# FY27 LAC budget

- The FY27 LAC budget is designed to support operational stabilization.
    - Facility support
    - Programming
    - Staffing
    - Contracted services
    - FY28 business planning
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# From facility use to active operations

- The FY27 budget reflects a shift from simply maintaining the LAC as a facility to operating it as a programmed arts and events venue.
  - This requires stronger support in:
    - Programming
    - Patron services
    - Technical operations
    - Event execution
    - Financial controls
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# FY27 LAC Custodial Services

- The custodial services contract and service levels were recently updated.
  - The updated model includes on-site cleaning staff during full-campus and large-scale events.
    - **Purpose:**
      - Improve cleanliness
      - Support larger events
      - Improve guest experience
      - Reduce strain on event staff
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# FY27 LAC Programming Budget Overview

- The proposed programming plan supports:
    - Community engagement
    - Audience development
    - More consistent facility activation
    - A stronger arts and culture presence downtown
    - Consistent coordination with City Outdoor Events
    - Additional event support via part-time staff
    - Additional Resident Anchors
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# FY27 LAC Programming Elements

- FY27 programming includes:
    - America 250 programming in August
    - Two season anchor events
    - Comedy Series
    - Jazz Club Series
    - Live at the LAC Series
    - Grand Lobby pre-show openers
    - Art workshops
    - Gallery curation

# FY27 LAC Comedy Series

- The Comedy Series includes:
    - Four Saturday performances
    - Four headliner comedians
    - Four opening acts
  - **Budget Purpose:**
    - Create a focused, recurring entertainment series that can build audience awareness and repeat attendance.
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# FY27 LAC Jazz Club Series

- The Jazz Club Series includes:
    - Four weeks of programming
    - Friday and Saturday performances
    - Four artists or bands
    - Cabaret Theatre transformed into a lounge experience
  - **Budget Purpose:**
    - Provide a concentrated performance series with a defined identity and marketable schedule.
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# FY27 LAC Live at the LAC Series

- The Live at the LAC Series includes approximately 10 engagements.
  - Grand Lobby pre-show openers would be paired with selected Live at the LAC events.
  - **Budget Purpose:**
    - Create a fuller patron experience and provide additional opportunities for local or supporting artists.
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## FY27 LAC Arts Education and Gallery Programming

- The FY27 budget also supports:
  - Art educators for curated workshops
  - Gallery curators for visual arts programming
- **Budget Purpose:**
  - Expand the LAC beyond performances and support broader arts engagement.



# FY27 LAC Staffing Overview

- FY27 staffing investments are intended to support a more reliable operating model.
    - Key staffing areas include:
      - Technical operations
      - Event support
      - Patron services
      - Box office
      - Concessions
      - Front-of-house operations
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## FY27 LAC Ticketing and Patron Services Technology

- The City is evaluating ticketing software options for future implementation.
    - **Purpose:**
      - Improve ticket purchasing
      - Support event reporting
      - Improve box office operations
      - Strengthen financial controls
      - Support patron data management
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# FY27 LAC FY28 Budget Connection

- The business plan will help address:
    - Financial sustainability
    - Community access
    - Programming priorities
    - Partnership structure
    - Revenue opportunities
    - Cost recovery expectations
  - **FY27 is the bridge year.**
  - **FY28 should be built around a clearer business model.**
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# FY27 LAC Highlights

- The FY27 LAC budget supports:
    - More consistent programming
    - Stronger event support
    - Improved patron services
    - Better technical operations
    - Evaluation of outsourced services
    - Development of the FY28 business plan

      - Host Site & Lunch
  - Community Workshops
    - 4 youth-oriented workshops

    - Together for Wellness – Movie partnership with GUIDE
    - Viewpoint Health – Co-Responder Program

    - Temporary Housing Vouchers

  - Funding ends with grant period (Sept 2026)
  - Excluding Legacy Leaders and Lawrenceville Response Center partnership with Impact 46 for FY27
- ReCAST Advisory Board
  - Recommend transition to other boards throughout the city
- DiverCITY Committee
  - Continue staff training through HR

# FIRST Center

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# FIRST Center Program Launch

- **Official Opening**
    - The FIRST Center officially opened on **March 4, 2026** with enrollment of the first participant.
  - **Early Facility Issue**
    - Sewer Lateral was repaired on **March 5, 2026**, resulting in a two-day closure.
  - **Message**
    - The program is operational, with an early facility issue addressed shortly after opening.
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# FIRST Center Participant Status

- **Current Enrollment**
    - To date, the program has served **three participants**.
  - **Active Participants**
    - Two participants remain actively enrolled.
  - **Early Outcome Success**
    - Both active participants have attained employment since enrolling.
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# FIRST Center Participant Support Services

- Active participants are currently receiving coordinated support, including:
    - Case management
    - Clinical services
    - Community partner services
    - Weekly food boxes and related assistance
  - The program is providing wraparound support, not just temporary placement.
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# FIRST Center Program Development

- **Current Focus**
    - The FIRST Center team is working on additional program offerings for current participants.
  - **Purpose**
    - These additions are intended to strengthen participant stability, engagement, and long-term outcomes.
  - **Message**
    - The program is still in early ramp-up, but the operating model is expanding.
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## FIRST Center IEC Use for Enrichment Activities

- Participants will begin using the **Impact Enrichment Center (IEC) at 10 Water Works Road** for enrichment activities.
    - Planned uses include:
      - Computer lab access
      - Job searches
      - Résumé building
      - Social service applications
      - Program graduations
      - Participant celebrations
  - The IEC adds practical support space for participant development and milestone recognition.
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## FIRST Center Site Improvements

- The City of Lawrenceville will support continued site improvements.
    - Planned improvements include:
      - Construction of a two-dumpster enclosure
      - Parking lot repaving
  - These improvements support site functionality, appearance, and long-term operational use.
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## FIRST Center Data and Reporting Improvements

- The FIRST Center and LPD teams are working on data improvements.
  - **Focus Area**
    - Improved reporting of LPD calls for service.
  - **Timeline**
    - Data system rollout is expected in **May 2026**.
  - Better data will help evaluate program impact, public safety activity, and operational outcomes.
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## FIRST Center Grant Funding Opportunity

- The City of Lawrenceville and Impact46 applied for a **BJA grant**.
  - **Grant Purpose**
    - The grant would provide three years of funding.
  - **Program Impact**
    - Funding would support the current FIRST Center program and add services.
  - The grant could help extend program capacity without relying solely on City funding.
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## FIRST Center Current City Funding Support

- The City currently supports the FIRST Center through two funding commitments.

\$160,000	FY26	Personnel and operations
\$128,300	September 2025 to September 2026	Case manager, security system, and program evaluator
