1. Requesting the Levy County Board of County Commissioners receive a presentation from the Suwannee River Water Management District about updates to the Floodplain Maps. (Audio 10:17)

- **Presenter:** Leroy Marshall, Suwannee River Water Mgmt Requested By Comm. Charlie Kennedy
- **Discussion:** This is the second of three additional opportunities for public input that the BoCC requested SRWMD to hold in Bronson. Leroy Marshall was present and gave a breakdown to the public of how the flood map process works and who is responsible at each step. Suwannee River Water Mgmt is an agency that is compiling public comments to submit to FEMA regarding flood mapping in Bronson. He and his assistant also made themselves available after the presentation in the Government Center hallway.
 - o Public Comments:
 - Elizabeth Phillips (Bronson) made a plea to the public to comment and make sure they are heard.
 - Emily Casey (Gulf Hammock) relayed to BoCC that maps have changed and Wekiva and Black Prong are not noted on maps correctly.
 - Donna Robinson (Bronson) wants to know how she can make a difference. How likely is it that the comments collected will be addressed individually.

- 2. Requesting the Levy County Board of County Commissioners to provide direction to staff on updating Levy County's current Animal Control Ordinance, codified in Chapter 14, Article II. (Audio 54:20)
 - **Presenters:** Brandy Cannon, Animal Services Manager & Adam Leath, Jacksonville Humane Society
 - **Discussion:** Updating this ordinance is essential to improve public safety, protect animal welfare, and to provide clear direction on the roles and responsibility of both Animal Services and the Levy County Sheriff's Office. Following direction from the Board as to the specific priorities, I will work with staff to begin the process of updating the ordinance. A workshop will be held in the future for the public and subject matter experts can attend and fine tune the ordinance.

- Adam Leath, Jacksonville Humane Society- \$213,000 grant funding has been provided by the Jacksonville Humane Society. The goal is to keep pets with their pet owners.
- Melissa Baker (Williston)- concerned about animal control officers not going on calls without Sheriff's Deputies with them. Also, Levy County needs more animal control officers and kennel techs so more enforcement can take place.
- Diane Marchand (Williston)- wants ordinances to be tougher and completed.
- Theresa Ridinger (Williston)- Williston Animal Group representative. Complimentary of changes made by Brandi Cannon and county and works weekly with county animal services. Need more resources and training to make animals lives better and improve property values. Need a veterinarian for Levy Animal Services to really improve things and that requires more resources.
- Jonathan Westwood (Chiefland)- concerned about regulations being implemented with no data or studies being conducted.
