July 2026

07/01/2026

260005870-Property Damage Traffic Crash PDA

An officer was dispatched to the scene of a crash with no damage. Both vehicles involved were company vehicles and just wanted documentation of the incident.

07/02/2026

260005902-Neighborhood Trouble

Officers were dispatched to a neighbor trouble. The RP had complained about harassment against their neighbor. They stated the neighbor yelled at them and pushed their fence. There was video of the incident and the fence does not appear to be touched. Officers advised on civil issue with claims of where the property line lies. The incident was documented.

260005907-Neighborhood Trouble

Officers were dispatched to a neighbor trouble. Officers spoke to the RP who stated that exchanged words and threatened a neighbor. After this they claimed the neighbor punched them in the face. Both parties stated there has been ongoing issues over the property line. The other party claims contact was made to the face after a threat was issued by the RP. The opposing party stated it was a swipe not a punch. Both parties filled out witness statements and advised they'd like to press charges.

260005925-DWLS OPS License Suspended / Revoked

A LV officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation. The officer then initiated a traffic stop and discovered the driver to be driving with a suspended license. After further investigation the vehicle was not registered, nor did it have any insurance. The driver was placed under arrest and the vehicle was impounded. The officer issued the proper citations and released the driver without incident.

07/03/2026

260005956-Larceny

Officers were dispatched to a LV business on the reports of a larceny. The victim stated they left their phone on a table and after returning it was gone. Officers reviewed video footage of the incident and observed a suspect taking the phone. The description of the suspect was noted, and video footage was sent to the DB.

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260005963-DWLS OPS License Suspended / Revoked

An LV officer was dispatched to a traffic crash where the at fault driver was found to be driving with a suspended license. The officer then issued the driver the proper citation and released them on scene.

260005968-Retail Fraud Theft 1st Degree

Officers responded to a retail fraud that occurred in an LV business. The suspects had already left, and the employees noted their descriptions which are in the report. One suspect left the store shortly before the other suspect started grabbing merchandise. The employees stated the suspect fled out of the store with merchandise and got into the passenger seat of a dark colored sedan. The sedan's license plate was covered by a white shirt and the driver was the suspect seen entering with the passenger. The employees also stated they had camera footage they would later provide to LVPD.

260005969-Animal Bite/Scratch

Officers were dispatched to an LV resident for the reports of a dog bite. The officer noted that RP let their dog out unleashed, and it ran into the street coming into contact with two neighbor dogs that were leashed. The other two dogs were leashed and being walked by their owner in the street. The two dogs bit the RP's dog who ran out into the street. The owner separated the dogs, and the report was sent to Oakland County Animal Control.

07/04/2026

260006004- Fleeing or Eluding Police

A LV officer was patrolling neighborhoods and observed a vehicle go through a 4-way stop at excess speeds. When the officer turned around to catch up the vehicle, it accelerated heavily and the officer later lost sight of it. The plate is unknown, but a good description of the vehicle and plate type were noted in the report. The vehicle was located days later, by the same officer. He was identified and the case was sent to the OCPO for review.

260006009-Lost Dog

An officer took a report at the station for a citizen reporting their lost dog. They let their dog out at night and they never came back. The officer searched the area for the dog and came up with negative results.

07/07/2026

260006126-Traffic Arrest Warrant-Other Jurisdiction

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An LV officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle committing a traffic violation. The officer initiated a traffic stop, and the driver came back with multiple traffic warrants, one being out of Southfield. The officer placed the driver under arrest. Southfield PD later arrived on scene transporting the arrestee to jail. The vehicle was impounded and the driver received the proper citation. The officer did confiscate a container of pepper spray located in the vehicle.

260006132-Assist Other Law Enforcement Agency

Officers were on patrol when they discovered a vehicle that was coming back stolen in LEIN. The officer then initiated a traffic stop and spoke to the driver who worked for a rental company. The driver stated the vehicle was repossessed from the renting customer that same day. The customer's information was added to the report along with all the names on the property left in the vehicle. The property found in the vehicle was taken for safekeeping with the driver's consent. The jurisdiction was advised and took the vehicle out of LEIN as stolen.

