SUBJECT: 2026 Budget Review

Finance Director Beth Sanford will present an overview of the 2026 budget.

The city's estimated assessed valuation increased 5.4% from \$126,394,574 to \$133,247,450 (estimated). Assuming a flat mill levy, this would generate \$287,197 more to the City (the cost of the comprehensive plan is estimated up to \$250,000). The City's current mill levy is 41.909; the Revenue Neutral Rate would be 39.754. The City achieved the Revenue Neutral Rate in two consecutive years in 2023 and 2024. A summary of the property tax rate for Lansing's residents over the last several years is below.

Based on the current mill rate, a home appraised at \$300,000 would pay \$1,445.86 in City property taxes.
