- **SUBJECT:** Presentation, Discussion, and Possible Action to Approve a Resolution Accepting a Bid and Authorizing the City Manager to Enter into a Contract with Cleanview Resources, in the Amount of \$1.48 per Linear Foot of Sewer Main, Not to Exceed \$250,000, for the 2023 Sewer Main CCTV and Cleaning Project.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this item is to consider approval of a Resolution awarding a bid and authorizing the City Manager to enter into a contract with Cleanview Resources in the amount of \$1.48 per linear foot, not to exceed \$250,000, for the 2023 Sewer CCTV and Cleaning Project.

The project involves conducting a comprehensive closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspection of the City's sewer main network. The work also includes jetting and cleaning of the pipes to remove any blockages or debris prior to the CCTV. A detailed report and video will be provided with the location and conditions of the sewer mains. The City has a total of 237,282 linear feet (45 miles) of sanitary sewer mains within the system. The City budgeted \$250,000 to complete this work, and will determine the amount of CCTV of the sewer mains based on the price per linear foot. Based on the price per linear foot submitted by Cleanview Resources, approximately 168,919 linear feet (31 miles) of sewer mains can be included in the scope of work.
