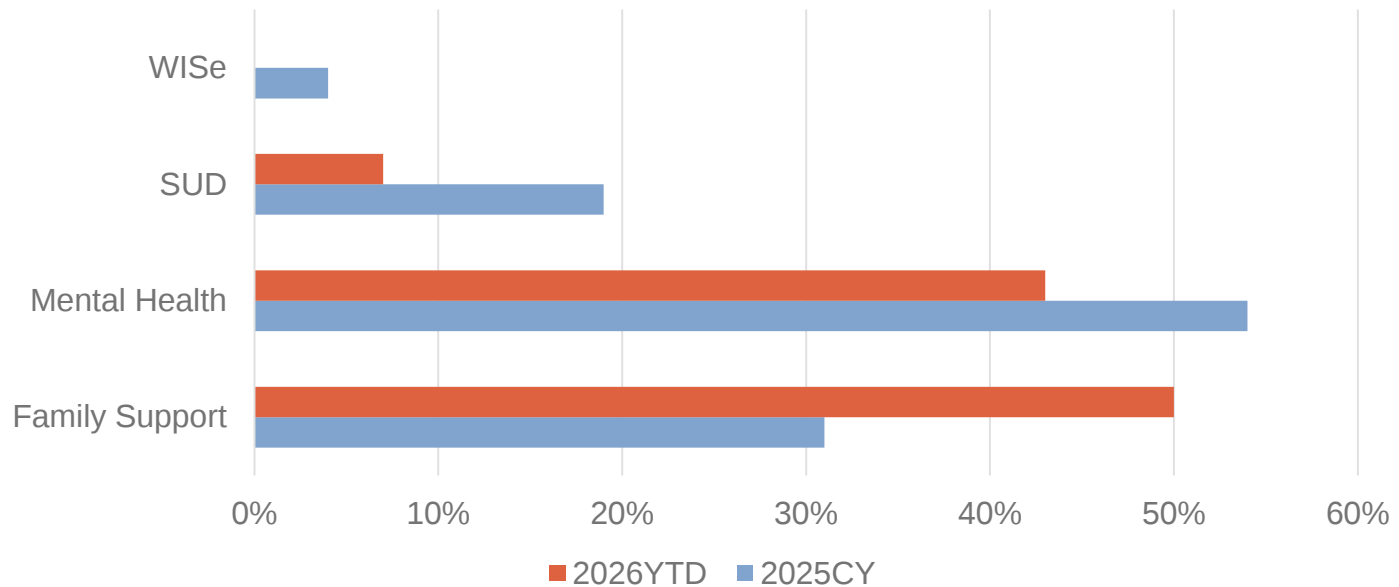

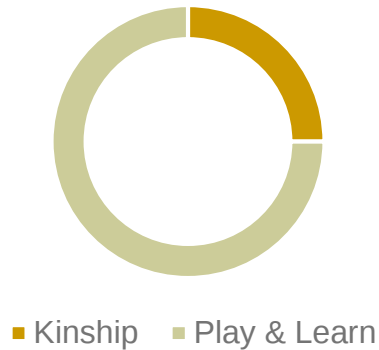


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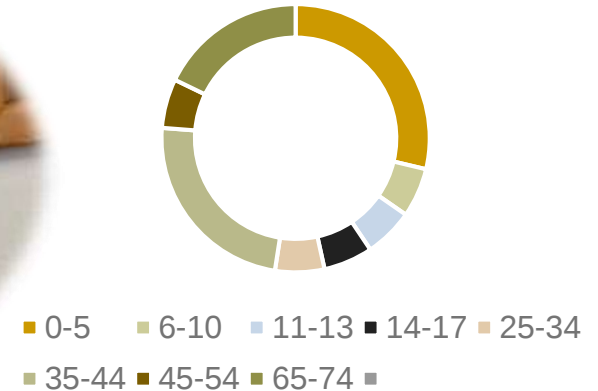
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Family Support CY 2025

