15	<u>Cmbr. Riddle moved</u> to waive the three-touch rule for Resolution 24-1952/Approving	
16	Race Zone Traffic Safety Cameras pursuant to Lake Forest Park Municipal Code	
17	10.06.010. <u>Deputy Mayor Bodi seconded. The motion to waive the three-touch rule</u>	
18	carried unanimously.

21	<u>Deputy Mayor Bodi moved</u> to approve as presented Resolution 24-1952/Approving	
22	Race Zone Traffic Safety Cameras pursuant to Lake Forest Park Municipal Code	
23	10.06.010. <u>Cmbr. Furutani seconded.</u>

25	Cmbr. Riddle asked the Council if they would like to make an amendment to the resolution to	
26	address the time the school safety cameras will be operating. The times listed in the resolution	
27	are not accurate to the correct times when the school is in session and suggested that it should	
28	be listed as arrival and dismissal times.

30	Mayor French recessed the meeting at 7:25 p.m. so the administration could correct the	
31	resolution. The meeting resumed at 7:35 p.m.

33	Mayor French read the corrected resolution. In the third whereas clause, the changes show that	
34	the school safety camera will operate when children are present or when the flashers are	
35	active.

37	Cult Biddle and address of the production of the Control of the Co	
38	<u>Cmbr. Riddle moved</u> to approve as presented Resolution 24-1952/Approving Race Zone	
39	Traffic Safety Cameras pursuant to Lake Forest Park Municipal Code 10.06.010 as	
40	amended. Cmbr. Furutani seconded. The motion to adopt Resolution 24-1952 carried	
41	<u>unanimously.</u>
