

## **City of Lathrup Village Police Department - Monthly Summary**

January 2026

1/2/2026

- 26-51 – Civil Matter

An officer was called to an LV business due to the RP having an odd encounter with a tow truck driver. The driver required her to sit in the driver's seat of her vehicle which was on the flat bed of the tow truck while it was towed to the LV business. He also required her to back up the vehicle off the flat bed. She wanted the encounter documented.

- 26-58 – Suspicious

Officers made a traffic stop and upon speaking with the driver, had reasonable suspicion that items in the vehicle had been obtained by fraudulent means. At the time, there was no probable cause for arrest. He was issued a citation for the stop and further investigation will follow.

1/4/2026 –

- 26-112 – Civil Matter

A customer of an LV business came to report that she paid for a service but the business was unable to complete the service. She stated they would not refund her money.

1/5/2026 –

- 26-147 – Suspicious –

A resident reported seeing someone get out of the passenger seat of a vehicle on a residential road and pull on the handle of the resident's vehicle. The vehicle was locked, the person got back in the first car and they drove off. A handprint was left but due to weather conditions, the print could not be collected.

1/8/0226 –

- 26-236 – Embezzlement

Officers were called to a LV business in reference to an employee taking cash. The employee admitted to taking the money and was arrested and booked for same. The employee was released pending arraignment. At this time, no follow up is noted.

- 26-241, 26-242, 26-243, 26-244 – Fraud

Officers were called to an LV bank in reference to fraudulent checks that were deposited. The bank would like to press charges. At this time, no follow up is noted.

- 26-251 – DWLS

Officers made a traffic stop and discovered the driver/registered owner was suspended. The driver also had a valid warrant out of a nearby jurisdiction. The driver was issued the appropriate citation and turned over to the warrant jurisdiction. The vehicle was impounded.

#### 26-252 – Larceny

A resident claimed their passport had been stolen by their spouse. The two have had ongoing marital issues recently. At this time, no follow up is noted.

1/9/2026 –

- 26-288 – Domestic –

A argument occurred between a couple which resulted in one of them being pushed by the other while a young child was being held. At the request of the victim, a shotgun and a lockbox which contains a pistol was taken for safekeeping. After speaking with the victim, the firearms were returned at a later date.

- 26-290 – Civil Matter

A resident came into the station with a court order stating his wife was not allowed to leave the state with their shared child. The mother and child's whereabouts were not known at the time he came into the station. The court order was left in plain view outside of the residence.

1/10/2026 –

- 26-335 – Family Trouble

A couple with ongoing marital issues called officers to their home. One claimed to have been punched while the other claimed theft of property. A court order was served to one half of the couple.

1/12/2026

- 26-360 – Domestic

An alleged assault happened between and mother and daughter. At this time no follow up is noted.

- 26-362 – Assist motorist

Officers assisted a citizen getting back into his locked vehicle.

1/16/2026 –

- 26-516 – Suspicious

An LV business terminated an employee who stole low-cost items. The business did not wish to pursue charges for the stolen items but wanted the terminated employee trespassing if he returns.

1/17/2026 –

- 26-545 – Domestic

Officers responded to a domestic situation in which one party received a minor injury from the other party. That individual was arrested by officers but the OCPO denied charges.

- 26-553 – Assist FD/Obstruct Police

Officers responded to a house fire in progress. They assessed the scene and turned it over to FD on their arrival. While FD was checking the home, a resident of the home attempted to go inside. He was told several times by officers that he could not go in. The individual got aggressive physically and verbally and officers took him into custody for obstructing and resisting. The individual was later released to his parents and told the report would be sent to OCPO for charges. The small fire was put out by FD and officers were told that the home had to be aired out due to the smoke but could now be accessed by the residents. The detective Sgt. sent the case to OCPO for review.

1/18/2026 –

- 26-573 – Felony arrest warrant

An officer made a traffic stop and discovered the driver/registered owner had a felony warrant out of a nearby jurisdiction. She was given a citation for the traffic infraction and turned over to the nearby department. The vehicle was impounded.

- 26-574 – Natural Death

A resident was found deceased in her home by a family member. FD was called and had a doctor declare time of death. Officers called OCME's office who released the deceased to family.

1/19/2026 –

- 26-585 – Damage to Property

This report was generated to document the damage to county property, which was the crosswalk signs and signal on Southfield Rd near Margate

- 26-597 – Found property

An individual dropped off found pill bottles. The officer logged them as property for destruction.

