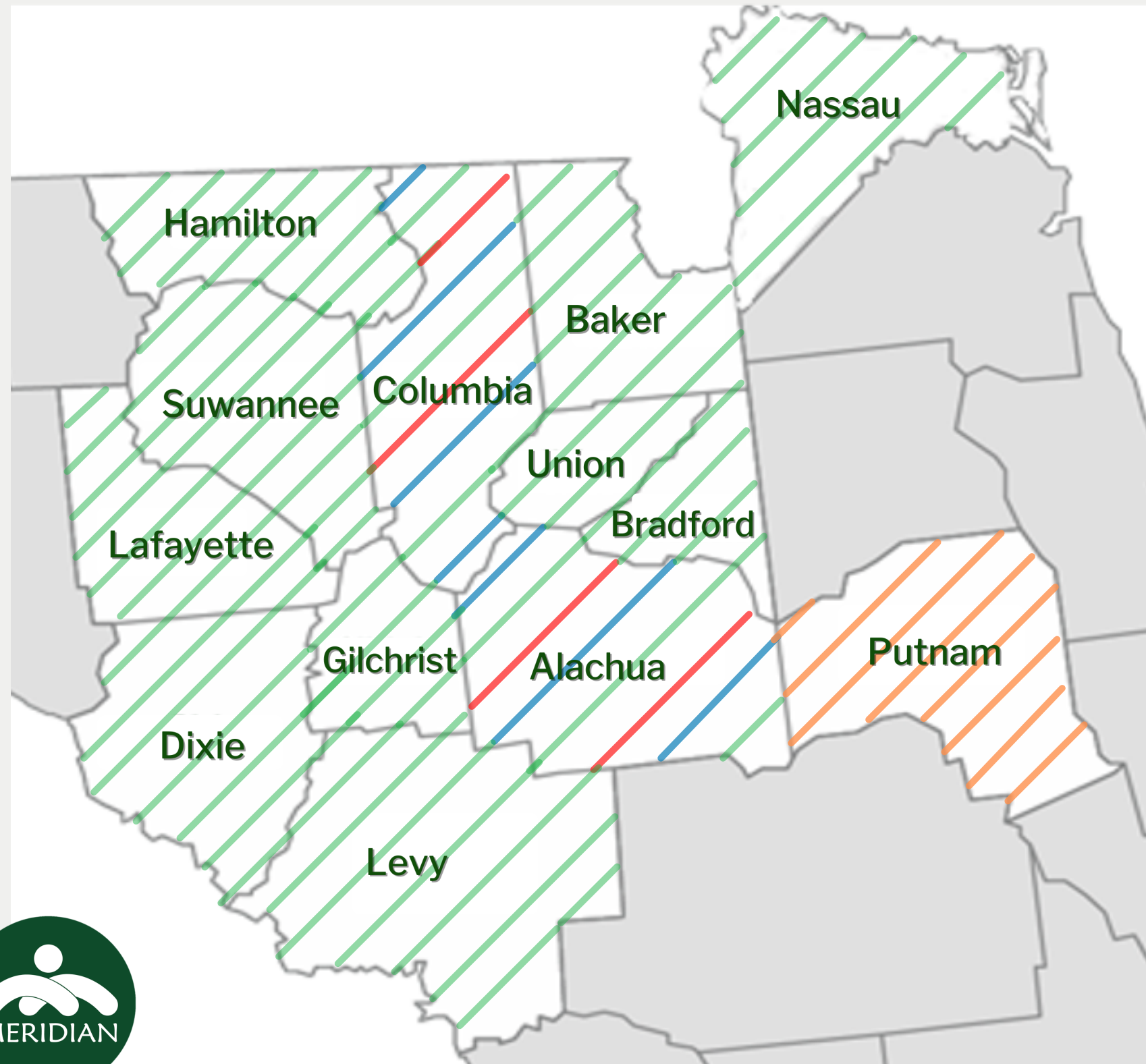

- Clients with no device may qualify for a Meridian provided tablet with data plan at no cost