07/08/2026

260006180-Accident-Fail to Stop and Identify

Officers responded to a hit and run traffic crash. Upon arriving, they were able to gather the license plate information of the vehicle that fled the scene from the reporting party. Officers then were able to track down the driver through the rental company the vehicle belonged to. Upon finally being able to contact the at fault driver who fled; officers got the driver to admit to leaving the crash. The report was sent to the OCPO for review for failing to stop and identify and operating a vehicle with a suspended license. A warrant was issued.

260006182-DWLS OPS License Suspended/Revoked

An officer was on patrol when they observed a traffic violation. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and spoke to the driver. The vehicle had an expired plate, and the driver came back with a suspended license. The vehicle was legally parked and not impounded as the driver was parked at her sister's apartment complex at this point. The driver was issued the proper citations and released on scene.

07/09/2026

260006228-Possess Counterfeited-Any Object

Officers were on patrol when they discovered a vehicle with an improper plate attached. Officers stopped the vehicle and spoke to the individual in the driver's seat who stated they had just switched drivers. Officers observed several newer

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looking bags of jewelry in the vehicle. Officers asked all occupants to step out of the vehicle. All occupants consented to a search. Officers inventoried the vehicle and later discovered the high value items to be fake as the suspect stated that they were. The party claiming responsibility for the vehicle was issued a citation for an improper plate. The occupants were all released on scene pending OCPO review. The vehicle was impounded as well. The LVPD Detective followed up on the counterfeit jewelry, and a 3-count warrant was issued.

07/10/2026

260006254-Suspicious Circumstances

An officer took a report at the station where the reporting party wanted to document a misuse of her benefits at a restaurant she frequents. The reporting party knew who was misusing her benefits, claiming to be her "husband". The employees also knew her well and confirmed her suspicion as he had come in multiple times. The reporting party stated this man was never her "husband" and that she wanted him to stop using the benefits of her paid rewards program. The officer later called the male to give them a heads up and to stop using the rewards (if he was) and he became very confrontational over the phone and the call was ended.

07/12/2026

260006314-Reckless Driving Complaint

An officer took a report at the station of a reckless driving complaint. The reporting party had a coffee thrown at her vehicle after the reckless driver turned the incident into a road rage. The reporting party gave details of the reckless vehicle, and it was documented in the report as well as plate information. The officer took pictures of the coffee residue on the reporting party's vehicle and documented the incident.

07/14/2026

260006406-Telephone Used for Harassment, Threats

An officer took a harassment report at a local business. The business was going through a civil matter with a past customer over a previous service the customer had done. After dealing with the legal end for over a year, the business was getting multiple calls a day from the previous customer stating they would not stop calling until they got what they wanted. The incident was documented and listed under harassment.

260006434-DWLS OPS License Suspended / Revoked

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An officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation. The officer stopped the vehicle and discovered the driver to be operating the vehicle with a suspended license. The vehicle was impounded, and the driver was released on scene without incident. The driver was issued the proper citations.

07/15/2026

260006466-Assault/ Battery/Simple (Incl Domestic and Police Officer

An officer responded to a traffic crash. Where one party complained of an assault when holding onto the other party's ID. Both drivers' statements were added to the report. The detective reviewed the case, and the report was sent up to OCPO for review.

260006471-Fleeing or Eluding Police

Officers had just gotten done with a traffic stop, when an officer noticed an employee of a nearby business running after a vehicle. The officer turned their vehicle around and went to investigate, observing a broken window on the vehicle as well. The officer observed the vehicle leaving the scene and attempted to stop it whilst activating their emergency lights. The vehicle began to accelerate and flee away from the officer. The officer noticed the plate on the vehicle as the fleeing vehicle turned. After pursuing the vehicle on a few side streets, the vehicle took a turn too fast and crashed into the garden of someone's front yard. The driver was ordered out of the vehicle to which he complied. Officers noticed him still holding a tip jar labeled for the business he just fled from. Officers noticed a large abundance of dollar bills and coins in the vehicle, also located in other tip jars. Officers were able to link this to other tip jar larcenies in nearby areas. The suspect was arrested, arraigned, and released with a PR bond.

07/16/2026

260006507-Mental Health Call

Officers responded to a mental health call. Dispatch advised officers that the individual had cut themselves and were bleeding. Officers responded to the residence and spoke to the individual's sister who had witnessed the individual inflicting cuts to their wrist. The individual was transported to the hospital by Southfield life and an officer followed to fill out the petition. Care was taken over by hospital staff.

07/17/2026

260006529- Damage to Property

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Officers were dispatched to a residence for a destroyed mailbox. The RP stated this was the second time someone in a white vehicle struck their mailbox in recent months.