- 26-604 – Civil Matter

A Lathrup resident came in to report that her ex had not dropped their children off at the appropriate, custody agreed upon, date and time. The resident wished to have the failure to drop off their children documented.

1/20/2026 –

- 26-637 – Fraud

A resident came in to report fraudulent activity on his cashapp. When the fraudulent activity occurred, he had been incarcerated and stated he had locked his account and cards at the time. At this time, no follow up has been documented.

1/21/2026 –

- 26-667 – Mail tampering

A Lathrup resident reported that certain items of mail have gone missing recently. He knows this because he is emailed each day a listed of what mail should be arriving. The first item that did not arrive was a check that was able to be cancelled and reissued. The second was a gift card. At this time, no follow up has been documented.

1/22/2026 –

- 26-713 – Fraud

Officers were called to an LV bank in reference to fraudulent checks that were deposited. The bank would like to press charges. At this time, no follow up is noted.

1/23/2026 –

- 26-755 – Civil

Officers responded to an unknown issue. On arrival, officers spoke with the individuals involved and it was discovered there was an issue regarding parenting

time between a couple who is in the beginning of the divorce process. They were told to follow up with the courts.

1/24/2026 –

- 26-768 – Civil/Assist other agency

Oakland Co court officers request PD presence while executing a court order for seizure of property. The homeowner did not agree with the order but eventually stopped blocking the property and allowed court officers to seize same.

- 26-769 – Aggravated Assault

Officers were called to a nearby hospital in reference to a stabbing that occurred in Lathrup Village. The sergeant was able to identify the suspect and victim in the incident. This is an ongoing investigation that will be presented to the OCPO.

1/26/26 –

- 26-822 – Animal put to sleep

Officers responded to a home of an injured deer. The officers assessed and decided it was best to put the deer down.

1/27/2026 –

- 26-846 – Assist other Law Enforcement Agency

Report from an out of state jurisdiction that their fraud suspect resides in Lathrup Village.

- 26-847 – Assist other Law Enforcement Agency

Report from Oakland County Sheriffs Office about possible crime that occurred in Lathrup.

- 26-860 – Trespass warning

Officers were called to a civil matter and were requested to trespass an individual from the premises. The officers informed the individual of same and she was given a ride back to city hall to wait for a ride.

- 26-862 – Harassment

A Lathrup resident and children were receiving harassing messages from an ex-spouse/parent. At the time, no crime was committed and officers informed them on the PPO process.

- 26-864 – Obstruct Police

Officers ran a vehicle plate that returned as a felony vehicle. The vehicle was stopped and the driver, who was the registered owner, attempted to misrepresent who they were by giving an ID that was not theirs. The R/O also was suspended and had a warrant out of a nearby jurisdiction, which advised and released. The driver was issued a citation for DWLS and misrep/obstruct. The vehicle was impounded as it was a felony wanted vehicle.

1/28/2026 –

- 26-884 – Suspicious

On 2 separate days, workers from an LV business came to make reports about each other regarding their relationship. One claimed an assault happened while the other stated they have had several verbal-only disputes.

- 26-886 – Threats

Following 26-860, the trespassed individual sent messages to the R/P stating they would “shoot up” the R/P’s vehicle. The officers informed the R/P of the PPO process.

1/29/2026 –

- 26-917 – CPS follow up

Officers followed up on a CPS complaint received. It was discovered to be unfounded. Case closed.

- 26-918 – Fraud

A resident came into LVPD to report that she noticed an unauthorized amount was being withdrawn from her account each month. The case was turned over to the DB.

1/30/2026 –

- 26-950 – Suspicious

A citizen driving through Lathrup reported that a passenger in a vehicle next to hers shot at her car. She did not see it happen and did not see a gun. There were no bullet holes in the vehicle and no other evidence to suggest this occurred. At the same time this woman called about this incident, a traffic crash occurred in the same area. She later did report seeing a gun but was unable to describe it.

- 26-953 – Larceny

Victim met with suspect to sell his old cellphone to the suspect. They met at a random intersection in Lathrup Village. The suspect took off with the phone without

paying for it. The victim did not know his name but did give a description of the suspect.

- 26-954 – Mental Health Call

Officers were called to an LV home in reference to a suicidal person. After assessing the situation it was determined the individual needed a mental health evaluation at the hospital. They were transported and turned over to hospital staff.

1/31/2026 –

- 26-966 – Property Damage

A citizen came into the station and reported that there was damage made to a sign in the median of Southfield and Margate. The officer put temporary traffic cones out to alert other drivers of the damage.

- 26-967 – Peace officer

Officers stood by while a resident collected items from his home to move out.