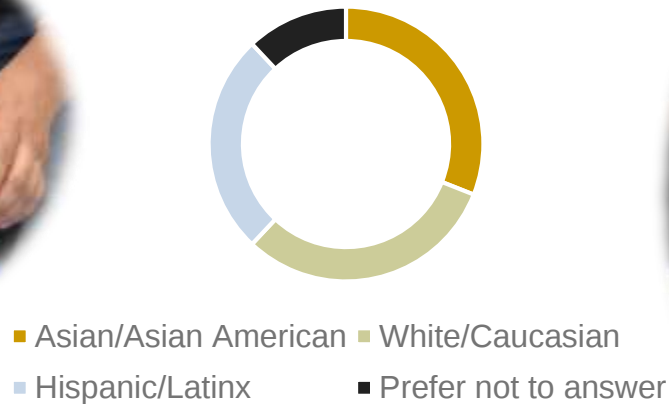
Program Participation

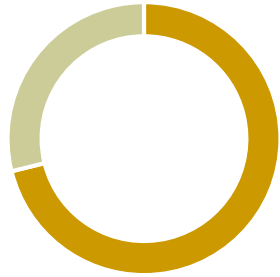


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Mental Health CY 2025

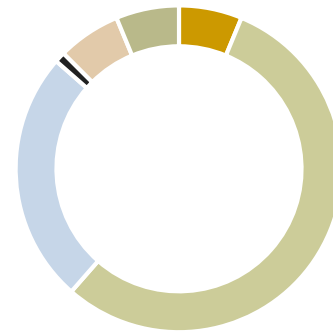

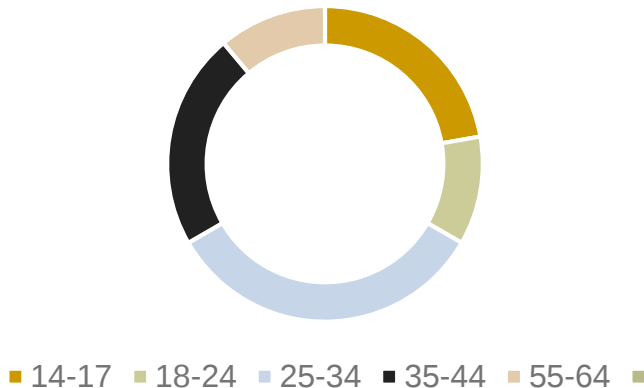
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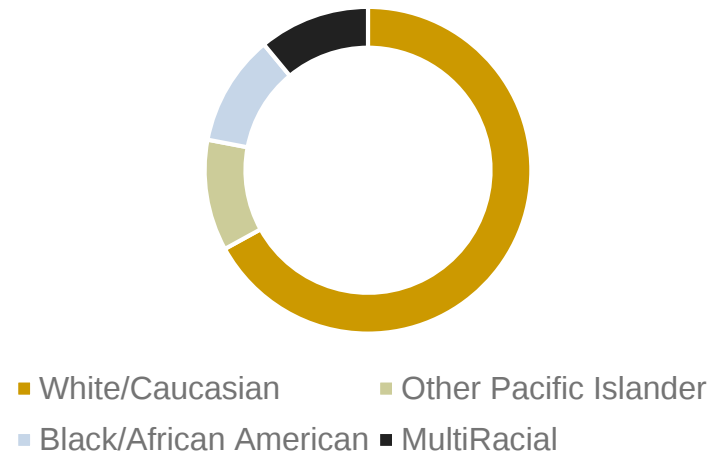
Substance Use Disorder Services

- Court ordered and voluntary assessment & outpatient treatment
- Harm Reduction Supplies (i.e. wound care kits, Narcan etc.)
- Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug parent/youth education

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WISe (Wraparound Intensive Services)

- High intensity interventions through a wraparound model
 - Youth under 21 who are involved in two or more systems.
- Team includes Care Coordinator, Mental Health Therapist for the youth, Parent Partner for the caregiver.
- Care Coordinator brings providers supporting the youth together to set goals and align on strategies of support.
- Trends: (2 youth in 2025 ages 6 and 12)
 - Youth who exhibit destructive behaviors
 - Youth born drug affected
 - Youth who have experienced significant trauma and adverse experiences
 - Neurodivergent youth with social challenges
 - Youth involved in juvenile justice system
 - Families involved in child welfare system
 - Youth in kinship care due to loss of biological parent



Outcomes*

- Prevention through increased parent/caregiver knowledge about early childhood development, strengthen the parent/child bond, and their social connections in the community
 - 100% improved their parent/child relationship
 - 86% increased understanding of their child's non-verbal cues
 - 79% increased feeling supported in their role as a parent in the community.
- Reduction in mental health symptoms and their impact
 - 87.3% of clients improved mental stability and functioning
 - 88.2% made progress toward their treatment goals
 - 83.5% reduced symptomatic episodes
- Decrease or abstaining from substance use
 - 77.5% decreased or abstained from their alcohol or other drug use
 - 79.8% made progress on issues impacted by their substance use
