### Groundbreaking Clean Energy for Local Homes

Coffin Butte powers more than 4,000 homes each year with renewable electricity—captured from landfill gas and converted on-site. As one of the region's largest contributors to clean energy, it reduces fossil fuel dependence and helps Oregon meet its climate goals.



### **Avoid Higher Costs for Families & Services**

Expanding Coffin Butte helps Benton County keep control of how we manage waste—locally, responsibly, and affordably. Planning ahead means lower costs for families, schools, hospitals, and small businesses, and fewer environmental impacts from long-distance hauling.

Expansion ensures we can keep waste management local—protecting community oversight, reducing emissions from long-distance hauling, and ensuring stable, predictable service for Benton County residents and customers.