260006530- Identity Theft

An officer responded to a residence on the reports of fraudulent charges on their account. The victim had just gotten back from a camping trip and noticed 6 transactions made that were not done by her. The RP wished to proceed with prosecution. The DB is investigating further.

260006562-Cocaine-Possession

An officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation. Both the driver and passenger were identified after the officer conducted a traffic stop. The officer noticed the driver was very nervous and even offered the officer to search his car multiple times. As the officer was conducting LEIN/SOS checks, the other unit on scene advised the officer they observed the passenger attempting to conceal a bottle of nitrous oxide behind his leg. The officer then conducted a consent search of the vehicle and located a tied baggie with the contents of suspected cocaine. The passenger was properly mirandized and admitted he was the owner of the cocaine located under the passenger seat. Both parties were released on scene pending lab results and review by OCPO.

07/18/2026

260006586-Fleeing or Eluding Police

An officer was on patrol running radar when he observed a vehicle go well over the posted speed limit. The vehicle proceeded to increase speeds as the officer attempted to catch up to it. The vehicle proceeded to go around multiple vehicles using the left turn lane. Once the officer was caught up, he activated his emergency lights and sirens attempting to stop the vehicle. Once the officer was able to identify the plate on the vehicle, he terminated his pursuit of it. The officer called the owner of the vehicle later who stated her son had been driving. The officer spoke to the son who admitted fleeing. He also said he didn't know why he did it but was upset about being fired that day at his job. The case was reviewed by DB and sent to the OCPO, who issued a warrant.

07/19/2026

260006595-Liquor-Transport (Open Container).

An officer was dispatched to an intersection in the LV neighborhood for a slumped subject at the wheel of their vehicle. Upon arrival, the officer observed the vehicle

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running with the driver's door still wide open. He observed a male in the driver's seat passed out, breathing and not responding to the officer. There was also visible damage to the front of the vehicle. The officer was finally able to get the driver to wake up and step out of the car. The driver was stumbling on his way out of the vehicle. The officer observed open intoxicants in the vehicle. The officer had enough suspicion that the driver was intoxicated, he read the driver his chemical test rights, and he agreed to a blood test. Medical transported the driver to the hospital. The case was submitted for a warrant request by the DB.

260006602-DWLS OPS License Suspended

An officer was on patrol when they observed a vehicle speeding on their radar. The officer caught up to the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The officer discovered the driver was operating with a suspended license. The driver was issued the proper citations and released on scene.

07/20/2026

260006645-Found Property

Officers were notified of ammunition that was turned over by a citizen. Officers collected it and set it for destruction.

07/21/2026

260006695-Customer Trouble

An officer was dispatched to a local business on a customer trouble that had occurred approximately 30 minutes prior to arrival. When the officer arrived, the employee stated that she had a customer pay for a milkshake but not for her other order. The employee had the plate of the vehicle the customer had left in. The employee stated she wanted no report, or charges pressed. She wanted officers to contact the customer and ask her to pay. Officers attempted to contact the customer through multiple numbers with negative results.

07/22/2026

260006751-Found Property

An officer was notified of a bracelet found in the parking lot of the station. The bracelet was entered as found property and placed into an evidence locker.

260006752-Disorderly Conduct

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A report was created for disorderly conduct due to an ongoing issue at the city council meetings. The report is well documented with multiple LV reports regarding the same suspect and two different victims. Most recently a statement was added to this report where the victim perceived a warning of a future threat by the suspect. The case was investigated by the DB and sent to the OCPO. OCPO denied the charges.

260006768-Suspicious Persons

An officer took a report at the station from the owner of a local business. A business reported 3 instances of a suspicious person pulling into the parking lot early in the morning and waiting there for several minutes. The owner finally asked what he was doing and the individual became confrontational. The report was taken and officers were notified for extra patrol in the area.

07/24/2026

260006811-Assist Other Law Enforcement Agency

An officer was on patrol and heard of a retail fraud (\$1000+) that had occurred in Troy. Later, the officer observed a vehicle matching the description that went out and initiated a traffic stop on it. After making the approach and seeing multiple large boxes of expensive Lego sets in the vehicle and in the suspects hands, officers placed the 3 individuals in the vehicle under arrest and advised Troy PD. Troy PD later made the scene and took 2 individuals into custody and took over the scene from there. The other party was let go and transported home by an LV officer.

