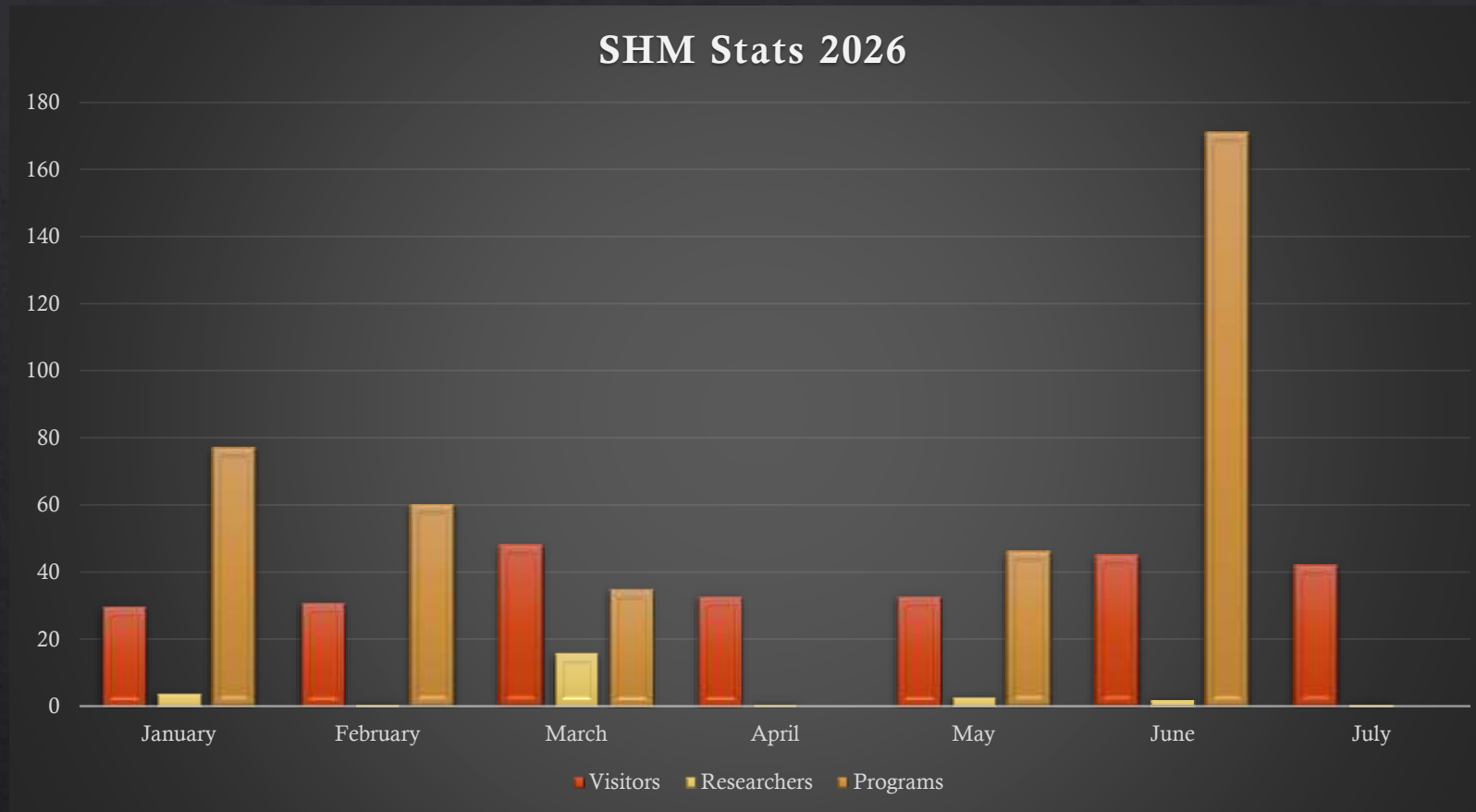

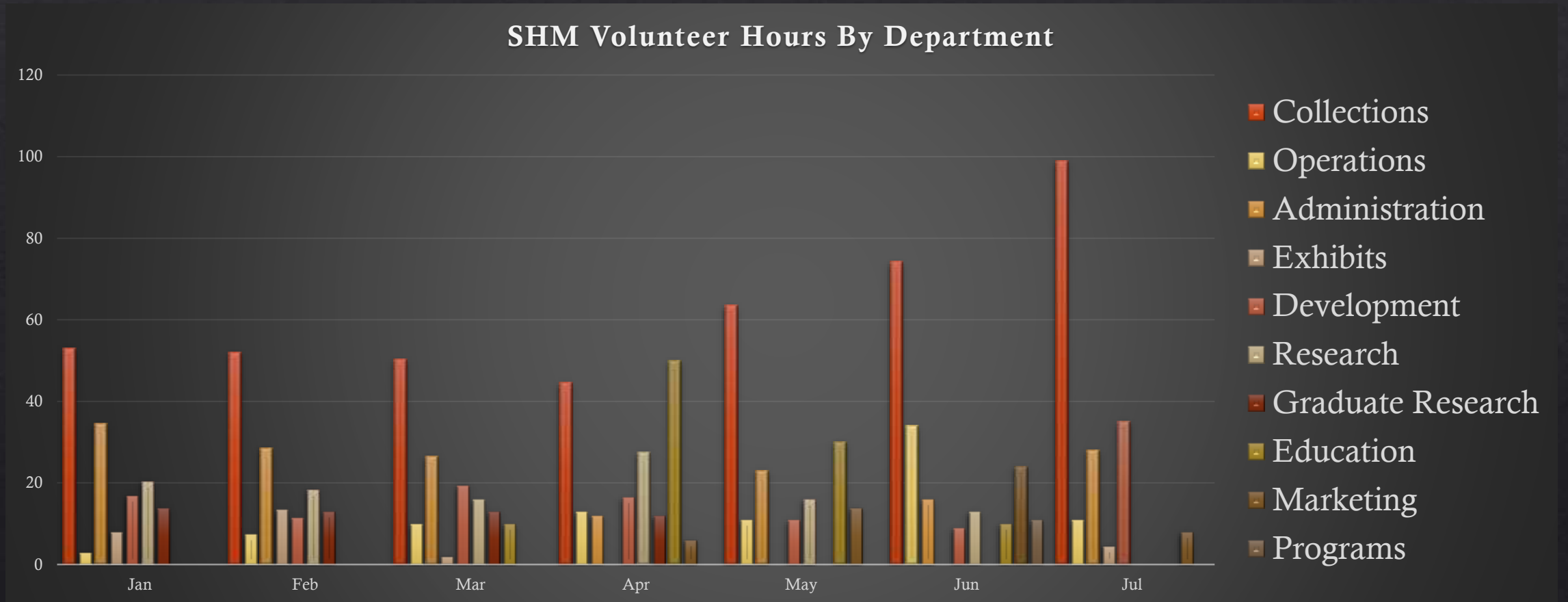