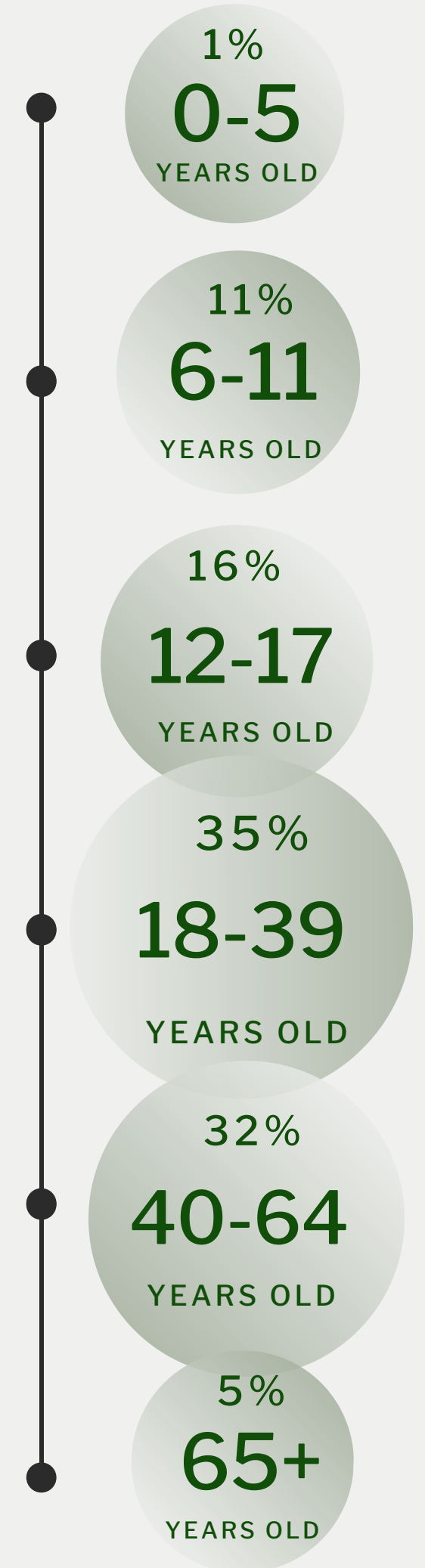
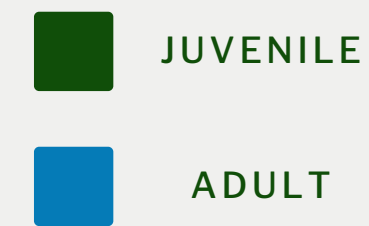
