Date: June 30, 2026

- For June 2026, the Patrol Division had approximately 1,460 calls for service, made 98 arrests, conducted 300 traffic stops, issued 80 traffic citations, and wrote 133 case reports.
- We received 23 applications for our current Communication Specialist position. Of the total, six (6) have advanced to the interview phase, which will take place on July 1st.
- We interviewed four (4) individuals for the Police Officer position. Of the four, one applicant has received a conditional offer contingent on passing the required next steps.
- I am pleased to announce the applicant for Records Clerk II has successfully passed all phases of background screening and will begin her career with our agency on July 13th, 2026.
- Community Policing Officer Johnson remains busy as usual. Dala successfully hosted Cast with a Cop for 19 youth from foster families and conducted driver education for five individuals who were referred by courts for using their cell phones while driving. She assisted two houseless individuals by helping one get placed into housing, and the other (who we had 17 contacts with over the last month) into Lebanon Community Hospital, where they are awaiting placement.
- The Detectives Division continues to stay busy with complex cases. This month, they were assigned two (2) new cases and made four (4) arrests. They closed out two (2) cases. Detectives conducted focused patrols targeting problematic houses and arrested individuals with outstanding warrants. Detectives reviewed a total of twenty-two (22) Department of Human Services (DHS) referrals for possible child abuse.
- This month, two (2) use-of-force incidents were reported. (1) Officers responded to assist Linn County Sheriff's Office at Lebanon Community Hospital for a male subject who was combative and intoxicated. Upon arrival, Linn County Deputies were on the ground with the male, who was bloody from a facial injury that occurred during a fight prior to having contact with Linn County Sheriff's Office. Officers assisted LCSO with placing the male onto a gurney. The intoxicated male then struck one of the deputies with his cuffed hands. Officers assisted in restraining the subject and then placed him in a WRAP restraint. Lebanon doctors then chemically restrained the male, who was later transported to Good Samaritan Hospital due to the injuries he sustained prior to law

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enforcement contact. There were no injuries reported. (2) Officers responded to a domestic incident involving an intoxicated female. While the officer was contacting the female, she reached out, grabbed the officer, and took an aggressive posture, as if she was going to fight. The officer pushed the female, and she fell to the ground, where she was taken into custody without further incident; she was later transported to Linn County Jail. There were no injuries reported.

- We had a vehicle pursuit that occurred this month. An officer attempted to stop a motorcycle matching the description of one that eluded the Sweet Home Police Department. The officer attempted to stop the motorcycle as it entered the McDonald's parking lot; the motorcycle failed to yield, and the officer pursued. The pursuit was ultimately terminated near Waterloo. Linn County Sheriff's Office later located the motorcyclist, who was taken into custody without further incident.

All use-of-force incidents and pursuits undergo thorough review by a Sergeant, a Lieutenant, the Police Captain, and the Chief. After review, all incidents were found to be justified and in full compliance with department policy standards.