Visitor Statistics for January - July 2026



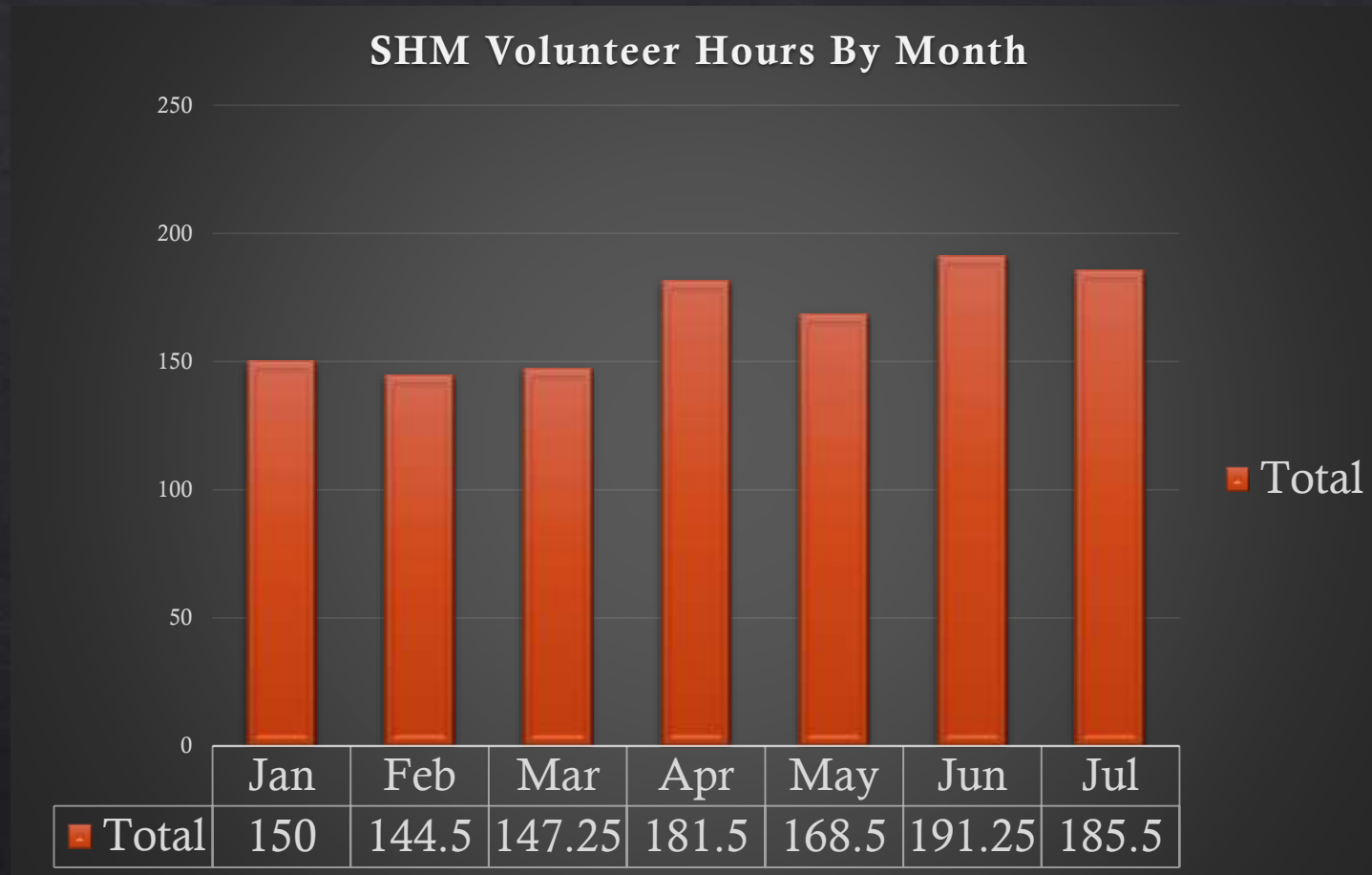
