#### Wastewater:

Construction of the McIntyre Sewer Project continues and is near completion. Performance testing is ongoing and there have been no failures to date. Final grading and temporary seeding are ongoing and will continue. Final permanent seeding will resume this fall. This project was paid for partially by a GO Bond, a \$1.3 Million grant from the State of Kansas, and Leavenworth County also contributed \$240,000 for design.

Contract documents for the Ida/Gamble Sewer Relocation Project were approved at the May 16<sup>th</sup> City Council Meeting. A kickoff meeting was held on May 24<sup>th</sup>. The project will relocate sewers near the intersection that are oversized for current flows to the new 7 Mile 36" interceptor. It is anticipated the project will be bid in conjunction with the Town Center Sewer Project this fall.

### **Public Works:**

Staff is working to receive bids to repair/replace a rusting stormwater pipe. The pipe is located along 4H Road, near the gas station. Staff is considering utilizing a pipe liner to avoid closures.


Nearly all work for the annual capital improvement plan has been completed. Some pavement markings and manhole surroundings may need to be completed. Staff is considering coding recent paving work to the ARPA fund to help ensure the fund is closed out prior to the end of 2024. Funds originally transferred from the General Fund could then be utilized for other items in 2025.

A resident recently utilized the City's sidewalk reimbursement program. As a reminder, the City will share a portion of the costs to replace dilapidated or damaged sidewalks. In this recent instance, we contributed \$1,420 to improve the sidewalks on Caraway Place. Please feel free to mention this program to residents as a way to improve sidewalks throughout town!

### **YTD Sales Tax Update:**

The year-to-date sales tax updates are below.

\*The 2024 year-to-date figure includes the new sales taxes all seven months, while at this point last year the new sales tax rate had only been collected for one month. When excluding the new sales tax, our local sales tax figures are down from 2023.

The total non-food sales tax rate in Lansing is broken down as follows:

6.5% State Sales Tax (varies on food)

1% Countywide Sales Tax

1% City General Sales Tax-General Fund

.45% DeSoto Road & Park Improvements (20 years)

.45% Aquatic Center (20 years)

9.4% TOTAL

1% Community Improvement Dist. (Mainstreet Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram property only)

The special sales tax to pay for the Aquatic Center has generated \$381,838 through the first seven months of the year. The special sales tax to pay for DeSoto Road and Bernard Park Improvements also generated \$381,838 (both special sales taxes are for the same amount, .45%). Both of these special sales taxes are on pace to generate \$654,579 this year, which pays off the debt for both projects.

## **Update on ARPA Funds:**

A summary of the total amount received from the federal government, and what we have spent the funds on is below. The ARPA funds need to be committed by 12-31-2024 and spent by 12-31-2026. Staff is considering utilizing ARPA funds for our recent asphalt paving throughout town, which could allow funds that were previously transferred from the General Fund to be utilized for other projects or potentially fire equipment in 2025.

- \$80,000 Sewer Improvements near First Terrace
- \$35,000 Economic Development Data (Buxton)

- \$503,037.03 ARPA Funds Remaining

### **Meetings & Announcements:**

There are multiple openings for Police Officer I/II. Interested candidates can apply by clicking on the "How Do I?" tab under the website homepage and clicking job opportunities. Starting pay is \$50,107/year, with opportunities for overtime. Officers with experience, education, or

certification can be started higher on the pay scale. Additionally, the City offers a \$1,500 signon bonus for new police officers! We are evaluating increasing the sign-on bonus.
