	 Maximum Number – One hen (no roosters) shall be permitted per two one thousand square feet of lot or parcel area, up to a maximum of six twelve hens. 				
	3. Containment – Chickens shall either be in an enclosure of fenced area. Chicken enclosures shall not be located in any area between the dwelling and the front property line.				
	4.	Enclosures – An enclosure shall no neighboring dwelling and shall be kep good repair.			
B.	keeping of chickens in excess of the requirements in A. above; or, The keeping of animals, bees or other fowl (not including chickens) shall be allowed through a formal permitting processed established by the City, provide there is no objection by a person residing within one hundred feet of the premises where the animals, bees or fowl are to be kept.
