**SEQR Status:** 

No responses in the EAF Part 2 identified any potentially moderate to large impacts. The responses to one question identified potentially small impacts. These responses pertained to the question regarding (15) Noise, Odor, and Light. The potential impacts were thoroughly described and assessed in the attached Environmental Assessment Form Part 2 and Part 3 Supplemental Information. The assessment has found that the Action will have very small, insignificant or temporary impacts on these resources as summarized below.

Impact on Noise, Odor or Light- The project has been designed using lighting with cut-off fixtures (i.e. dark sky compliant), which are designed to minimize the upward spillage of light. The project has also reduced the CCT of the LED to 3000k, to reduce the harmful effects of lighting. Further, this phase of the project is internal relative to the prior phases, and is not likely to result in light spillage off site.
