• Debbie Claridge and Suzander Burton (Yankeetown)

- Raised concerns about lack of animal control services in Yankeetown, including no local shelter and issues with stray animals.
- Inquired about potential grants to address animal control issues.
- o Madam Chair Mills requested contact information be left with Mary Ellen for follow-up.

• Dale McClellan (Gulf Hammock Fishing Club)

- Announced an open house for a rebuilt lodge, replacing one lost in a 2023 fire.
- Event details: Saturday, noon start, fish tournament, barbecue (RSVP requested), entertainment by Mark Johnson.
- o Flyers distributed, public invited.

• Diane Marchand (Williston)

- o Addressed a letter received regarding alleged harassment of county employees.
- Requested clarification and evidence of accusations, denied claims of inappropriate actions.
- Expressed support for animal shelter improvements but raised concerns about unmet workshop goals from November 2024, including ordinance updates and facility renovations.
- Highlighted issues with stray animals and shelter capacity. Concerned that residents are
 putting their own animals in danger because they are being asked to hold on to the stray
 animals because the county shelter space is full.

**County Manager Harper introduced Animal Services Manager, Brandy Cannon. Mrs Cannon provided an introduction of Dr Yacavone, DVM, PhD as the new Veterinarian for Levy County Animal Services (Audio 18:45)

2. To receive a presentation on the Third Quarter Fiscal Year Quarterly Report for April 1 – June 30, 2025 from the Development Services Division. (Audio 19:10)

- **Presenter:** Bo Cox, Director
- Discussion:
 - Dave Banton, Code Enforcement: Provided update of what has occurred in the previous quarter.
 - Planning department update will be provided next quarter due to vacancy and outsourcing of this county function.

- O Bo Cox, Development Director: Provided update of what has occurred in previous quarter as it pertains to permits processed. This year is expected to be the greatest amount of site built homes since the previous busiest year in 2020. Praised staff in his office for stepping up in a short staffed situation to cross train and learn new functions. Renovations of office space should be completed.

(Audio 35:20)
 - Presenters: Mary-Ellen Harper, County Manager
 - **Discussion:** Background: Equipment from prior building occupancy, not used by the county due to ventilation issues. Sheriff's Office to benefit from cost savings; church to use for community events.
 - Terry Witt (Bronson) addressed board to clarify if unoccupied space where equipment would be moved from is being expanded into the main room for more added usable meeting space. Madam Chair Mills clarified the county has no interest in having a cafeteria and the reason they are transferring items to the Sheriff's office.

 - Replacement of University Oaks Water System Mains
 - Open an additional landfill cell.
 - o Installation of a Generator for the Levy Country Government Center.
 - o Request State of Florida to expand the allowable uses for SHIP Funding
 - Funding of a fully staffed ambulance to include salaries, benefits, operating costs and replacement of that unit.
 - Tim Parsons, Liberty Partners: supported the list and made note of budget constraints and project readiness stating the more attractive projects are the ones that will be completed and not just started.
 - Consensus was given to finalize the plan at the next meeting.

- **Discussion:** The grant will provide funds to purchase a new 12-passenger transit van for the transportation of inmates to assist with the recycling program separating recycling materials and cleaning up debris around the Landfill.

To direct staff to prepare a resolution to amend the rates for garbage generated from a dwelling unit to one trailer load up to a 5' x 10' per household per day to be accepted at no charge, and for any additional trailer loads or larger trailers to be charged at an additional rate of \$70 per ton. • Discussion: In the two months since implementation of Resolution 2025-38, Landfill Staff have received considerable feedback from residents that the daily limit is too restrictive. Many households dispose of their solid waste only once or twice per month, which makes compliance with the daily bag/container limit challenging. Residents have expressed concern that the existing limits do not account for reasonable variations in household waste disposal practices. Discussion on enforcement challenges, ID checks, and trailer size definitions. Concerns raised about potential

abuse and need for specific language. Comm. Kennedy motioned to remove the trailer size for simplicity and to keep the line moving at the scale house.

ADOPT RESOLUTION NUMBER 2025-64 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEVY COUNTY, FLORIDA, DECLARING CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS PARCEL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER 0109756500 AS SURPLUS AND DIRECTING COMPETITIVE DISPOSITION OF THAT SURPLUS PROPERTY IN ACCORDANCE WITH COUNTY CODE; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO COUNTY STAFF; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Audio 1:09)

- **Discussion:** At its meeting on September 16, 2025, the Board directed the preparation of this Resolution to surplus real property. If the Board approves this Resolution, County staff will conduct the disposition in accordance with Sec. 2-305(b) of County Code, which states: "the administrator shall send written notice of the available surplus property to all adjacent property owners by certified mail. If, within three weeks after mailing such notice: (1) Only one adjacent property owner responds with interest in purchasing the property, then the county manager or designee may negotiate and is authorized to execute a contract with that property owner; or (2) Two or more adjacent property owners respond with interest in purchasing the property, then the administrator shall request and accept sealed bids for the parcel from those property owners. The county manager is authorized to execute a contract with the highest bidder or may reject all bids; or (3) No response is received from any adjacent property owner, then the county may retain the property or may dispose of it by another method. Any sale of an undevelopable/unusable property to an adjacent property owner must be conditioned upon recording of a declaration of unity of title (as described in section 50-776) at closing to ensure the undevelopable/unusable surplus parcel is eliminated by unification with the adjacent parcel.