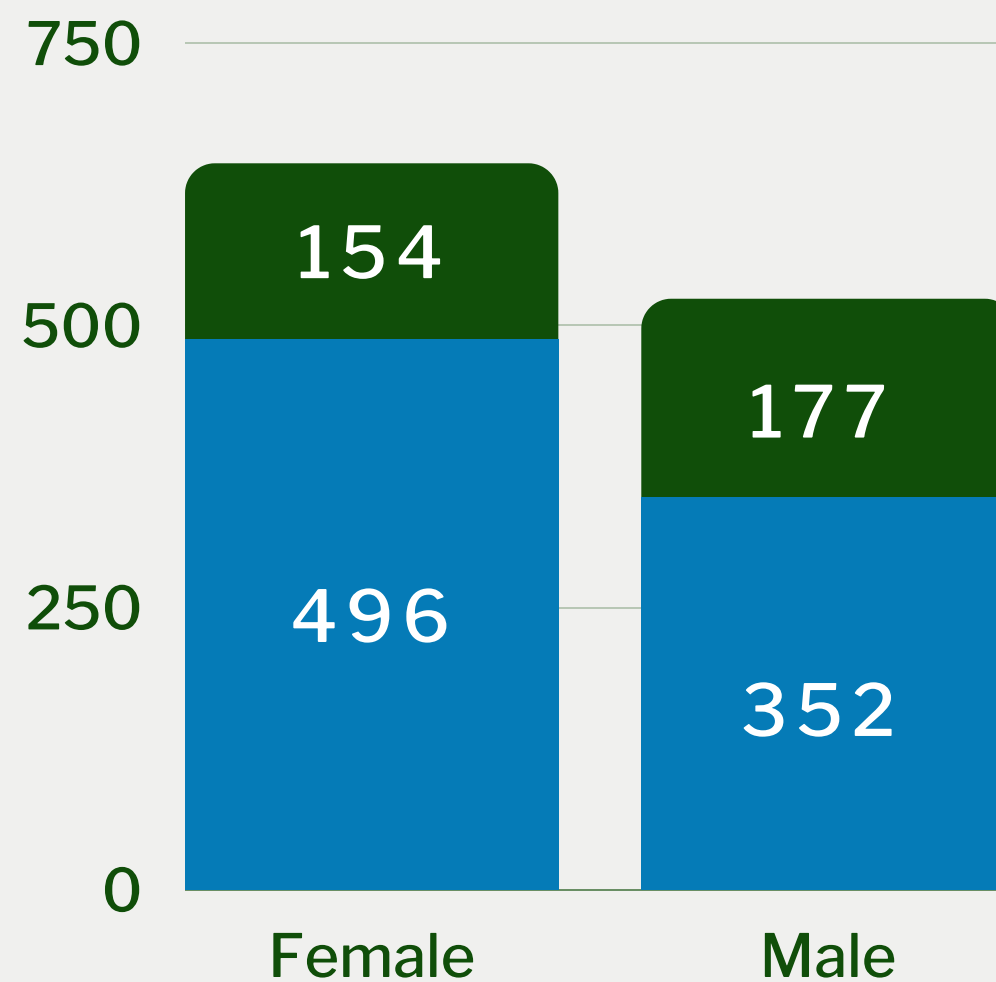
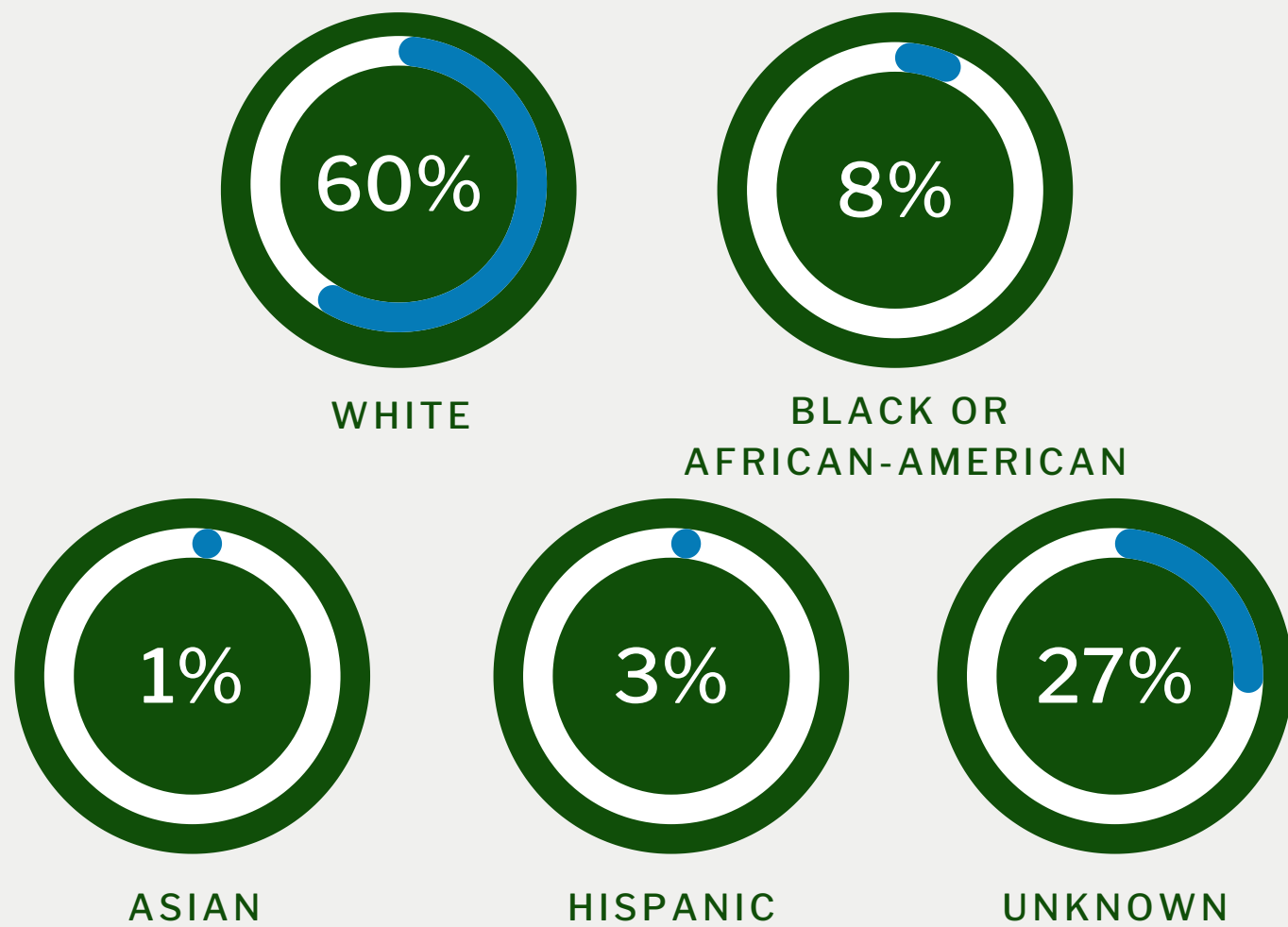

