Department Highlights

- The BoCC held its annual Flag Day Ceremony on Friday, June 13, 2025, in recognition of the Nation's flag and the values that it represents. The ceremony included a program of guest speakers and student essay winners and was attended by almost 100 people.
- Ryan Asmus from North Florida Professional Services is now our contract County Engineer.
 Ryan is managing a multitude of projects and working with many of our departments to help with storm damages, FEMA and insurance reimbursements, facility design and improvements, infrastructure projects including roads and the rock mine, and a variety of other projects. Ryan has proven to be a tremendous asset to Levy County and has already helped the county to save thousands of dollars in just the few short months he has served in this capacity.
- Tisha Whitehurst has been selected as Levy County's new Division Director of Economic Development and Tourism. She is already actively engaged in a number of economic development projects and has been met with very positive reactions by prospective developers as well as other economic development partners. The Tourism Manager Position has been posted to fill the position that was vacated by Tisha.



- Jessie Durrance has submitted a letter of retirement. Jessie has served the county faithfully for 41 years. His last day in the office will be October 31st and his last day with the county will be January 5, 2026. The Road and Bridge Division Director position has been posted to fill the position that will be vacated by Jessie. The goal is to have someone in place on or before October 1, 2025 to allow for a month of transition.
- The process of updating the Fire, EMS, Solid Waste and Road Assessments has been completed. This was the first time that staff from each of those departments was directly involved in the process. The work was a heavy lift this time but the process should be more streamlined going forward.
- Florida Rural Water Association has completed rate studies of both the Manatee and University Oaks Water Systems. This process was labor-intensive because the county had not conducted these evaluations in many years. These evaluations should be conducted annually and will become more efficient in the future.
- Phase II of the Take Home Vehicle Evaluation has been completed. The remaining departments to be evaluated are the Landfill and Road Department.
- The performance evaluation policy has been updated. All new employees now receive evaluations after three and six months of employment. All employees who have finished probation are evaluated on or before July 1 of every year. All current employees were evaluated on or before July 1, 2025 unless specific extensions were granted by Human Resources.
- The progressive discipline policy has been updated to reduce the number of steps from six to three. Under the new system, after an employee is warned about an infraction they
 (1) receive a written reprimand, (2) receive an unpaid suspension and then (3) may be terminated.

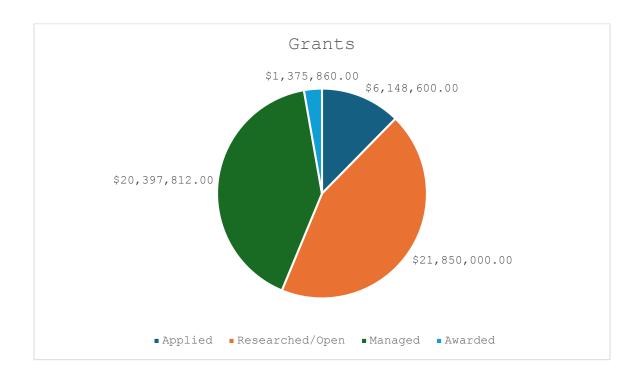
