Riddle led the Pledge of Allegiance. 29 30 **ADOPTION OF AGENDA** 31 32 Cmbr. Riddle proposed amendments to the agenda: 1) move consideration of Resolution 23-33 1931/Authorizing the Mayor to Sign an Amendment to a Professional Services Agreement with 34 DCG-Watershed for Additional Assistance with the Lakefront Improvements, Design, 35 Engineering, Environmental Review, and Permitting Project to follow Citizen Comments; and 2) 36 pull Resolution 23-1929/Adopting the Revised 2023-2024 State Legislative Agenda from the 37 Consent Agenda for discussion. 38 39 Cmbr. Goldman noted a motion is not needed for a councilmember to pull an item from the 40 Consent Agenda. 41 42 <u>Cmbr. Riddle moved</u> to approve the agenda with an amendment to move consideration 43 of Resolution 23-1931 to follow Citizen Comments. Cmbr. Furutani seconded. Following 44 discussion, the motion to approve the agenda as amended carried unanimously.

5	Cmbr. Furutani moved to suspend the three-touch rule for Ordinance 23-1282.
6 7	Cmbr. Goldman seconded. The motion to suspend the three-touch rule carried

9 10	Cmbr. Goldman moved to approve as presented Ordinance 23-1282/Creating Chapter
11	18.74 of the Lake Forest Park Municipal Code – Sale, Disposition or Lease of Surplus Real
12	Property for Affordable Housing. Deputy Mayor French seconded. The motion to
13	approve Ordinance 23-1282 as presented carried unanimously.

15	ORDINANCE 23-1283/Amending Section 10.06.010 of the Lake Forest Park Municipal Code
16	Regarding Authorization for Traffic Safety Cameras in School Walk Areas, Public Park Speed
17	Zones, and Zones Subject to Specific Penalties for Racing and Race Attendance

19	Deputy Mayor French presented the item, followed by Council discussion.
20	
21	Deputy Mayor French moved to approve Ordinance 23-1283/Amending Section
22	10.06.101 of the Lake Forest Park Municipal Code Regarding Authorization for Traffic
23	Safety Cameras in School Walk Areas, Public Park Speed Zones, and Zones Subject to
24	Specific Penalties for Racing and Race Attendance, with an amendment to Section B
25	"an analysis of the locations where automatic traffic safety cameras are proposed
26	must be presented to the City Council for approval." Cmbr. Riddle seconded. The
27	motion to approve Ordinance 23-1282 as amended carried unanimously.

29	Resolution 23-1929/Adopting the Revised 2023-2024 State Legislative Agenda
30	
31	Cmbr. Riddle noted her concern that a \$1.5 million funding gap is not sufficient. Discussion
32	followed and there was consensus of the Council to increase the amount to \$2 million.
33	
34	Cmbr. Riddle moved to approve Resolution 23-1929/Adopting the Revised 2023-2024
35	State Legislative Agenda with an amendment to Exhibit A, as follows: "The design is
36	nearing completion and there is a funding gap of \$1.5M \$2.0M for construction." Cmbr.
37	Furutani seconded. The motion to approve Resolution 23-1929 as amended carried
38	unanimously.