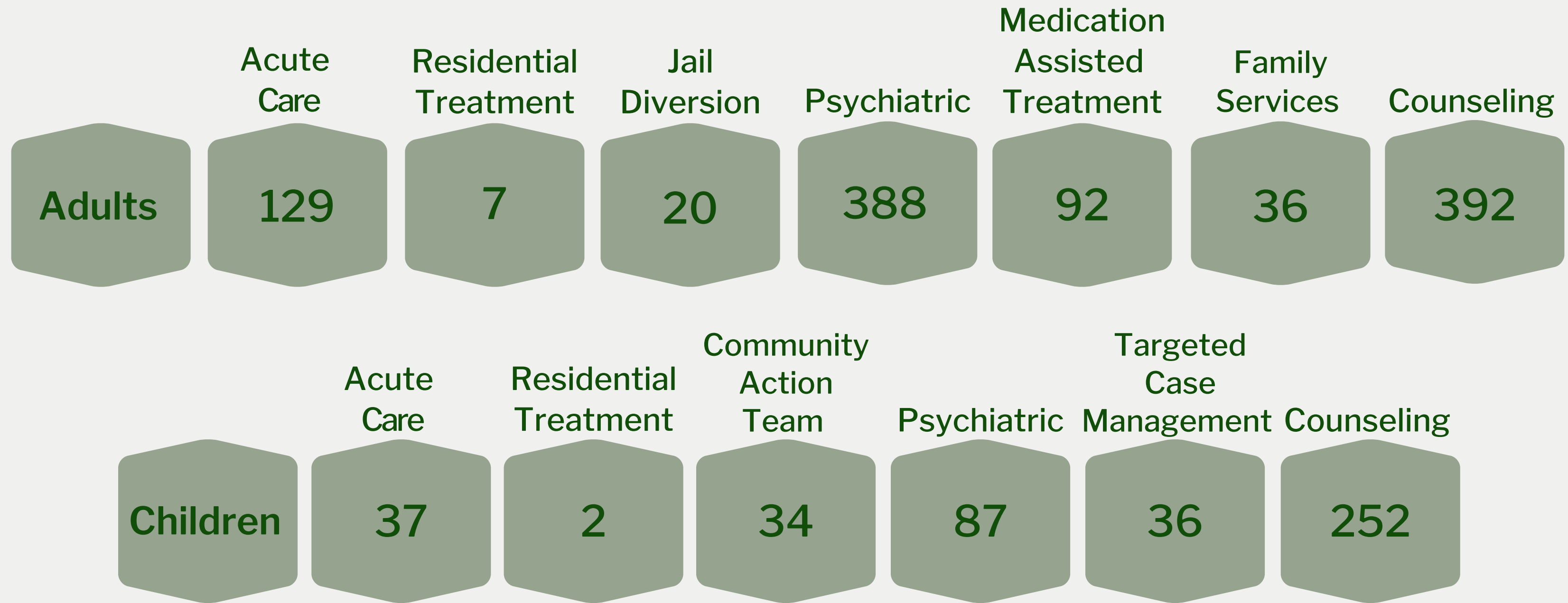
Offices in 11 counties

Payers

Meridian accepts a wide range of payers, ensuring that local, public funds are the payer of last resort

Poverty

The majority of those we see (86% for Levy County) are at or below federal poverty guidelines: and 0% of those seen were ineligible for any subsidy to address the cost of their care

Indigent Care

Indigent Care is funded through the Medicaid, state DCF and local matching funds.

- 35% of the services provided thus far in FYE2021 (July 1, 2020-March 31, 2021) have been paid for with indigent care funding from the state and county
- 53.4% have been covered by Medicaid
- 20.6% have some form of insurance, but that insurance only covers 5.7% of the services these individuals need and receive

We are requesting a 2.1% increase, to account for increased demand for services in the County including the addition of Mobile Response Teams (MRT) and Community Action Teams (CAT), and to move closer to the total match required, bringing the County contract with Meridan to \$86,836

Funding Requirement

Meridian is required to generate local matching funds for some of our state and federal funds. Our expected FYE2022 local match requirement is \$2,858,392

Population

Levy County's population represents 7.8% of the population of our core service area, and is allocated a proportionate share of that match, or \$218,288

- Services in the County generate close to \$46,910 inpatient fees and insurance, all of which is used to offset match
- The County in 2020 provided \$85,050 in local matching funds
- Currently, the match generated from the BOCC contract and local fees is \$131,960 - still short of the total required match