07/25/2026

260006846-Suspicious Circumstances

A resident came in to make a report for fraud. The resident received a suspicious phone call from someone posing as an AT&T employee. She was told to pay \$10 and then advised that \$2000 had accidentally been put onto her credit card. She was told to get gift cards to correct the mistake. She became suspicious at this point and discovered \$1000 being transferred from her checking account to her credit card. The resident ended up stopping any transactions linked to her account before she could be defrauded of any money. The resident suffered no loss.

260006850-Felony Arrest Warrant-Other Jurisdiction

An officer conducted a traffic stop after discovering a vehicle's registered owner coming back with a valid felony warrant out of Warren. The officer positively identified the driver and placed him under arrest. The vehicle was searched and later TOT the passenger. Warren agreed to meet the officer and transport the arrestee from there.

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07/27/2026

260006887-Traffic Complaint/Abandoned Auto

An officer was dispatched to an LV business for a parking complaint. The officer spoke with the owner who wanted a boat gone from his parking lot. The boat was left overnight, and the driver had taken off. With the plate information, the officer attempted to contact an owner with negative results. The officer then advised the owner to call quality towing to impound the boat.

260006906-Neighborhood Trouble

Officers took a report at the station for a neighborhood complaint. The reporting party had video footage of different kids on bikes riding down the side of her house as a cut rough. This happened multiple days during the afternoon. The officer attached the video to the report and attempted to follow up at a house nearby with no answer.

07/28/2026

260006909-Family Trouble

Officers responded to a family trouble, dispatch advised there was an argument and that one female stated she was going to grab a gun. Officers arrived on scene and spoke to the parties inside the home. The recollection of all parties was very similar, and they indicated it was verbal. When asked if anything physical happened, the parties stated someone was held back by their shirt to prevent any physical altercation from occurring. Officers advised everyone of possible domestic violence charges as the problem party had left prior to officers' arrival.

260006959-Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol / Liquor OWI

An officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle make an improper turn out of a parking lot onto Southfield Rd. The officer noticed the vehicle lights were not on and he was weaving in and out of his lane. Due to the traffic violation and erratic driving patterns, the officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. After continuing to travel after the officer initiated his lights, the driver eventually stopped and immediately got out of the vehicle. The driver seemed confused and had bloodshot eyes. The officer instructed the driver to take a seat in the vehicle after taking his keys and placing them on the roof of his vehicle. The officer suspected the driver to be operating under the influence of alcohol. The officer then initiated SFST's to which the driver did not pass. The driver was given a PBT and blew over the legal limit. The driver was then placed under arrest and transported to jail.

07/30/2026

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260007005-DWLS

An officer was on patrol when he observed a traffic violation. The officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered the driver to be operating with a suspended license. The officer issued the driver the proper citations and released the driver on scene. The driver had a licensed driver arrive to take the vehicle.

260007019-Suspicious Persons

An officer was on patrol when he observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation. Upon speaking to the driver, the officer noted they were very nervous and wearing all black. The officer also noted there was a high-powered handheld monocular and black tactical glove on the passenger seat. The Officer searched the vehicle. Located in the glovebox was a large black double-edged dagger in a leather sheath. A subsequent investigation found that the man was stalking a woman in a neighboring jurisdiction. LVPD Officers contacted the victim and put her in touch with that police department.

260007020-Family Trouble

Officers took a report of family trouble. The RP's daughter has a long history of mental health problems. The family has a court order commitment paper for their daughter. They were able to pinpoint the daughter's location to a mental health facility in Mt. Clemons. Officers advised the family on the next steps and documented the information given.

07/31/2026

260007043-DWLS

An officer was on patrol when he observed a traffic violation. The officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered the driver to be operating with a suspended license. The officer issued the driver the proper citations and later released the driver on scene. The vehicle was searched with consent and nothing of significance was found.

260007045-Violation of Preliminary Injunctive Order (Peace Bond)

Officers observed a vehicle leaving a residence. Officers have knowledge of the vehicle leaving, belonging to an individual that would be violating his bond conditions by being at the residence. The DB has previously advised officers to arrest the individual if found to be violating his bond conditions. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and confirmed the identity of the driver. The protected party of the bond conditions was sitting in the passenger seat. The officer placed the driver under arrest and released the vehicle to the passenger.
