You are therefor required to remove the animal (Kaiser – German Shepherd Mix Canine) out of the city limits of Lansing, Kansas.

In order for you to come into compliance with city code, a deadline of October 10, 2023, has been granted. Failure to come into compliance by then may result in you being cited for code violations.

If you wish to appeal this decision before the governing body of the City of Lansing, you may do so by filing a written notice or statement of appeal with the Lansing City Clerk and paying the cost of any associated filing fees.

You must file your appeal within ten (10) days of receipt of this letter.

Re: animal permit

Dear City Council Members,

Our family dog, Kaiser, has been declared a dangerous animal, and we have been denied a permit to keep him. We acknowledge and accept responsibility for his actions; yet we feel that we have been treated unfairly by city representatives. Before dismissing our permit application out of hand, neither the police chief nor the animal control officer bothered to speak with us to learn the numerous measures that we have implemented to ensure that Kaiser is safe around people and animals.

We want to call to your attention to our having taken the following steps:

- Engaged the services of Karen DiCostanzo, Canine Consent (website: https://canineconsent.com/; phone 808-628-8414). Ms. DiCostanzo is a certified professional dog trainer specializing in rehabilitating aggressive dogs. I completed my first training session with her on September 10, 2023 and have the next session scheduled for September 27, 2023.
- In addition to our six-foot wooden privacy fence, we have installed a secondary restraint system in our backyard (i.e., a tie-out) so that Kaiser cannot reach the fence line or escape the backyard.
- We've also installed a keyed padlock on the fence gate
- Created airlocks (double barriers) at exterior doors to prevent Kaiser from escaping the house.
- Scheduled an appointment for this week with Dr. Jennifer Bruner at Lansing Veterinary Hospital to address Kaiser's anxiety. Our dog behavior consultant, Ms. DiCostanzo, is collaborating with Dr. Bruner to ensure the success of the behavior modification plan.
- Posted "beware of dog" signs on both the house and the gate
- Ordered a muzzle for Kaiser to wear when we are walking off-property. We have also started pre-muzzle training to ensure the muzzle training process is as efficient as possible.
- Ordered a no-pull harness to ensure that we can effectively control Kaiser on walks.
- Obtained an estimate to replace the fence adjacent to the neighbors who have expressed concerns with Kaiser. We will take this step if we are granted the permit to keep Kaiser.

The city code on dangerous animals reads as follows:

ARTICLE IV. - DANGEROUS ANIMALS: Sec. 2-402. - Exceptions; permit and registration requirements.

- 1. Each animal shall at all times be securely confined in one of the following manners:
 - a. Indoors, inside a residence or structure equipped with windows and doors that prevent the animal from exiting the structure on its own volition; **or**
 - b. Outdoors, in a securely enclosed and locked pen or kennel having: secure sides, which are either anchored to a secure floor or embedded at least two (2) feet into the ground; a secure top attached to the sides; and access controlled by a keyed or combination lock. Said structure must comply with all City building and zoning regulations and must be adequately lighted and ventilated and kept in a clean and sanitary condition; or
 - c. Outdoors, outside its kennel or pen but securely restrained with 1) a muzzling device sufficient to prevent the animal from biting persons or other animals, and 2) a leash no longer than four (4) feet in length. Said leash must at all times be under the physical control of a person and shall not be attached to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc.

Kaiser is kept inside our home, and he is allowed to go outside only when a family member is supervising him. When he is outside, he is not only inside a secure, fenced yard but is also walked on a four-feet leash or tethered away from the fence line. He will wear a muzzle, a no-pull harness, and a four-foot leash when he is being walked off-property. We will be meeting two of the three required restraint methods outlined in the city code, and I would like to point out that the code states "or" (not "and"), so by meeting two of the three requirements, we're demonstrating a good faith effort to restrain our dog to ensure the safety of others, both human and animal.

As you consider our permit appeal, please keep in mind the many steps we've implemented to ensure our beloved Kaiser's success. Our family is dedicated to Kaiser's behavior modification training and continuing to work with Ms. DiCostanzo to rehabilitate his behavior. Please give us a chance to prove our commitment to the safety of others.

Thank you for your consideration of our appeal.
