, Generations United and with other kinship programs across the country to further develop a kinship model that meets the clearinghouse requirements.
- In February 2022, Launched services statewide and began a program evaluation as required by the Title IV-E program.
 - Evaluation report will be submitted in less than 12 months to the Title IV-E Prevention Clearinghouse with the goal of qualifying as an evidence-based program through the Family First Act.
 - 5 Case Counties: Albany, Laramie, Natrona, Sheridan, Converse, and Sweetwater
 - Evaluation Team - University of Wyoming and University of Montana

Wyoming ADRC Aging and Disability Resource Center

Empowering older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers to successfully navigate their quality of life and independence with the tools and knowledge needed to choose the best path for themselves. Wyoming ADRC streamlines access to supports and services through a “No Wrong Door” system to ensure they receive the “right service at the right time.”

Wyoming 211 is working with the University of Wyoming and the Wyoming Center for Aging on the ADRC website and database. We will power the ADRC database with resources and will manage the upkeep of these resources.

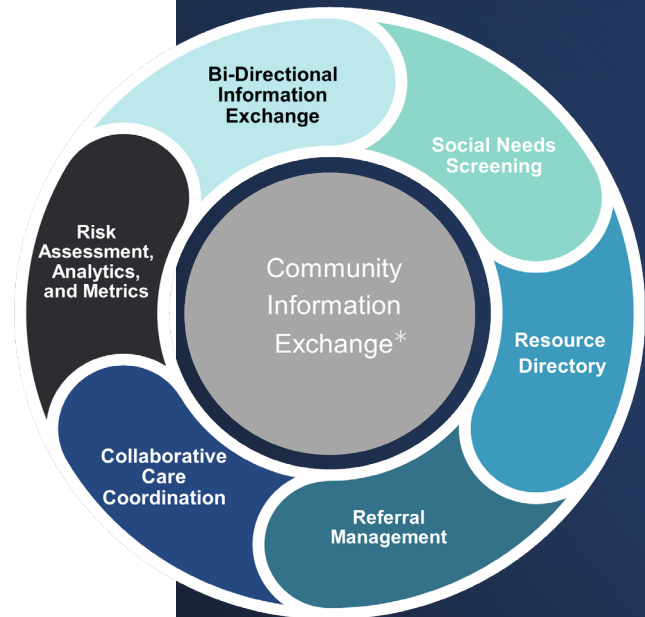


CommuniCare (CIE)

CommuniCare is a Community Information Exchange (CIE), a network of service providers who share information and coordinate care with each other from a centralized technology platform.

Partners can access a variety of tools that help them identify client needs, close the loop on referrals, communicate with others working with shared clients, and better identify available resources.

Result: Shared clients have more efficient access to the services, care, and support they need to improve their health, functioning, and quality of life.

- Child Abuse and Neglect - Helping parents and caregivers identify and access resources may help prevent the stress that sometimes precipitates child abuse and/or neglect. When parents and caregivers have their concrete needs met, they are more likely able to provide a safe and stable environment for their children, which is what we are all striving for.

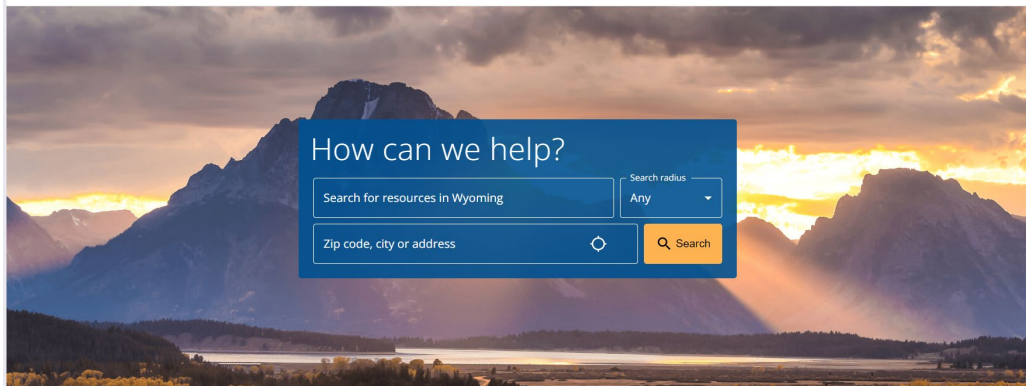

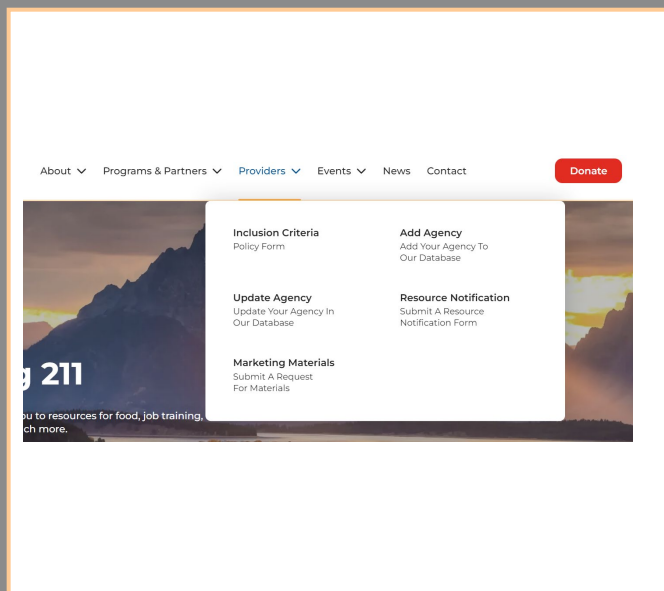
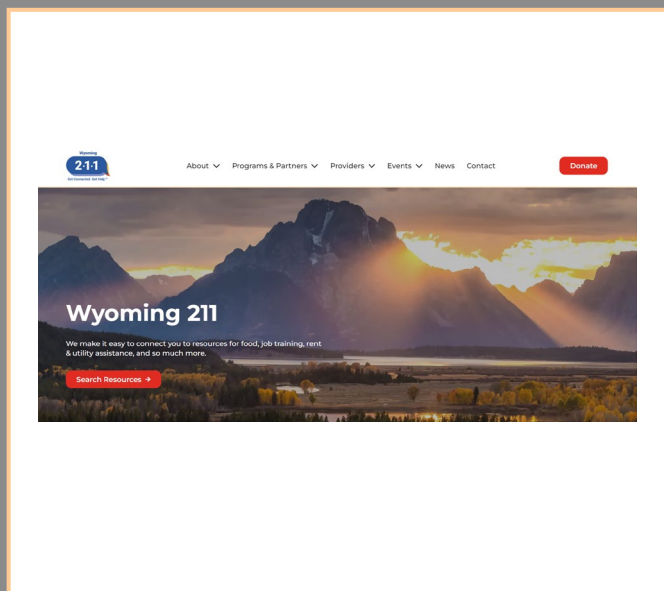
